Having considered the submissions put forward by the Applicant the sub-committee accepted the request for an adjournment on the grounds that it was just and equitable to do so to allow time for the applicant to carry out the necessary remedial works in respect of sound insulation as a result of a letter submitted by the Councils Environmental Health Department on 31 January, for the applicant to trial a new dispersal policy for customers leaving the premises and to confirm what legal documentation is in place with regard to the applicants use of the nearby Wickes car park. It was noted that the application would be heard in between six to eight weeks time which was considered a reasonable period of time to monitor the changes made in respect of the operation of the premises.</p>
