| <b>A2</b>      | Application by the Railway Terraces Residents' Community Association and North West Two Residents' Association to review the premises licence for 'The Heritage Inn' (301 Cricklewood Broadway, London, NW2 6PG) pursuant to the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 | <p>Having considered the application by the Railway Residents' Community Association and North West Two Residents' Association to review the premises licence for 'The Heritage Inn' (301 Cricklewood Broadway, London, NW2 6PG) ("the premises") pursuant to the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 the Sub-Committee resolved that the <b>premises licence continue in force without any changes to the licence but the licensee be issued with a warning.</b></p> <p>The Alcohol and Entertainment Licensing Sub-Committee (B) acknowledged having regard to the oral and written evidence that there had been public nuisance related incidents in the vicinity of the premises, however, as mentioned by residents, the licensee had taken a proactive role in attempting to address noise issues within the premises. The licensee is now required to take a proactive role by taking the necessary steps to address noise and public nuisance matters upon customers leaving his premises and that this will be monitored by the relevant authorities. It is also noted that the police and other responsible authorities had not given prior warning to the licence premises holder on the grounds of public nuisance or any other breach of the licensing objectives and in accordance with government guidance the Licensing Sub-Committee exercised discretion during the decision making process to issue a formal warning.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee added an informative that the licensee continue to liaise with the licensing authority and residents' associations to promote the workings of his Dispersal Policy and that there be a noticeable improvement with regard to this within a three month period.</p> |
