All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The machine area will also be covered by CCTV. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. 2.
