I and fellow retailers/grocery shop owners would like to make an objection to the application for a Liquor Licence made on behalf of Bucharest [Good people food Ltd] by Mr Leonard Ovidtu Kepent

The reason for the objection are as follows:

There are numerous Off Licences trading in the surrounding vicinity and Tesco being one of them down the road. This would cause great difficulty and hardship to our business which also sells liquor. This is going to cause a lot of economic hardship to the already beleaguered local businesses. The last thing we need now is another Off Licence opening up next door to my shop. Furthermore we have been told by the local Police to shut my shop and shops around Wembley stadium, not to sell Liquor at certain times on match days, as this may cause social and unruly behaviour among fans. With this in mind, it would not be prudent to issue another Liquor Licence.

I hope the Council would be mindful of the above objections before making a decision on the above matter. Thank you.

Dear Lo and Dennis,

I'm writhing to you regarding the objections received from "local residents".

They are without any doubt my neighbors, one of them have an off license near my shop and some residential properties on Mostyn Ave. He is very afraid of competition although i will sell 99% Romanian Wines and Beer (no strong alcohol or English wines that you find in any off licence) because most of my customers are Romanians. Besides the fact that they didn't wright their names clear on the paper and they didn't provide any contact information i cannot discuss forward with them because i don't have any proof that they wrote.

I find their objection very selfish and is not right to decline a licence for a shop just because the neighbor wants to have monopole.

I have another shop in Lambeth and there i applied for a licence few months ago and i had as well 3 objections from my "friendly" neighbors with the same reasons. The officer classified these objections as unfounded because is my right to sell alcohol as long as i take every measure to fulfill all the four licensing objectives.

I just spent a lot of money to install cctv , shutters etc and it will be very hard for my company to cover this costs from profits.

Like i said, my customers are asking for Romanian beers and wines which you cannot find in my neighbor's shops and i keep telling them that i'm waiting for the licence . They are expecting to have these products in December because of the Christmas and other Romanian holidays.

From my experience with the other shop i can tell that the number of customers raised once i brought alcohol , customers who also will buy food from my shop. Now with this shop in Wembley i hardly try to keep my customers not going to other Romanian food and wine stores just because they have alcohol.

It will be very hard for me as well to keep up with my full business rates if i will start loosing clients, so please take into consideration all these matters and let me know what is to be done.

Now i will wright to met. police , letting them know that i have done all the works they required and as soon as i will have an answer from them i will let you know.

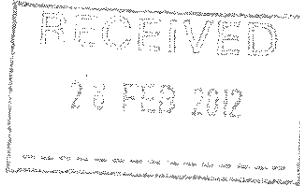

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence under section 34 of the Act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

Police require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

Closed circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations on the premises and in accordance with advice from the Police.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item.

Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) if required should be similarly displayed.

This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

Major event days at Wembley

This must be an important inclusion in any operating schedule for a premise in Brent.

High Strength alcoholic drinks

Street drinkers and drunkenness is a major cause for concern in Brent. It is proven that high strength but cheap lagers, beers and cider contribute to the problem. If the premise does not stock these cheap high strength drinks (above 5.5% ABV) then the problem will be lessened or displaced. All Off Licenses in the area will be required to stop stocking these High strength drinks as they vary or come to review.

Security Measures

The following measures are proven to improve the security of your shop premises.

The floor area in front of the counter must be kept clear of any objects that could be used as a step to attack staff. Behind the counter the floor area should be

raised 15 centimetres.

The premises must be protected by a monitored Intruder Alarm system including a panic button immediately accessible near the till.

The till/s should be secured from being lifted or moved. There shall be a door where access to the till area begins.

The window of the premises shall be kept clear of signage and advertising.

Spirits, Champagne and other similar valued goods should be displayed behind the counter. All alcohol within the shop should be displayed within the direct sight of the till operator and not obscured by other shelving etc.

Clear visible access in to the premises from the street

A clear visible and unobstructed internal view of the premises will be afforded at all times. This will discourage individuals using the premises for criminal activity.

The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below:

CCTV

- 7 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised council officers if requested.
- 8 A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance.

Proof of Age

- 19 A refusal book shall be kept and maintained including: the date time and name of member of staff making the refusal.

General

- 26 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked.
- 28 The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.
- 34 A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
- 35 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 36 A suitable intruder alarm complete with panic button shall be fitted and

Part O of the application states seasonal variation for the summer months but does not explain what or to what time?

It has also been noted that this premise has had parties previous to being licensed and since it was licensed only a few months ago that the premises

has had a number of TENS for parties. I assume that this application is to continue such activity without the need for a TEN. As such this premises turns from a café into a night club. What I witnessed at the most recent TEN on Sat 24th March was that the premises went on past the 1am notice. People were coming outside to smoke and drinking outside the premises, the door was left open and music was loud. Such activity will lead to resident complaints. The applicant needs to address these points more clearly in the operating schedule as to how exactly they will promote the licensing objectives. At this moment in time with the information supplied I believe that the licensing objectives would be undermined. I would invite the applicant to speak with me regarding my concerns.

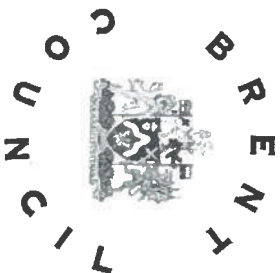

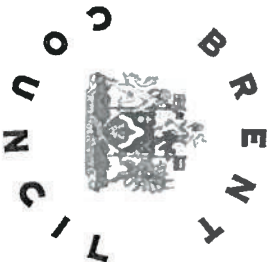

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application is to extend the hours for the sale of alcohol to 3am every day. The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

This location suffers from alcohol related crime and disorder, the majority of this is from local youths. The problem has been addressed by the local Safer Neighbourhood Team, but is still an ongoing issue in the area.

A lot of the disorder is late night from 11pm to 4am and has included serious assaults. Some of these have happened in licensed premises for off sales. In most of these incidents alcohol is a factor for either the victims or suspects involved. This is not the time or place to extend the sale of alcohol for local businesses.

There is little in the operating schedule to address this issue other than what they are required to do by law.

This premises has been observed to be trading alcohol outside of its licensed hours in the recent past.

Finally police have yet to receive a copy of the application having only been notified by the council of this variation!

The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below:

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised officers from responsible authorities if requested.

A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked.

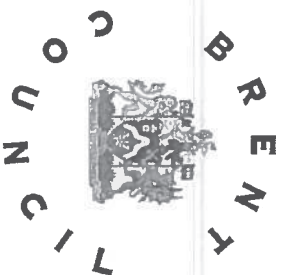

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make **representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Crime and Disorder Licensing Objective for the reasons indicated below.

Officer: Nick Mortimer, Licensing Officer

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a ‘Responsible Authority’ under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence to specify an individual as designated premises supervisor under section 37 of the Act.

Police are formally objecting to the variation.

The Police objections are concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder.

(1) The proposed DPS Ms Hermien Van Boekel has been the Manager at the premises since it’s opening in 2011 and she has had responsibility for the premises throughout that time. In April 2012 there were two incidents(CAD1025 of 13/4/12 and CRIS 1911088/12 on 27/4/12) resulting in Brent Police Licensing visiting the premises on 2nd May 2012 where it was discovered that the existing DPS Mr J Viridi had not been to the premise at all this year and wished to come off the licence, he is the freeholder of the property. As a result of this Ms Van Boekel was told that she could no longer sell alcohol until a new DPS was in place, the following day this application was submitted to Police. Police now have an extra matter CRIS 1912630

of 14/5/12 where the proposed DPS is the suspect for an assault where it is alleged Ms Van Boekel assaulted a resident whilst working as the Manager in the hotel.

It is my belief that the above information displays her lack of supervision which is undermining the Licensing Objectives. In addition the officer in the case for the matter on 27/4/12 PC Kevin Tebb contacted the licensing office to complain about Ms Van Boekel and that in his opinion she was drunk and obstructive whilst they were attempting to carry out investigation at the hotel in the early hours of the morning. In the other incident on 13/4/12 PC Gary Norton was called to the hotel during the early hours of the morning and subsequently stated there were non residents still drinking in the bar and no SIA registered security officers present, both these are a breach of the premises licence authorisation.

Further I reserve the right to bring further evidence to the hearing should any arise between now and then.

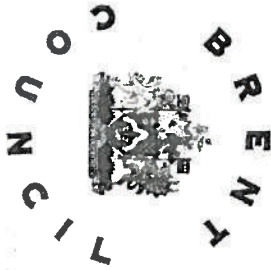

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

Police require the following points should be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence.

Excessive opening hours.

Police regard the application for opening hours to 0400hrs daily to be excessive. This venue is in close proximity to a large estate that has gang related troubles and tension. Premises open until 0400hrs have the potential to attract such people as a meeting place, as one of the only places open to the public at that time of morning. The application indicates the additional steps that the applicant would take to promote the licensing objectives is to have the entrance door manned. There are additional costs in employing a Security Industry Registered door supervisor. Police recommend in an area like this to finish providing late night refreshment and close to the public at 0130 hours daily.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

Closed circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations on the premises and in accordance with advice from the Police.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item.

This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

Security Measures

The following measures are proven to improve the security of your shop premises.

The floor area in front of the counter must be kept clear of any objects that could be used as a step to attack staff. Behind the counter the floor area should be raised 15 centimetres.

The premises must be protected by a monitored Intruder Alarm system including a panic button immediately accessible near the till.

The till/s should be secured from being lifted or moved.
The window of the premises shall be kept clear of signage and advertising.

Clear visible access in to the premises from the street

A clear visible and unobstructed internal view of the premises will be afforded at all times. This will discourage individuals using the premises for criminal activity.

The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below:

. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.

A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.

A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.

A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

A suitable intruder alarm complete with panic button shall be fitted and maintained.

All deliveries shall take place during the normal working day (i.e. 09:00 to 18:00 daily).

The licensee shall ensure all public areas within (5) metres of the premises are cleared of litter arising from the premises daily.

Notices requesting customers to leave quietly shall be displayed at each exit.

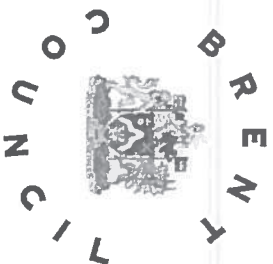

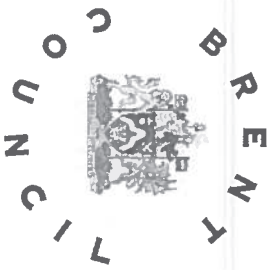

Police are formally objecting to the variation.

The Police objections are concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder.

1) The proposed DPS Mr Richard Hunt is currently the DPS at the Wembley Tavern in Wembley Park Drive.

The Wembley Tavern and the Blackbird Inn have both had issues recently which almost reached the point of review proceedings and indicate that both premises need close supervision.

Although it is not known if Mr Hunt is suitable for either premises it is clear that he cannot give the required supervision to both venues. I have informed him of this fact and he tells me that he will only be the DPS for a two week period at the Blackbird Inn. It is unlikely that a hearing will be arranged before he leaves the premises but it is my considered opinion that the designee Mr Hunt as the premises supervisor

at this time would undermine the crime prevention objective. I reserve the right to bring further evidence to the hearing should any arise between now and then.
