

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence under section 34 of the Act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

# Police require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence.

### **Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)**

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

Closed circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations on the premises and in accordance with advice from the Police.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

### **Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises**

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone <u>outside</u> the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item.

Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) if required should be similarly displayed.

This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

This must be an important inclusion in any operating schedule for a premise in Brent.

### High Strength alcoholic drinks

Street drinkers and drunkenness is a major cause for concern in Brent. It is proven that high strength but cheap lagers, beers and cider contribute to the problem. If the premise does not stock these cheap high strength drinks (above 5.5% ABV) then the problem will be lessened or displaced. All Off Licenses in the area will be required to stop stocking these High strength drinks as they vary or come to review.

### Security Measures

The following measures are proven to improve the security of your shop premises.

The floor area in front of the counter must be kept clear of any objects that could be used as a step to attack staff. Behind the counter the floor area should be

raised 15 centimetres.

The premises must be protected by a monitored Intruder Alarm system including a panic button immediately accessible near the till.

The till/s should be secured from being lifted or moved. There shall be a door where access to the till area begins.

The window of the premises shall be kept clear of signage and advertising.

Spirits, Champagne and other similar valued goods should be displayed behind the counter. All alcohol within the shop should be displayed within the direct sight of the till operator and not obscured by other shelving etc.

### Clear visible access in to the premises from the street

A clear visible and unobstructed internal view of the premises will be afforded at all times. This will discourage individuals using the premises for criminal activity.

### The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below: CCTV

- 7 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised council officers if requested.
- 8 A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance.

### General

- 26 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked.

Re Gosschalks Letter 5.12.2013 – William Hill 141-143 Kilburn High Road.

Gazmend has asked me to give you his response to some of the statements in this letter.

Gazmend Turjak is completely shocked by the contents of this letter and he feels that his honest attempts to engage with William Hill to solve the ASB problem on Kilburn High Road/Glengall Road have been twisted to make it appear that he is potentially willing to withdraw his request for a Review of William Hills' licence and potentially support any application they make for a new one. This is not the case.

He feels that this letter is completely misleading and misrepresents his views and the whole community around the area affected by the premises in question. Gosschalks, as well as patronising all concerned, also make some wildly inaccurate assumptions.

So just to be clear:

1 Gazmend Turjak has no intention of withdrawing his request for a Review of William Hill's current licence at 141-143 Kilburn High Road and, has every intention of objecting to a new licence if one is requested. Gosschalk's clumsy approach to this whole situation has pretty much guaranteed this.

2 Residents Associations – BEST and BRAT are the residents association in the area and, they have no intention of withdrawing their support for a Review of William Hill's licence (BEST supported Gazmends' original application for a Review of the licence) and would be amazed if they didn't object to a new licence – especially when they hear that Gosschalks think that they may be supportive of William Hill!

I've copied Josie Warshaw (BEST) and Paul Schulte (BRAT) in on this email but I think Josie has already told you what her view and that of the BEST/BRAT residents are directly. By the way Josie and Paul aren't aware of any meetings that their residents associations have had with representatives of William Hill.

### **3 SNTMeetings**

Gosschalks also mention the SNT meetings – Gazmend took part in these meetings because he wanted to be reasonable and do whatever he could to resolve the situation – now it seems that his attendance at the meetings has been misrepresented as support for William Hill. Gazmend attended the meetings in good faith and has engaged with representatives of William Hill and other parties to try and do something about the ASB problem which has blighted Glengall Road for years.

I don't think that he would have done so if he had realised that they were going to be interpreted by Gosschalks as a "window dressing" exercise for William Hill and their attempts to prevent a Review of their licence. I've copied in Barry Creasy, who does an exemplary job in chairing the SNT groups, as he may have some views about this.

4 William Hill have made some changes but it is still the view of Gazmend and the local residents that many of the original grounds for requesting a Review of the licence remain.

Again, Gazmend would appreciate it if you could you get back to us with the some dates for a hearing. – The best thing is that this issue should be resolved by the relevant Authorities, who are supposed to take into account the views of local businesses and residents and interested parties and not be swayed by spin from William Hill's solicitors.

We've been asking for this for more than a year now!

Can you please forward this email to the relevant people in your department.
