1. Application

The application is for the expedited review of a premises licence held by Tubby Limited, 305 Willesden High Road, London NW10 2JT. The premises are known as Bar No. 8, 305 Willesden High Road, London NW10 2JT

2. Grounds for Review

The grounds for review are serious crime and serious disorder.

3. Relevant Representations

Representation has been received from Sam Lewis-Evans of the Metropolitan Police.

4. Background

These premises are currently licensed for the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment from 0700-0300 on Monday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and 0700-0200 on Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday

The Designated Premises Supervisor is Benjamin Rupert Lai

In November 2005, the licensing authority issued the licence.

Members should note that only police officers can apply for an expedited review and only where they consider the premises are associated with serious crime, serious disorder or both.

The expedited review may only be used where alcohol is sold or served.

When hearing an expedited review the Committee may take interim steps pending a full review of the licence which must take place within 28 days. The steps a Committee may take are:

- To modify, remove or add conditions
- To exclude the sale of alcohol or other licensable activity
- Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor
- Suspend the licence.

I am a Superintendent¹ in the Metropolitan Police Service.

I am giving this certificate because I am on the opinion that other procedures under the Licensing Act are inappropriate in this case because²:

The premises was the venue of a serious assault where one customer was glassed in the face by another customer on 31/7/14, this is the second serious glassing incident within 12 months.

Other procedures have been considered but do not address the long term issue. A standard review could take months to reach a conclusion especially if taken to apppeal and the evidence

The expedited process is necessary to apply with immediate effect a condition to the premises licence of:

Only plastics and/or polycarbonates to be used for the consumption of alcohol, in addition no glassware is to be handed over the bar, all bottled drinks are to be decanted.

This is deemed an appropriate and proportionate measure in view of the above evidence and to reduce any further threat to public safety and prevent further crime and disorder.

No 8 Bar Crimes August 2013 to August 2014

CRIS: 1918126/13 Victim was hit in the face with glass causing swelling and cut to face requiring hospital treatment 08/08/2013 0115 Assault by one customer on another whilst discussing who had the best life -8/8/13

1918297/13 By suspect punching the victim in the face after victim asked suspect's girlfriend for a lighter 10/08/2013 0310 VIW 1 is currently a guest at the No 8 hotel in Willesden. At about 0310 hours he went outside in order to smoke a cigarette. He was outside the hostel at the junction with Churchmead Road. He did not have a light on him so asked a passing female for a light. She was with Susp 1, who immediately punched him in the nose. The suspect and the female then walked of and got on a bus, towards Kilburn. VIW 1 said he had not seen the suspect before the incident - 12/8/13

1918539/14 VIW1 and 2 were in the bar drinking when approached by the SUSP who smashed a glass in VIW1 face and punched VIW2 a number of times. 31/07/2014 1840

As police were trying to deal with Suspect, ****** came around the corner. He was bleeding profusely from his head. He stated that Suspect had picked up a glass and smashed it in his face. Police attended No 8 bar where the incident happened and located ******** who had been punched in the face a number of times by Suspect, causing swelling to his left cheek and chin. ********, an independant witness in the bar, stated that he saw Suspect smash a glass in ******** face and punch ******** between 5-10 times in the face. ***** stated that once he left no 8 bar, Suspect tried to follow him and attack him again but he managed to get away from it. After SUSP had been arrested he said "ITS A BIT OF A PERSONAL BETWEEN THOSE TWO GEEZERS, I SORTED IT OUT TONIGHT" - 1/8/14

Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

- (a) No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when no designated premises supervisor has been specified in the licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his or her licence has been suspended.
- (b) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

All persons present on the premises who are required to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Admission of children must be restricted according to film classification.

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

- 1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition.
- 2. All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
- 3. The total number of people permitted on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 290.
- 4. The licensee shall make available to customers all toilets shown on the plans accompanying this licence.
- 5. No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 01:00 hours.
- 6. No children shall be permitted on the premises after 21:00 hours
- 7. Noise levels of music shall be arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- 8. Notices requesting customers to leave quietly shall be displayed at each exit.


- 9. Announcements shall be made at the end of each performance asking customers to leave quietly.
- 10. Performers shall be instructed to create minimum nuisance when entering or leaving the building.
- 11. All doors exiting on to Churchmead Road shall be closed at 21:30 hours and all customers are to leave via the High Road except in an emergency.
- 12. The licensee shall ensure that musicians load/unload their equipment at the beginning of Churchmead Road and then enter/leave the premises via the High Road entrance/exit.
- 13. The management shall provide local residents with a direct telephone number of the premises.
- 14. There shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors on Sunday to Thursday and 3 Friday and Saturday, 2 shall be to control entrance to the premises and 1 to control order within the premises.
- 15. The licensee or his/her deputy shall be a member of, and actively participate in the local pubwatch scheme.
- 16. Photographic proof of age shall be required from anyone who arrears to be below the age of 18.

Annexe 3 - Conditions Attached After a Hearing by the Licensing Authority

- 1. The applicant shall adhere to a maximum capacity limit for the premises of 290 persons and that the applicant shall make available to customers all toilets shown in the plans submitted with the application, at all times when the premises are open to the public.
- 2. Children under 16 years of age shall not be permitted on the premises at all after 21:00 (i.e. regardless of whether they are accompanied by an adult) on any day that the premises are open to the public.
- 3. The applicant shall not allow customers to enter or re-enter the premises after 01:00 on any day when the premises are open to the public.

Notes for guidance

- 1. A certificate of the kind mentioned in the form must accompany the application in order for it to be valid under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003. The certificate must explicitly state the senior officer's opinion that the premises in question are associated with serious crime, serious disorder or both.
 Serious crime is defined by reference to section 81 of the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000. In summary, it means:
 - conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences for which a person who has attained the age of
 eighteen and has no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for
 a term of three years or more; or
 - conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences and involves the use of violence, results in substantial
 financial gain or is conduct by a large number of persons in pursuit of a common purpose.
 Serious disorder is not defined in legislation, and so bears its ordinary English meaning.
- 2. Briefly describe the circumstances giving rise to the opinion that the above premises are associated with serious crime, serious disorder, or both.
