Within an eight month period from 31st January to 14th September 2014 this venue has come to Police notice for four separate incidents, three of them involving serious violence. On each occasion there have been breaches of licensing legislation or the operation of the premises has not been such to be promoting the licensing objectives. See page 5.

The Designated premises supervisor Mr Niral Thakkar, has received warning letters from Brent Police Licensing officers and received advice in person either at the venue or by his attendance at Brent Civic Centre, after each incident on how to improve and strengthen his role and responsibilities.

To assist Mr Thakkar control the venue more successfully, Police consider some of the conditions of the current premises licence need to be re-worded appropriately to support current legislation and best practice. In addition the plans of the premises submitted with the conversion application in 2005, do not reflect the current layout of the premises. I am fully aware that a side door has been constructed in recent months and that licensable activity takes place in the external rear area, however this is not on the plans.

Police request the following conditions to be removed from the premises licence

- 1. The premises shall only be open to members and their guests when licensable activities are taking place. This venue is not a members club and is open to the public.
- 2. The licensee or his/her deputy shall be a member of, and actively participate in the local pubwatch scheme. *Membership of such a scheme is voluntary and can not be enforced*.
- 3. All staff shall be trained in respect of relevant licensing law, the implementation of licence conditions, health and safety, first aid, alcohol, and drug awareness and conflict management. This is part of the licence holders operating schedule and not required as a condition.
- 9. Promotions that promote irresponsible drinking shall not be permitted.

This is now covered by a mandatory condition.

10. Known troublemakers shall be barred from the premises.

This would be best practice and not enforceable.

- 12. The Portman Group proof of age scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted. Due to the easy accessibility of such cards on the internet, this is better managed with an age verification scheme.
- 16. The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

A more specific condition is required.

19. A free supply of drinking water shall be made available to customers.

This is now covered by a mandatory condition.

20. Public transport information including night time travel options shall be made available. This is too detailed, and there is a bus stop directly outside the font door of the venue

Police require the following conditions to be added to the premises licence

Door supervisors shall wear clothing that can be clearly and easily identified on CCTV.

A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.

A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance and exit of the premises.

A "Challenge 21" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

A refusal book detailing date and time of the refused sale and the name of the person refusing the sale shall be kept and maintained and made available for inspection.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 2330 hours.


Regular documented staff training on licensing legislation and operating procedures to be given. This training shall be signed and dated and a copy of these training records available for inspection by Police and local authority enforcement officers.

On major event days at Wembley Stadium the following shall apply:

- Customers shall not be allowed to congregate outside the premises.
- No drinks shall be served in glass containers.
- The DPS or deputy shall work in partnership with the Police and if necessary comply with any direction given by a senior Police Officer on duty at the event.
- Supply of alcohol shall cease one hour prior to the designated kick off time.
- Supply of alcohol shall not resume until 15 minutes after the actual kick off time.

This list is not exhaustive and relies upon up to date plans of the premise.

Police feel that these are wholly reasonable, proportionate and appropriate measure to be put in place to promote the licensing objectives. Police reserve the right to give evidence on any further incidents which may take place at, or in the vicinity of the premises, between the service of this application and the hearing and/or during the time allowed for any appeal proceedings.

Cris 1922063/14

On Friday 12th September 2014 at 2315hours. The DPS and his wife were not working. The premises had been left under the control of a member of a female member of bar staff named Rochelle (she is not a personal licence holder). However the bar takings were to be removed that night by a friend named David, he was also in possession of the keys for the premises and would be locking up the bar. There were no door supervisors working at the premises because it was closing to the public before midnight. David was involved in an incident on the street outside the bar whilst out purchasing limes for drinks, from a nearby shop. Outside the doorway of the venue and in sight and sound of other customers smoking, David viciously head butted another male causing him to loose a tooth. This incident was captured on CCTV. This incident has required substantial Police and NHS resources. This violent behaviour by an employee or representative of the venue does not promote the licensing objectives.


On Sunday 15th June 2014 at 0010hrs PC Nicola McDonald visited the venue. The bar was open to the public and supplying alcohol. The DPS, Mr Thakkar was present. The venue was showing world cup football games. There were no door supervisors working at the premises. This breaches condition number 4 of the premises licence. This was explained to the DPS, he chose to stop selling alcohol immediately and close the venue as soon as the football game had finished.

Cris 1922133/14

On 31st January 2014 at 2230 hours, a father and son were drinking at the venue when they began to argue and began physically fighting. One of the males punched the other, knocking him unconscious; he fell to the floor causing a broken nose, collapsed lung and head injuries. Both males were very heavily intoxicated and admitted in interview with Police to have consumed approximately 9 pints and several shots of spirits whilst at First Class Sports bar. It is an offence under S141(1)(a) of the licensing act 2003 to knowingly sell or attempt to sell alcohol to a person who is drunk. During the incident there was a child in the venue contrary to Condition 25 of the premises licence. This incident was captured on CCTV. This incident has used considerable NHS and Police resources.

Cris 1922133/14

On Sunday 14th September 2014 at 0230 hours. The DPS was at the premises and only one door supervisor working at this time. Prior to the venue closing at 0230hours there had been two separate groups within the venue that began arguing. The door supervisor had managed to separate the two parties and directed one of them to leave through the rear entrance. Approximately 20 minutes later, when the premises were closing the second group left through the front entrance. As soon at these customers left the bar closed and shutters pulled down. Both parties then began fighting at the bus stop outside the front of the bar. Two females that began the initial altercation within the bar did not enter until one hour before the premises closed to the public. From experience customers arriving at a venue at such a late hour have already consumed alcohol in a previous location; this is something that can be prevented with a no entry / re entry Policy after a reasonable hour.

WARNING LETTER

Reference the assault that occurred on 31/1/13 at 2220

Dear Mr Thakkar

This letter will set out what I believe to be failings in the support and promotion of the Licensing Act 2003.

Having viewed the CCTV of the incident and also seen a transcript of the suspect's interview it is my opinion that both gentlemen were served too much alcohol whilst in the premises and that they were drunk.

This is an offence under S141(1)(a) which states that "knowingly sell or attempt to sell alcohol to a person who is drunk", a conviction for this can lead to a fine.

I appreciate your honesty and partnership approach during my visit to the premises on Monday 3rd February 2014.

In relation to a child being within the premises, although there is no offence as he was under the supervision of an adult I suggest that 'good practice' would dictate that this was too late and he should not have been there.

The Metropolitan Police as a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 reserves the right to initiate a Review of your Premises License and take enforcement action with reference to the commission of offences under the 'Act'

- (ii) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

- (v) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (e) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (f) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (g) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- (h) The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (i) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - beer or cider: half pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- (ii) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Variety Food And Wine is currently authorised to supply alcohol for consumption OFF of the premises. The venue has a converted premises licence from 2005 with traditional 'Off' licence permitted hours and no conditions attached.

The premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor are one and the same; Mr. Sellathurai Prabaharan. He holds the premises licence with Mr. Manickam Rajeetharan, he appears to be a silent business partner, someone I have never met or seen at the premises.

Variety Food & Wine is failing to promote three of the licensing objectives, namely the protection of children from harm, prevention of crime and disorder and public safety.

Police have no faith in the ability of the management to operate the premises responsibly and therefore wish to bring the matter before the sub-committee for consideration. Police are primarily concerned with under age sales, total disregaurd of licensing legislation and sales of prohibited items. Police have witnessed much of this and in addition have received complaints from other authorities.

Police seek the removal of the DPS who struggles to supervise the venue sufficiently. A period of suspension to enable both intensive licensing legislation training of staff and locate a suitable DPS. Police would request conditions be attached to the premises licence inclding those highlighted in the action plan, restrictions on sales of high strength beers, lockable shutters for secure storage of alcohol when the premises are still open to the public outside authorised hours, anti-robbery time delay safe, and a clear and unobstructed view in to the shop.

Police feel that these are wholly reasonable, proportionate and appropriate measure to be put in place to promote the licensing objectives

Under age test purchase operation carried out by Brent Trading Standards Service in the Brent area. Using two children aged 15 and 13. Children asked to buy alcohol from Variety Food Fairs (High Road Food & Wine Variety Food), 261 High Road, London, NW10 2RX. A child aged 15 was able to purchase 4 cans of Strongbow cider contrary to Section 146 Licensing Act 2003.

The seller was Mrs Vimla Bhowdal, she was the sole member of staff and appeared to have minimal licensing knowledge.

At the same time Trading Standards Officers discovered a large amount of hand rolling tobacco and cigarettes with no health warning displayed.

30th November 2013

At 0045hrs PC Nicola McDonald Brent Police Licensing and Esther Chan Brent Licensing Enforcement Officer visited Variety Food & Wine. There was one lone member of staff working. The designated premises supervisor was not present. There was no written authority from the DPS to sell alcohol. There was no CCTV recording, no incident or refusal book. Whilst the Officers were in the shop two separate drunken males entered the shop and purchased cans of beer contrary to Section 141 of The Licensing Act 2003. In addition other males entered the shop asking to buy single cigarettes. Officers discovered open packets of cigarettes benneath the serving counter. See exhibit photos NM/1, NM/2, NM/3 and NM/4 taken by PC McDonald. The premises licence does not authorise sales of alcohol at 0045 hours, these sales were contrary to section 136 Licensing Act 2003

4th December 2013

The DPS Mr Mr. Sellathurai Prabaharan ttended Brent Civic Centre and after a formal discussion with PC McDonald and Ms Chan an Action Plan was produced (see attached)

Actions to be implemented:

- . Ensure that the full license is available within the premises for inspection at all times and a summary displayed at the venue. This is a legal requirement.

All staff will undergo training of Licensing Act 2003 legislation, this will be documented and signed for by the DPS giving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by relevant authorities.

Mr Prabaharan was also reminded selling single cigarettes, selling alcohol to drunks offering counterfeit or non duty paid products is illegal and should not be allowed to happen under any circumstance.

Friday 14th June 2014

Premises visited by Brent Police Licensing Officers at 2345 hours. There was one solitary member of staff Mr Thavanesan Prabakaran, he informed Police he is not a personal licence holder. The premises were still open to the public and alcohol was still being sold contrary to Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, conducting licensable activities without authority. 9See attached Police Statement)

During that visit I identified the following points of the action plan were not being conformed with:

The premise has come to our licensing department's attention before for selling alcohol to minors and selling outside of their licensed hours. Due to these and other incidents the premise was placed on an action plan in December 2013.							
At 2043 I went inside the shop to see if they were still selling alcohol, there were no other customers in the store. The refrigerated cabinet with the alcohol in wasn't covered making it appear to customers that it was still for sale. I selected a can of Heineken lager and took it to the counter. The only member of staff who I now know to be Mr THAVANESAN PRABAKARAN rang it through the till at £1.20, I paid him and left the shop. At no point did Mr. Prabakaran tell me or attempt to tell me that he couldn't serve me the alcohol.							
PC McDonald then went in the shop and advised Mr. Prabakaran about the breaches and advised him to close which he did.

I was on duty with Licensing Police PC Nicola McDonald on Saturday 30 th November 2013 carrying out licensing visits. At approximately 00:45 hours, we visited Variety Food Fair, 261 High Road, Willesden, London, NW10 2RX. On entering the premise, I observed one worker known to be Mr Edward Stani of 309A Chapter Road NW2 5ND, DOB 19/04/66. The licence holder and designated premise supervisor were not present. The premises licence was not displayed. There were no training records nor written authority from the DPS to state that Mr Stani is authorised to sell alcohol. The CCTV was not working. There were no incident records and refusal book on site. During the visit I observed two drunk males entered shop and purchased cans of beer. Three other customers came in asking to buy single cigarettes. I then found an open packet of cigarettes under the serving counter. PC McDonald spoke to a male called Mr Sellathurai Prabaharan, who is one of the licence holders via the telephone. We left the premise and returned to the shop at 0055hrs when Mr Prabaharan had arrived. PC McDonald told Mr Prabaharan he should not be selling alcohol after 2300hrs and explained the contraventions that we had identified. On Wednesday 4th December 2014 at 10:00hrs, Mr Sellathurai Prabaharan attended Brent Civic Centre to have a formal discussion with PC McDonald and myself. It transpired that the second licence holder and DPS Manickam Rajeetharan is no longer involved with the business. Mr Prabaharan was informed to vary DPS and notify the Council of his change of address, which he confirmed is 45 Orchard Grove, Harrow, HA3 9QR (previous address 238 High Road Willesden NW10 2NX). I gave him all the relevant application forms to Transfer the Premise Licence and Vary DPS. PC McDonald discussed concerns with Mr Prabaharan and ran through incident reports over the years, concerning underage sale, single cigerette sales and hi

On 28th August 2013 Trading Standards Officers and child volunteers were conducting a test purchasing exercise and monitoring the sale of age restricted goods to children.

I was accompanied by two Officers from Brent Trading Standards and two school boys one 15 years old and the other 13, to Variety Food Fair, 261 High Road, Willesden, London, NW10 2RX. The time was 14:15PM, the children were instructed to enter the premises and attempt to purchase alcohol. Both children were instructed to tell the truth

and provide their true ages if asked. The younger child's role was to record the attempted test purchase on a covert recording device.

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The 15 year old child came out of Variety Food Fair after successfully purchasing a 4 pack

of Strongbow cider. Next, I entered the premises accompanied by another Trading

Standards Officer, produced our warrant card and explained that a sale of alcohol to

someone under the age of 18 had just taken place. We spoke with the only person in the

shop, standing behind the sales counter. This person is now known to me as Vilma

Dhowtal, a sales assistant who had only been working at the premises for 3 days. Mrs

Dhowtal provided her personal details and claimed she thought the boy was over 18.

At around 14:20PM the business owner, designated premises supervisor and premise

licence holder arrived. This person is now known to me as Sellathurai Prabaharan. I

explained that alcohol had just been supplied by Vimla Dhowtal to someone under the age

of 18 and as such possible offences under Section 146 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003 may

have been committed.

An inspection of under the sales counter, revealed packets of non UK duty paid cigarettes

and hand rolling tobacco, a number of which did not contain UK statutory health warnings.

20 packets of cigarettes and 15 packets of hand rolling tobacco were seized, which did not

comply with the labelling requirements as specified in regulation 14 (1) of the Tobacco

Products (Manufacture, Presentation and Sale) (Safety) Regulations 2002, contrary to

section 12(1) of the Consumer Protection Act 1987. We left the premises at around

As part of my investigation Vilma Dhowtal and Sellathurai Prabaharan were later formally interviewed. It transpired from these interviews that Mrs Dhowtal's training was woefully inadequate, consisting only of being verbally told not to sell alcohol to underage, intoxicated persons, prostitutes and Police Officer's in uniform. I doubt very much she understood entirely what the training was about, as her interpretation of underage was "little boys".

45 The only evidence of training on underage sales was provided by Mr Prabaharan at his formal interview and confirmed by Mrs Dhowtal at hers. This was an A4 book called 'Staff Training Book' with a statement signed by Mrs Dhowtal on 26/08/2013 which states: "I have completed my off-license, E-pay, card processing training. I understand the rules and regulations of the business."

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Mrs Dhowtal confirmed at interview that Mr Prabaharan told her to write this statement because he struggled to write in English. Mrs Dhowtal also explained that she would have written anything Mr Prabaharan had told her to write. In my view, this does not equate to staff training on the laws relating to the sale of age restricted goods.

On 18th February 2014 Sellathurai Prabaharan was summonsed to appear before Willesden Magistrates Court, where he pleaded guilty to selling 4 cans of Strongbow cider to a 15 year old schoolboy. Mr Prabaharan also admitted having in his possession 20 packets of cigarettes and 15 packets of hand rolling tobacco, none of which had the statutory health warnings on their packaging. Mr Prabaharan was fined £300 for each offence and was ordered to pay a further £840 in prosecution costs to the London Boroughs of Brent & Harrow Trading Standards Service. He was also ordered to pay a £30 victim surcharge.

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Mr Sellathurai Prabaharan of 261 High Road, Willesden NW10 2RX is known to Trading Standards and after interrogating our computerised databases, it reveals that Mr Prabaharan signed a 'Simple Caution' on 25th July 2011 for offences contrary to Sections 92(1)(b) and (c) of the Trade Marks Act 1994.

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The Simple Caution relates to the following. On 11th February 2011, Trading Standards Officers inspected his business and discovered 10 counterfeit bottles of Smirnoff Red Vodka. These items were seized and when Officers returned to 261 High Road, Willesden NW10 2RX on 30th March 2011, an undercover Trading Standards Officer was able to purchase a counterfeit bottle of Jacobs Creek wine. Officers then searched the premises and found 5 more bottles of counterfeit Jacobs Creek wine.




Fine for Kingsbury man after his shop in Willesden sold alcohol to schoolboy, 15

A shop owner from Kingsbury has been fined in court after his store in Willesden sold alcohol to an underage schoolboy.

Sellathurai Prabaharan, of Orchard Grover, admitted selling the four cans of Strongbow cider to the 15-year-old at Variety Food and Wine in High Road.

The 40-year-old also pleaded guilty to having in his possession 20 packets of cigarettes and 15 packets of hand rolling tobacco, none of which had the statutory health warnings on their packaging.

On Tuesday, Willesden Magistrates Court heard he was snared after officers from Brent and Harrow Trading Standards Service (BHTSS) carried out an undercover operation with a child volunteer last August.

The cashier failed to challenge the youth on his age or ask for ID.

Following the illegal sale, BHTSS searched the shop where they discovered the unlawful tobacco products hidden under a counter at the till.

Prabaharan acknowledged the sale and admitted the cashier had been left alone unsupervised in the shop, despite the fact that it was only her third day working there.

He was fined £300 for each offence and was ordered to pay a further £840 in prosecution costs to BHTSS and a £30 victim surcharge.

Bill Bilon, head of BHTSS, said: "The law rightfully places a heavy burden on retailers to ensure that they and their staff act responsibly in order to comply with legislation and prevent sales to children. Where it is evident that retailers have blatantly ignored their responsibilities, we will have no hesitation in prosecuting them."
