- (g) **Securities** Any beneficial interest in securities of a body which has a place of business or land in the council's area, if the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body or of any one class of its issued share capital.



We will and always respect neighbours, preventing noise, cleaning the premises and the front walkway, not selling alcohol to drunk people, respecting the timing.

In relation of the serving of hot food, we do but we only warm up ready made meals, we prepare fresh Panini, or we just mix some pasta(no hi risk food) whit ready made sauces, (maybe 5 per day???) so we are not running as restaurant, we are just a coffe shop and Italian food minimarket.

Licensing Representation to the Initial Application for the Premises Licence at La Bottega Di Anna, 25A Walm Lane, London, NW2 5SH

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make a representation that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

The Licensing Authority require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence:

- CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.
- 2. The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises.
- 3. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times
- 4. A sign stating "No proof of age No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.





- 5. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 6. Regular documented staff training on licensing legislation and operating procedures shall be given. The training shall be signed and dated and a copy of these training records available for inspection by Police and local authority enforcement officers.
- 7. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for Inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 8. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold at the premises.
- 9. A clear view from eye level into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
- 10. Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.
- 11. All deliveries shall take place during the normal working day (i.e. 09:0 to 18:00 daily).
- 12. Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.
- 13. No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.
- 14. No 'Off' sale deliveries of alcohol will be permitted.
- 15. The premises shall be staffed by a minimum of 2 persons after 18:00 hours.
- 16. The rear outside drinking area (backyard) shall cease at 19:00 hours.
- 17. Customers shall not be permitted to consume alcohol in the front external area.

Plan

In conjunction with condition 18, you must amend the plan to remove licensable activities by eliminating the red line in the front external area.

In order for the Licensing Authority to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you to confirm that your client accept the above conditions in writing and provide an up to date plan by 22nd October 2018.

Police representation to Premises Licence application for 'La Bottega Di Anna Ltd' 25A Walm Lane, NW2 5SH.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Council's Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

Officer: Nicola McDonald Licensing Constable PC 157QK

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are concerned with all four of the licensing objectives.

This premise is located on a busy street with high pedestrian footfall linked to the nearby railway underground station. The pavement outside is narrow and contains obstructions from roadside furniture. I understand the applicant has applied for a street trading licence to permit a small number of chairs and tables outside for his customers. Police have no concerns about this external area being used for non-alcoholic food and drinks. Police request only the rear external backyard is used for the consumption of alcohol.

Police request the following conditions be attached to annex 2 of the premises licence

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council upon request.

CCTV cameras shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and the external areas

The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises.

Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers, staff who provide training and all managers will undergo regular training of Licensing Act 2003 legislation. This will be documented and signed for by the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.

A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.

A sign stating "No proof of age – No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold at the premises.

All doors and windows shall remain closed from 2100 hours daily until the premises close to the public.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

The rear outside drinking area (backyard) shall cease at 22:00 hours.

Customers shall not be permitted to consume alcohol in the front external area.



The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

Change of Opening Hours

The Licensing Authority is of the opinion that the proposed hours for the supply of alcohol would undermine the Licensing objectives. There are a number of issues relating to the local area in terms of street drinking which has worsened. By providing a premises which supplies alcohol 24 hours a day, it is believed that this will encourage both the purchasing of alcohol as a result of the length of proposed timings and street drinking.

It is fair to say that premises in the local area have stringent conditions in place but this has not deterred from the problem. The reason being, is that street drinkers traditionally appeared in a way that was obvious to everyone. This is not the case anymore and the fact is, it can be difficult for staff selling alcohol to distinguish who does and does not have an alcohol related problem. It also then presents the problem that staff may not be aware that those persons with said drinking problems will then sit and drink in the street.

Despite looking at this case inidividually, on its own merit, it is difficult to avoid the bigger issue of alcohol in the area.





The Licensing Authority is not limiting suggestions from the applicant as to how this may be combatted but as it stands, there are too many conecrns about the exisiting street drinking in the area to ignore the problem, just because the premises is a petrol station and not a traditional off licence.

For the above reasons the Licensing Authority request that the permitted hours for sale of alcohol be reduced from:

Monday to Sunday 00:00 - 24:00

To

Monday to Sunday 10.00hrs – 23.00hrs

in order to ensure the Licensing objectives are upheld.

Late Night Refreshment

The Licensing Authority have no objection to the proposed timings for late night refreshment.

Condtions to be added to the Premises Licence

Based on the above reduced timings, the Licensing Authority suggest the following conditions to ensure that all four Licensing objectives are met.

- A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.
- CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council
- A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the entire servery counter and till.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all refusals
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers and staff who provide training
 including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation (at least
 every 12 months). The training shall be documented and signed off by the DPS and the member
 of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available
 for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.
- Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.
- A sign stating 'No proof of age, No sale' shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked.





- No single cans of beers, lagers and ciders shall be stocked or sold at the premises.
- A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

On the following grounds:

That the proposed operating hours to supply alcohol are inappropriate due to public nuisance in the area, and the close proximity of residential dwellings.

Informative

I would recommend the following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

Nuisance Control has no objection to the late night refreshments that has been proposed, but would suggest the applicant revise the proposed time from 00:00 - 24:00, to 06:00 - 00:00 for supplying alcohol.

The super store has the same hours attached to the licence, and gives the local residents 6 hours from midnight some quality enjoyment of their property without public nuisance caused by people congregating, loitering at unsociable hours.

The following condition should be attached if the application is to be granted.

Supply of alcohol from 6am until midnight, 7 days a week.

Application for Premises Licence - Morrison's Dally Petrol Filling Station

I am writing to you in connection with the application by Morrison's Supermarkets for a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

I understand that Morrison's wish to apply for a licence either to sell alcohol from Mondays to Sundays between the hours of 00.00 and 24.00 – i.e. with no restriction on the hours of sale whatsoever, and/or for a permit for late night refreshment from Mondays to Sundays between the hours of 23.00 and 05.00 at the petrol station.

I sincerely hope that both of these applications will be rejected. It is already possible to buy alcohol in Morrison's supermarket during their opening hours — from 07.00 until 23.00 on Mondays to Saturdays and from 10.00 until 16.00 on Sundays. There is therefore ample time and opportunity for anyone wishing to purchase alcohol to be able to do so. Furthermore, there are also several shops around Queensbury station where it is also possible to purchase alcohol during the normal opening hours.

The proposals by Morrison's to effectively allow the unrestricted sale of alcohol are contrary to the intentions of the Licensing laws. The limit on hours in which alcohol can be purchased has been put in place to protect individuals and the public in general both for health and safety reasons and for public order. Should Morrison's applications be granted these protections will be removed. The type of person wishing or needing to purchase alcohol outside of the normal shopping hours is likely to either have an alcohol dependency problem or be inclined towards public disorder. Further, if alcohol is sold at a petrol filling station there is a risk that the purchaser will be liable to break the drink-driving laws, potentially causing harm to innocent members of the public.


On Monday of this week, 8th October, there was a public meeting for residents of Queensbury, Kenton East and Edgware wards in Harrow, attended by the local police, amongst others, at which a number of residents living near Queensbury station expressed concerns about the behaviour of groups of young men gathering near the station, drinking or

under the influence of drink. If Morrison's application is granted this type of unruly behaviour is likely to increase, with resulting disruption to the local residents and to the many more residents who will occupy the flats shortly to be built under the proposed development by Fairview Homes.

I therefore again repeat my request that this proposal be rejected.

There is currently a major problem in the Honeypot Lane/Queensbury Station area with antisocial behaviour due to large groups of people congregating and drinking around gathering places in the area, quite often though to quite late at night. The last thing this area needs is more retail of alcohol during the evening hours.





The application has been made for a variation of the premises licence under section 34 of the act.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Council's Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below. I am of the opinion that the risk to the Council's objectives can be mitigated by rejecting the requested variation regarding extended opening hours.

The Police representations are concerned with the prevention crime and disorder and public nuisance.

The current premises licence number for 5-7 Wembley Hill Road, Wembley is 223223095. Police dealt with the initial application for the premise Licence received by Brent Police Licensing team on 9th November 2014. This applicant and premises licence holder are one of the same: Ms Hamida Moalin, of 296 Harrow Road, Wembley, HA9 6LJ.

In 2015 and 2016 the premises concerned was linked to anti-social behaviour and complaints from residents of noise nuisance both internally and externally. As a consequence of the complaints the venue was taken to a review of its licence and the committee decided that the licence be suspended for 2 months to enable the licence holder to bring the management and maintenance of the premises up to a required standard. Furthermore after the suspension ended the opening hours were amended

and currently remain as Sunday to Thursday 1100 until 2330 hours and Friday and Saturday 1100 until 0030 hours as agreed by the committee.

The amended hours implemented have significantly impacted 'positively' on the amount of nuisance caused or linked to the venue.

In 2017 no temporary event notices (TENS) took place at the premises.

To date, six TENS have been applied for in 2018, four of which the applications indicated 70 guests and two of which indicated 50 guests were expected to attend including staff. Five of the applications indicated 3 x SIA staff and 1 indicated 4 x SIA staff. Each of the TEN requested an extension of hours until 0400 hours. The temporary events have all been private parties or celebrations which would suggest 'invitees only'. The Invitees wouldn't necessarily consist of regular customers to the venue.

This full variation application is asking to remove the conditions imposed by the committee following the last review. The hours requested by the applicant are Sunday to Thursday 1100 hours until 0300 hours and Friday and Saturday 1100 hours until 0500 hours.

On Wednesday 3rd October 2018, I visited the restaurant accompanied by PC McDonald at 1600 hours in uniform. To the right of the main entrance (Externally) there was an A3 blue notice displaying the proposed new hours applied for with the local authority. In the venue I met with the applicant who was welcoming and showed us around her restaurant area and the upstairs section. The applicant pointed out that business was slow and that the request for extending the opening hours was based on the Somali communities demand.

For clarity, the applicant pointed out two ground floor areas, one at the front of the venue incorporating the main entrance and a second area that has a glass partition set back from the front that consists of dining area. It is the larger area that the applicant has held temporary events beyond the 0030 hours. I asked what happens with the regular customers at the front, and the applicant indicated that they would be kept separate from the parties/functions in the rear section. The applicant informed me that it was difficult to take bookings from customers in advance based on the limitations of TENS. The applicant indicated that all parties/functions held at the venue would be family orientated and by invite or ticket only. I asked whether the front would operate to the same hours it currently does or if the front would also remain open to the public utilising the extended hours if authorised by the committee. The applicant expressed she would like the whole restaurant to remain open to the extended hours applied for. At this point the applicant also indicated that she doubted staying open until 0500 hours every time. I asked the necessity for 0500 hours as opposed to 0200 hours or 0300 hours to which the applicant again said she knew her customers' requirements and demand.

The applicant voluntarily showed me cctv from Friday September 28th 2018 at 0030 hours which clearly showed no customers in the venue as per current license conditions. I note that the current licence has 29 conditions. These conditions were also set with each TEN by the applicant. The applicant stated that the business no longer provides shisha and there was no evidence of equipment in the venue. Of note there was no signage at the exit requesting that patrons be quiet or respectful to neighbours as per **Annex 2 - condition 18** and there was no signage on display at the entrance regarding the licensees admission policy and use of search by staff – **annex 2 condition 10**

The applicant informed me that she has invested heavily into the restaurant and was determined to make it work. I pointed out that some of the issues that resulted in the review in 2017 remained such as Parking, close proximity to residential properties, backing onto a service road, used by delivery vehicles and refuge collectors early in the morning. The applicant acknowledged this and insisted that was based on the customers the venue used to attract. The applicant again insisted that she was concentrating on attracting families and group parties to the venue that were older and more respectful.

The applicant referred to the temporary events that had been held and said she had learnt from them. This included using SIA door staff. The premises was broken into within the last month and the applicant stated everything was taken including paper work form the manager's office. This included the SIA door log and incident book.

In relation to the six temporary events held at the venue I am not aware of any complaints to the 999 or 101 call handling system regarding these events or any associated ASB. I am concerned that the venue being open until 0300 hours Sunday through until Thursday and then until 0500 hours Friday and Saturday will afford an opportunity for noise nuisance and reported ASB to reappear and it is through the TENs process applied for, the venue has been used appropriately – i.e. an event outside that of the normal business held at the venue.

The applicant also wishes to open until 0500 hours on bank holidays and New Year's Eve. There is no other business in the vicinity that will be open that late and the residents have been problem free since the amended hours authorised by the committee. Should the committee authorise the new extended hours I request that new conditions are set in addition to the current 29 listed.

The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below:

- 1. Anytime the premises are open to the public, for licensable activities after 0030hrs, the customers will be attending a pre-booked event in the rear function room.
- 2. The licensee upon accepting bookings implements a system whereby she obtains valid photo Identification and proof of address for the person responsible for the attending party/function attendees.
- 3. The front area by the main entrance remain open at the current hours Sunday through Thursday 2330 hours with Friday and Saturday until 0030 hours. This facilitates the control of the private function/party and who is at the venue and avoids any temptation for regular customers to join the party.

Thank you for the quick response. I think that was a fair assessment of the situation. However, I would like to point out a few things.

- 1. In 2017, Hiddo Restaurant made a number of TEN applications, and the events took place without any issues/complaints.
- 2. In your letter you write that the invitees would not necessarily be our regular customers. While this is true in the strict sense, as there is no way of guaranteeing that every single person coming would be a regular customers, the vast majority of the people coming are our customers. Our customers are 90% of the time people that have come before, and our lifeline is people who come at least three times a week. This is who, our events (if there were any) would be targeted at. This means that we know these people very well. This is the same client base asking for later opening times.
- 3. The change we are requesting in opening times is to serve food later, as well as to hold private events. Our client base, we have found, particularly in the weekend, want to come

- and eat later in the evenings, and needing to close so early forces our customers to go elsewhere.
- 4. We have found a solution for the parking problem, which your rightfully mentioned. Red Car Park, which is a few minutes walk is open 24 hours. We've been insisting our customers use it and has been displayed.
- 5. We have no displayed a notice asking our customers to respect our neighbours and to not congregate in the area.

In relation to the three conditions that will be required by the police. We have no problem whatsoever with the second condition, setting up a system for recording valid identification of the person responsible for attendees of the event. We do however object to the first and second conditions.

This is because we do not always have bookings. We need to operate longer hours and all of our customers are people that like to eat at night. As such, agreeing to the first condition would require us to close down early any time we did not have a booking. The business is really struggling at the moment, and we could really benefit from serving food later to our customers. With regards to the third condition, we would need to use the front area to serve food, and should there be an event in the rear area, we could have security at the front of the rear area.

I hope this email finds you well. We have tried to, to the best of our abilities, to answer all the questions/points made by your letter. If you have any other questions, please ask. *Nuisance Control objects to the proposed hours as there is not suitable parking for patrons who double parks outside on double yellow lines and causes obstructions to large vehicles trying to pass.*Our customers are currently using Red car park which is 24 hours and less than 3 minutes walk. Parking would therefore not be a problem. Not only have we been encouraging our customers to use this car park but they have been given very serious instruction on where they cannot park (around the side and the back, and especially not at the front as this is illegal).

As the property is now a restaurant the proposed hours will give rise to loitering around when smoking and causing public nuisance.

The restaurant is divided into two sections. The main section of the restaurant and a section for drinking and snacks. We ask that all of our customers wait in the snacks section as they wait for their ride home. This will ensure that not one customer waits outside the building for the car to pick them up. All staff have been given training on how to prevent customers from loitering in the area. And we enforce this with the utmost seriousness. Furthermore, the majority of our customers are families and couples on dates, neither group is likely to loiter in the areas, in any case, particularly not at night.

The applicant is to provide evidence of sound proofing the premises that will avoid noise breakout from amplified & live music, so local residents will not be affected.

This issue has been raised by the environmental authorities in the past, in fact, I believe that someone from your office (Mr Wood) came in some 18 months ago, perhaps longer, to see the noise leakage, if there was any. It is my understanding that there was not. That said, we do not have sound proofing evidence this is because it was done by our builders. It was so much cheaper for it to be done in-house than contract it out. It is also my understanding that no complaints have been made about Hiddo Restaurant inside or outside noise since we have been open. And we play music regularly. This, I hope, speaks volumes (mind the pun) about how great the sound proofing is.

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which

require or encourage,

or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

- No children shall be permitted on the premises after 22:00 hours



Police representation to the Premises Licence application for 'SATYANARAYAN RESTAURANT LTD, 23-25 QUEENSBURY STATION PARADE, LONDON, HA8 5NR'

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Council's Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

I am of the opinion that the risk to the Council's objectives can be mitigated by attaching conditions to the Licence as shown below.

If these conditions were accepted in full, I would withdraw my representation.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003. The application has been made for a premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder, public safety and public nuisance.

I had a telephone conversation with the applicant who informed me she had not got the keys to the premises as yet, so no work had commenced. Nor could I have entry to look inside the premises. Therefore, I have had to assess the application based on the paperwork submitted and a site visit to survey the exterior of location and its surroundings. The architect plans suggest building work will be carried out to merge three premises into one restaurant/banqueting hall. There will be a dividing partition wall to separate the two elements. The surrounding area is a densely populated residential area with flats that sit directly on top of the premises front and rear, akin to a shopping parade with a rear access alley. Therefore, I have concerns over the request to have the premises open as late as 0100hrs due to public nuisance, crime and disorder issues.

A major concern regarding the premises is what is its actual function and purpose based on the information provided in the application. By definition, a restaurant or banquet suggests substantial food is being served. However, the premises is only serving food until 2300hrs, but is requesting live & recorded music and sale of alcohol as late as 0100hrs. This suggests it is operating more as a late night bar or club than as a restaurant at the weekends. Given that the premises has yet to be built and the "noise reduction measures to address public nuisance objectives" are unspecified, I also have concerns over the noise and vibration coming from the premises, which could disturb residents. The other issue is the coming and going of customers and when also as it closes. If the premises is at capacity, the egress of a 200 inebriated patrons, revving car engines and cabs coming and going will also cause a nuisance. The area itself has ongoing crime and disorder issues of its own, recent multiple shootings (May 2018) believed associated to local drug dealers.

ASB, Violent crime, Robbery and drug offences account for well over 50% of all crime recorded in Queensbury (Sept 2017-Aug 2018: ukcrimestats.com). Having a bar/club operating into the early hours of the weekend will be looked at as another opportunity by drug dealers to ply their trade.

The supply of alcohol and the request for music runs right up until the closing times applied for. I believe it is a good idea to allow a drinking-up period, to prevent late closing or prolonged drinking beyond closing times resulting in licence breaches. Therefore, I recommend the sale of alcohol times should be half an hour before the revised, respective closing times.

Based on these findings, Police would require the following points be included in the operating schedule, or added as conditions on the premises licence.

Personal Licence Holder

The sale of alcohol to drunken people and children is a major cause of concern to police and highlighted in the Governments Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy. Those who sell alcohol should be fully aware of the legislation and issues around alcohol and should be fully trained to a national standard.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone <u>outside</u> the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item. Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) should be similarly displayed. This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below.

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for <u>31 days</u> and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council upon request.

The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises.

A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

A sign stating "No proof of age – No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.

Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers, staff who provide training and all managers will undergo regular training of Licensing Act 2003 legislation. This will be documented and signed for by the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for Inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
All crime reported to the venue
Any complaints received
Any faults in the CCTV system
Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Alcohol to be consumed on the premises shall only be provided as an accompaniment to a meal, Customers are not be allowed to sit, stand or be served from the bar area, or any other staff area used for the preparation of alcoholic beverages.

Signs must be displayed at suitable points along the bar reading 'Service is by waiter/waitress service only.

Customers shall not be permitted to take open drink containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.

Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.

No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.

The playing of live or recorded music shall not be permitted in any garden or external area.

All doors and windows shall remain closed during any licensable activity and where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door shall be lobbied and fitted with a self-closing device

All regulated entertainment shall conclude (number) minutes before the premises are due to close each day.

A designated smoking area should be located at the front of the premises and limited to 10 persons at any one time.

The total number of people on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed a number as set out by Brent Council's health & Safety team.

All licensable activities shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises are due to close each day.

I would also propose opening/closing times as follows: Sunday to Wednesday 1200hrs to 2300hrs. Thursday to Saturday 1200hrs to 0000hrs. The supply of alcohol hours should be revised as follows: Sunday to Wednesday 1200hrs to 2230hrs. Thursday to Saturday 1200hrs to 2330hrs.

Many thanks for your email.

I have spoken to my estate agent and he has agreed to give me access to the property if need be on these circumstances as we still have not moved to Solictor's hands and don't know when that will be. So please let me know if you would like to meet at the premises and I can get it organised with the agent.

So at the premises food will be served until 11pm but we only require a later license if a customer decides to hire the banqueting area and wants to stay until later for a specific function. It is only available as an option if the customer requires and I assure you it won't turn into a late night bar/club as that is not what we are trying to promote. In most instances the customer will leave at an earlier time and most guests leave soon after the food is served meaning not all the guests leave at the same time, hence reducing noise pollution. The banqueting will only be for a maximum of 100 people. The restaurant will be operated separately so those guests will leave when they finish so when they leave it will be staggered.

I understand crime rate is high in this area but the type of crowd we will be attracting will be a family crowd who won't be interested in buying such drugs so will not increase to the crime rate in the area.

I refer to the application for a new licence for the above named premises. After assessing the application, the Public Safety Team will be making the following representations to the Licensing Authority on the grounds of Public Safety.

Providing the licensee is willing to accept the following conditions Public Safety Team would withdraw the representation.

- The locks and flush latches on the exit doors and gates shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars or pads whilst the public are on the premises.
- The socket outlets (or other power supplies used for DJ equipment, band equipment and other portable equipment) that are accessible to performers, staff or the public shall be suitably protected by a residual current device (RCD having a rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps).
- Exits are not obstructed (including by curtains, hangings or temporary decorations), and accessible via non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified
- Where chairs and tables are provided, internal gangways are kept unobstructed
- Temporary electrical wiring and distribution systems are not provided without notification to the licensing authority at least ten days before commencement of the work and/or prior inspection by a suitable qualified electrician.
- Subject to risk assessment, the maximum number of persons permitted on the Premises (not including staff) shall be: 150 persons

In order for the Public Safety Team to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you or your client to **confirm in writing or via Email** that you accept the above licence conditions.

We will require these conditions to appear on the licence schedule should the licence be granted.

If you are in control of any part of a commercial premise, you are under a legal obligation to carry out a detailed fire risk assessment to identify risks and hazards in the premises. I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make a representation.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

The Licensing Authority require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence:

- 1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.
- 2. A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras to cover the bar areas and tills.
- 3. A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system shall be available at the premise at all times that the premises are open to the public.
- 4. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.





- 5. Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.
- 6. Customers shall not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
- 7. The licensee shall ensure customers leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 8. No children shall be admitted unless accompanied by a responsible adult. All children must leave the premises by midnight.
- 9. A sign stating 'No proof of age, No sale' shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- 10. Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers and staff who provide training including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation (at least every 12 months). The training shall be documented and signed off by the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept centrally and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.
- 11. A 'Challenge 25' policy shall be adopted and adhered to
- 12. Alcohol shall only be provided as an accompaniment to a main meal in the restaurant area.
- 13. Door supervisors of a sufficient number and gender mix, shall be employed in the banqueting hall from 21:30 hours on any day when it is in use for the sale of alcohol past midnight.
- 14. A maximum of 5 persons shall be permitted to smoke outside the premises at any one time.
- 15. The rear external area shall not be for customer use.
- 16. There shall be no live or recorded music played in the restaurant area.
- 17. Substantial snacks and non-intoxicating beverages shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
- 18. No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises. The level of music shall be arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- 19. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Change in Closing Hours

The Licensing Authority require that there be a period of 30 minutes between when licensable activities cease and customers leave the premises. In order to meet this requirement we ask that the closing times be modified from:-

Monday - Wednesday 23.00hrs





Thursday – Saturday 01.00hrs Sunday 00.00

Monday – Wednesday 23.30hrs Thursday – Saturday 01.30hrs Sunday 00.30

Many thanks for your email.

I will ensure the following measures take place for noise reduction to address public nuisance.

- I will ensure the noise is not audible outside the premises and to other business premises in the area by soundproofing the premises.
- -I will keep windows and doors closed as the premises will be fitted with air conditioning as to avoid opening windows.
- -i will provide sound insulation to emergency exit doors and extractor fans.
- I will keep speakers within premises and will not position them near to openings such as doors and windows.
- I will not deliberately play, or direct music outside the premises as a means of attracting customers.
- I will play sound amplification systems through a sound limiting device.
- -will use in- house speakers rather than artist Dj speaker system
- provide sound insulated enclosures to external plant and machinery
- -provide sound insulation to ventilation ductwork and outlets
- use anti-vibration mountings for speakers
- -use rubber matting and handling aids for the movement of barrels, cylinders, bottles etc.

I certify that I have considered this application for a New Premises Licence for premises: Satyanarayan, 23-25 Queensbury Station Parade, Edgware, HA8 5NR.

I acknowledge that the licensable activities proposed are:

- Live music (Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00hrs, Thur-Sat 12:00-01:00hrs, Sun 12:00-00:00)
- Recorded music (Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00hrs, Thur-Sat 12:00-01:00hrs, Sun 12:00-00:00)
- The sale by retail of alcohol (Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00hrs, Thur-Sat 12:00-01:00hrs, Sun 12:00-00:00)

I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the approval of this premises licence is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives with regards to the prevention of public nuisance with due consideration to the type of regulated entertainment applied for and operating hours proposed. Representations are made on the grounds that public nuisance is likely to be experienced by the occupiers of neighbouring and nearby residential units.

It is recommended that the following conditions are attached to the premises licence to ensure that the licensing objective relating to public nuisance is upheld:

- 1. All doors and windows shall remain closed during the licensed activities.
- 2. Music played at the premises shall not be audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property. Designated site personnel shall monitor the boundary of the premises for any excessive sound breakout and take immediate action to remedy the situation.

- 3. Prolonged congregations of patrons outside the premises shall be discouraged. Once patrons have finished smoking, they shall be asked to either return inside the premises or vacate the immediate area outside of the premises.
- 4. Signs shall be displayed in prominent areas informing guests of the residential nature of the area and to conduct their behaviour accordingly.
- 5. When the premises turn out, a staggered dispersal strategy shall be employed to ensure minimal noise disturbance to local residents.
- 6. When the premises turn out, a door supervisor shall supervise guests and ensure they leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours.

With reference to section d (the prevention of public nuisance) of page 13, the application states "noise reduction measures to address public nuisance objectives" but it is not clear what these measures are. It is requested that you submit further details relating to the aforementioned "measures."

Please submit the requested information and also confirm if you are willing to agree to the above conditions. If you are willing to abide by the conditions, I will be in a position to withdraw my representation subject to above requested details relating to the "noise reduction measures" being satisfactory.
