Premises Location

The premises is an off licence based on Station Parade, opposite Willesden Green train station and is located along a small parade of shops.





### Background

The premises licence 149076 is currently operated by Mohammad Shafiq. The application for the licence was initially made in June 2005.

The business rate payer is registered as MR MOHAMMAD A BHATTI who is liable from 01/12/2013 when checked on 28th July 2021.

Mr Bhatti was the previous licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor for the premises from June 2005 until January 2020.

In December 2019, following a visit to the premises where it was found that Mr Bhatti had no involvement in the business and premises licence conditions were not being met, a meeting was held at Brent Civic Centre. As a result of this, a request was made for the premises licence to be transferred and a minor variation application was to be made to add more stringent conditions to the premises licence (**sf001**).

Mr Nathan Blight (Mr Shafiq's son), subsequently submitted a transfer application and vary DPS form, but this was withdrawn.

In January 2020, an application to transfer the licence and vary the DPS was submitted by Mr Shafiq.

It has now come to light that the transfer application was made but the minor variation application was never followed through and therefore the premises licence conditions still remain the same (**sf002**). It is unclear why the minor variation was never submitted.

### Complaints and Enforcement to Date

- On Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021, whilst undertaking a Willesden Day of Action, I was approached by two police officers PC [REDACTED] and PC [REDACTED] who work for the local Safer Neighbourhood Team. They expressed concerns that the premises were not being co-operative when asked for CCTV and were even more concerned in relation to crime and

disorder that had taken place outside the premises. I then offered to visit the premises with them.

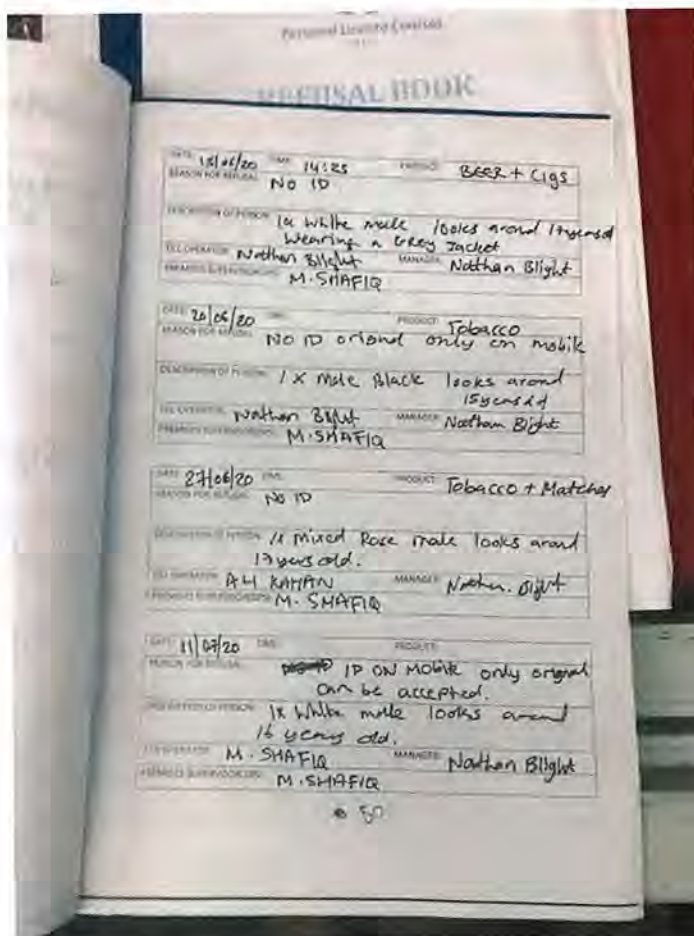
On entering the premises, I saw Mr Mohammad Shafiq stood behind the counter, who is known to me. The Police officers approached Mr Shafiq and asked to view the CCTV to which he replied they could not see it. The Police officers reiterated the urgency in needing to view the CCTV as there had been a number of fights including knives directly outside the premises in the last week and the CCTV would show someone placing a knife within the fruit and vegetable stall outside the premises on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

Mr Shafiq simply shrugged this off and did not appear to wish to co-operate. I then intervened and asked Mr Shafiq to show the Police officers the CCTV footage. Mr Shafiq stated that he would need to call the manager as he did not have access and therefore could not open the door to the office. I asked Mr Shafiq to find whoever it is that could operate the CCTV and that he ask them to attend. Mr Shafiq made a telephone call and stated someone was coming.

Whilst waiting for someone to attend and operate the CCTV system, I asked for the premises licence and began going through the conditions. It was clear that three out of the ten licensing conditions were not being met, these being:-

1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition.
2. All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 14 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
10. A refusal book shall be kept and maintained.

The last entry in the refusal log was entered in July 2020.



Although not a condition of the premises licence, also present was an incident book. The entry detailing the incident of 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 had not been entered as an incident.

We waited approximately 30 minutes, when a male who I know to be Mr Shafiq's son Nathan Blight entered the premises; this being the manager that Mr Shafiq referred to. The Police officers explained the urgency to Mr Blight and explained that on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 at approximately 15.45hrs, a knife had been hidden underneath the fruit and vegetable stall outside the front of the premises and that the footage was likely to show who had placed the knife at this location. A suspect had also entered the premises just before the knife had been found at the same time of 15.45hrs appearing to leave something inside the premises. At this point Mr Blight took us to the office to view the footage.

As Mr Blight was looking through the footage, he became increasingly flustered and looked concerned, to which I asked why he looked so worried. Mr Blight appeared nervous when going through the footage. After asking Mr Blight to go to particular timings throughout the 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021, it had become obvious that the recording began on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 at 15.45hrs.

However, on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 when PC [REDACTED] had entered the premises following the suspect and requested to view CCTV footage of this, Mr Shafiq had disappeared into the rear of the premises. When it came to viewing the CCTV files a few minutes later, it appeared nothing was recorded.

During my viewing of the footage, it now appeared that this footage had in fact been deleted based on when the footage had begun recording again at 15.45hrs.

At this point Mr Blight stated that it may have been because the footage records for 14 days and then restarts the recording again from the beginning. This is not correct, as the footage is recorded on a cycle and deletes the oldest footage as and when it records newer footage. There is always 14 days CCTV footage to view at any one time. Mr Blight became increasingly jittery and defensive at one point huffing at me when I was asking him to go through the CCTV. I asked Mr Blight not to do this, as what I was witnessing was extremely serious. Mr Blight's reaction was not what I would expect from such a serious request from the Police.

During the viewing of the footage, it was noted that Mr Shafiq fist bumped one of the suspects and was seen talking to him for a few minutes, somebody Mr Shafiq told the Police he did not know.

I asked Mr Blight to download the footage from 15.45hrs until 18.00hrs, to which Mr Blight stated he would do this if he was provided with a disc. I told Mr Blight that no one would be providing any discs and he would need to purchase them himself.

I attach statements from PC [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] with details of their dealings with the premises to date (sf003 & sf004).

- On 21<sup>st</sup> July 2021, I received a call from PC [REDACTED] who stated that Mr Blight had provided a shortened version of the requested CCTV. Instead of 15.45hrs to 18.00hrs, only 15.45hrs to 16.45hrs had been provided which omitted the fist bumping between Mr Shafiq and the suspect.

### Summary

The premises had in 2019, been asked to submit a minor variation in December 2019. This request was never complied with which would have added more stringent conditions to the premises licence. These conditions had been agreed in advance.

Having now revisited the premises with PC [REDACTED] and PC [REDACTED] I was shocked to see how the premises disregarded the requests from the Police and almost certainly deleted CCTV footage that related to potential crime. It was also clear from looking at the premises licence, that the current conditions were not being met.

It is clear from the evidence shown that the persons running the premises have no regard for the law and have continued to operate as they so wish contravenes the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.

Further, Mr Shafiq who refused to show the Police officers CCTV footage and then stated he needed the manager to attend to view the footage, is actually the Licence Holder and DPS for the premises.

As far as I am concerned, not providing CCTV is as bad as it being provided and showing evidence of wrong doings. All premises need to be given a clear message that should they fail to provide CCTV footage, they run the risk of having their premises licence revoked. Without this clear message, it leaves the Licensing Authority open to advantages being taken by premises, where they can get away with operating as they wish. In fact requesting the need to have a condition relating to CCTV would be pointless. Further, I question how many opportunities should premises' be given, before they run the risk of losing their licence.

Adding further conditions to the premises licence is not an option as the premises were given this opportunity and failed to apply to do so. At this point no amount of additional conditions will ensure the premises uphold the crime and disorder licensing objective, when it is clear they cannot comply with the current requirements.

It is unquestionable that the premises are unable to uphold two licensing objectives, namely prevention of crime and disorder and public safety and the only option the Licensing Authority see for this premises licence is for it to be revoked with immediate effect.

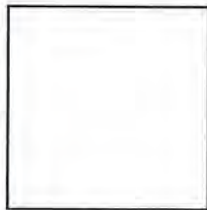

**RE: Premises Licence current and proposed conditions**

Dear Sir/Madam,

As a result of the issues at the premises during the inspection carried out on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> December 2019, please find below a list of the current conditions as requested. Ahead of the meeting on Thursday, please also see an idea of the type of conditions we propose would go onto the premises licence and would replace the current conditions.

Please be aware this list is not exhaustive and the police have not had a chance to make any comments.

**Current Premises Licence Conditions**

- 1 CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition.
- 2 All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 14 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
- 3 A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.
- 4 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 5 `Raid Control? crime prevention measures shall be installed and all staff given suitable training.
- 6 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked
- 7 All deliveries shall take place during the normal working day (i.e. 09:0 to 18:00 daily).
- 8 The PASS approved ID scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted.
- 9 A sign stating `No proof of age ` No sale? shall be displayed at the point of sale.

10 A refusal book shall be kept and maintained.

**Proposed Premises Licence Conditions**

1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 30 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council. This must comply with the Data Protection Act including signage.
2. The CCTV system shall display on any recordings, the correct date and time of the recording.
3. CCTV camera shall be installed to cover entrances/exits of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the full interior of the licensed area.
4. A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system shall be available at the premise at all times that the premises are open to the public.
5. The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises.
6. The Licence holder /DPS/Manager shall inspect and test that the CCTV is operational and working correctly on a weekly basis. A signed and dated record of the CCTV examination and any findings shall be kept on the premises and made available to the police and authorised officers of the Local Authority on request.
7. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
8. A sign stating 'No proof of age, No sale' shall be displayed at any point of sale.
9. The premises will operate a challenge 25 age verification policy with the only acceptable forms of photographic identification being a driving licence or passport.
10. Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers and staff who provide training including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation (at least every 6 months). The training shall be documented and signed off by the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.
11. No deliveries shall take place between 20:00 and 07:00 hours
12. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold.
13. A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
14. A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol
15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all refusals
  - (b) any complaints received
  - (c) any incidents of disorder

- (d) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

- 16. No single cans of beers, largers or ciders shall be sold at the premises.
- 17. The licence holder and DPS shall undertake the BIAAB level 2 Award for Personal Licence Holders Qualification Certificate.

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce

on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

### Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

- (a)—duty<sup>ll</sup> is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b)—permitted price<sup>ll</sup> is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c)—relevant person<sup>ll</sup> means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) —relevant person<sup>ll</sup> means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e)—value added tax<sup>ll</sup> means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-

paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day||) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day||) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2)The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Requirement for a DPS**

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a)at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b)at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### **Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (Only if required)**

- 8 The PASS approved ID scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted.
- 9 A sign stating "No proof of age -- No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- 10 A refusal book shall be kept and maintained.

I am police constable  1714NW based at KILBURN police station in the QK-BCU. I am a Dedicated Ward Officer for WILLESDEN GREEN Ward which is also situated in the QK-BCU.

I have made this statement in relation to JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, located at 20 STATION PARADE, NW2 4NH.

As stated above, I am the dedicated Ward officer for WILLESDEN GREEN, and am part of the Safer Neighbourhood Team for WILLESDEN GREEN Ward.

JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE NW2 is located on the border of WILLEDEDEN GREEN WARD and MAPESBURY WARD. JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, as I describe, is a newsagents selling both food and drink products including alcohol. JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE is located on STATION PARADE NW2. There is one (1) known entry/exit point to JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE this being the main entrance located on STATION PARADE. To the RIGHT of the main entrance, if facing WILLESDEN GREEN STATION, is one (1) fruit and veg stall which has concealed storage space underneath. JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE has at least two (2) store rooms on site that are located at the back of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE to the LEFT, with the room located to the far back of the newsagents holding the CCTV monitor and CCTV reviewing systems. There is one (1) additional room at the back of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. This appears to be a living space with sofas and cooking facilities. JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE have multiple CCTV cameras within the vicinity which capture both inside of the newsagents from multiple angles and directly outside of the newsagents.

In this statement I will refer to multiple people. I will firstly refer to PC  2599NW, who is the second safer neighbourhood/dedicated ward officer for WILLESDEN GREEN ward. I will refer to Susana FIGUEIREDO who is the Brent Licensing Officer. I will make reference Nathan BLIGHT, the co-owner/manager for JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I will make reference to  and  who were the two (2) males stop and searched on 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. Lastly, I will reference to two (2) unidentified males who are employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I will refer to the older male who later is identified as a co-manager of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE as Employee One (1). I will refer to the younger male, also an employee of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE as Employee Two (2). I will also refer to a number of anonymous informants who have provided information and intelligence to myself whilst on patrol prior to 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021.

I have visited JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE on two (2) occasions. The first occasion was on the 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 at approx. 1542hrs and the second occasion was on the 15<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021. However, I have been approached by anonymous individuals who have reported suspected criminal activity taken place outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE on a daily basis, this criminal activity namely drug supply and drug use. The anonymous informant has stated to myself that young male are seen to loiter outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. They state how they have observed individuals who look like drug users arrive on station parade and engage with the males who are loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. They state how drug users and the males have entered JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and then enter a residential building to 'shoot up'. I have spoken to another anonymous business owner who has stated how they can smell cannabis seeping through the walls and smell this on a regular basis. Another anonymous business owner has stated how they used to observe individuals loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE hiding packages amongst the outside plant pots. The informant stated that they had to remove the outside plant pots to prevent this from happening. I have also spoken to another informant who is a local resident. They have reported how they have observed Somalian males and white males loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, hiding packages which the informant believes to be drugs amongst the fruit and vegetables that are stored in the outdoor fruit and vegetable stall. Lastly, another source has stated how they have observed an increased quantity of individuals with the appearance of drug users loitering on STATION PARADE. They have stated how they always observe the same males loitering outside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, individuals they believe to be drug dealers. All informants spoken to have indicated that they suspect that JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE has involvement, either by allowing the males to loiter outside and for drugs to be hidden on premise. In between the 08<sup>th</sup> July 2021 and 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021 I have been directly contacted by police officers from different teams including the TERRITORIAL SUPPORT GROUP and the VIOLENT SUPPRESSION UNIT who have stated their concerns and suspicions that not only are drug dealers loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE dealing drugs to the local drug users but that the drug dealing is taking place within JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE itself.

On THURSDAY 8<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2021, at approx. 1535hrs, PC [REDACTED] and I were conducting foot patrol in full uniform along WALM LANE in the direction of STATION PARADE. As I approached STATION PARADE, I observed three (3) males loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. One (1) of the males was IC1 and the other two (2) males being IC3. As I approached the three (3) males, I observed the IC1 male, soon to be identified as [REDACTED] immediately enter JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, whilst one (1) of the IC3 males began to walk away down STATION PARADE in the direction of LENNON RD. I detained the IC3 male, soon to be identified as [REDACTED], under S23 Misuse of Drugs Act. Whilst I was searching [REDACTED], I observed PC [REDACTED] exit JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE with [REDACTED] and begin to search [REDACTED]. I continued searching [REDACTED] until PC [REDACTED] at 1545hrs alerted me that he had found a knife hidden underneath the fruit and veg stall in the concealed compartment underneath.

[REDACTED] was placed in handcuffs for the remainder of the S23 Misuse of Drugs Act stop and search until checks had been completed. No drugs or weapons were found on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was released. Whilst I was conducting checks on the police systems, PC [REDACTED] informed me that he would conduct CCTV enquiries of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. This was because, the knife (a 9cm lock knife) at approx. 1545hrs was found hidden in the fruit and veg stall of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and CCTV from JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE may have captured the individual who originally placed the knife underneath the fruit and veg stall. Once I concluded checks, I re-joined PC [REDACTED] in the

 back room of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, where the CCTV monitors and CCTV viewing systems were stored. As I arrived in the back room I observed Employee Two (2) standing in front of the CCTV, operating the CCTV viewing systems. However, Employee Two showed me on the CCTV viewing screen that no footage prior to 1545hrs on 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 had been saved. This raised both myself and PC [REDACTED] concerns as Employee One (1) had previously stated that CCTV was available to be viewed. PC [REDACTED] then informed me that he had spoken to Employee One (1) who had confirmed that there was CCTV available to view. PC [REDACTED] informed me that he had observed Employee One (1) walking to the back of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE as soon as he had exit JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE to help with detaining to the two (2) males who had been stopped. PC [REDACTED] informed me that once he had returned into JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, approx. 3 minutes later he could not see Employee One (1), however a further 2 minutes later, PC [REDACTED] had observed Employee One (1) return from the far rear of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. PC [REDACTED] informed me that he had asked Employee One (1) if he could view the CCTV and Employee One (1) confirmed, and asked Employee Two (2) to show him. This contrasting information raised increasing concerns to JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE's involvement with the two (2) males believed to be concerned with drug supply who had been stopped and detained by myself and PC [REDACTED]. During my interactions with Employee One (1) I noted how as soon as Employee one (1) had been alerted that a knife had been found Employee one (1) immediately got onto his mobile phone and conversed in a foreign language. Additionally, which I find concerning, there is a large window to the RIGHT of counter and till for JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. Through this is a direct view to the fruit and veg stall. When asking Employee One (1) he stated he had not seen anything and acted surprised, but not concerned that the knife had been found hidden underneath the fruit and vegetable stall. Once I had left JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE I approached numerous anonymous informants who provided me with identical descriptions of males whom they believe to be drug dealers. The males matched the descriptions of the two (2) males myself and PC [REDACTED] had stopped outside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. The informants also stated that the males often stand outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and engage in conversation with the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I also observed, whilst carrying out door to door enquiries, two (2) known drug users enter JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and engage in conversation with Employee One (1). The two (2) known drug users were in JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE for approx. five minutes. And one (1) other male who has previous for various criminal offences including possession of drugs, Class A was observed standing on STATION PARADE opposite JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE watching both myself and [REDACTED] whilst we were standing outside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE.

On 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021 at approx. 1330hrs I conducted a licensing visit at JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE with PC [REDACTED] 2599NW and Susana FIGUEIREDO, Licensing officer for Brent. Both I and PC [REDACTED] were in full uniform. Upon entering JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE I observed Employee One (1) was standing behind the counter. I asked to view CCTV following three (3) knife relating incidents taking place on STATION PARADE/WALM LANE NW2. Employee One (1) refused stating that I could not see CCTV. This is when FIGUEIREDO interjected by showing their licensing badge and asked Employee One (1) a second time if we could view CCTV, as per their licensing contract. Employee One (1) has replied stating that he would have to contact his manager as his manager was the only employee who could use the CCTV. In total, PC [REDACTED] FIGUEIREDO and I had to wait a total of 30 minutes for the manager, soon to be identified as Nathan BLIGHT. Whilst I waited for BLIGHT, myself and FIGUEIREDO had a look at the Premise License, Part 1B of the Licensing Act 2003. This showed how no 'refusal to serve alcohol' reports had been recorded in the 'refusal book'. Additionally, looking at the incident book, the seizure of the 9cm lock knife found underneath the fruit and vegetable stall.

I found this alarming that this had not been recorded in the incident book given the level of violent crime taking place in close proximity to JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, and that a knife had been found hidden within the property of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, of which police officers had requested CCTV for. Additionally, when walking to the back of the store, a door leading to back room was open and a male was observed making food. The room had sofas and cooking facilities in and the male was asked whether he was an employee of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. The male replied NO. The male was then observed leaving JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. Once BLIGHT had arrived it transpired that BLIGHT was the son of Employee One (1) however Employee One (1) had not informed me that the 'manager' was his son. BLIGHT appeared flustered, worried and concerned. I observed FIGUEIREDO ask BLIGHT, 'WHY DO YOU LOOK SO WORRIED?' To this, BLIGHT has replied that he had just woken up. BLIGHT was asked to show PC [REDACTED], FIGUEIREDO and myself the CCTV from the 08 JULY 2021. BLIGHT has led myself and PC [REDACTED] and FIGUEIREDO to the back of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and as turned LEFT into the back room with the CCTV viewing systems in, BLIGHT has shut the door of the room where the male was found with the sofas, cooking facilities. I felt this was slightly suspicious and it felt that BLIGHT did not want us to see the backroom. When asked about the male who was found cooking in the same room, BLIGHT has stated that he was an employee. This was odd as the male had told us only moments before that he was not an employee. When BLIGHT loaded up the CCTV for 08 JULY 2021, the files for the footage recorded prior to 1545hrs on 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 had been removed. BLIGHT stated that he believed this was a fault in the system and that as the footage is only kept for a 14 day cycle, and after the 14 days elapses the entire footage is deleted automatically, and then starts again afresh. However this is not correct. CCTV is kept on the hard drive for 14 days. The footage furthest back is systematically deleted as time progresses. This then allows new footage to be recorded as time progresses. We were viewing CCTV recorded on the 8<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021. That is well within the 14 day time frame as we were viewing the CCTV seven days after the 8<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021. Thus, the footage would not have been deleted automatically. Additionally, there was footage recorded and saved from the 8<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021, but only after 1545hrs. The system would not delete footage at a randomized time during the recording. As both myself and FIGUEIREDO explained this to BLIGHT, BLIGHT became increasingly worried and concerned and to a degree, argumentative and defensive. To confirm whether or not the CCTV was malfunctioning, I observed FIGUEIREDO ask BLIGHT to show CCTV footage from 15<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 at approx. 1200hrs. BLIGHT was able to do this, and the footage was shown with no technical fault. FIGUEIREDO asked BLIGHT to show CCTV footage from the 10<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021. BLIGHT was able to do this with no technical fault or difficulty. I observed BLIGHT becoming increasingly worried, shown through his facial expressions and mannerisms. FIGUEIREDO asked BLIGHT to show CCTV footage from 09<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021, BLIGHT was able to do this with no technical fault or difficulty. FIGUEIREDO asked BLIGHT to show CCTV footage from 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 from 1500hrs. However, as BLIGHT selected the CCTV, the footage kept on bouncing forward to 1545hrs. The exact time PC [REDACTED] found and seized the 9 cm lock knife from the fruit and veg stall. I became very alarmed that the footage had been deleted manually, as the CCTV was working with no errors or fault on all the other times and dates asked. BLIGHT was asked to play the footage from 1545hrs and I observed on the CCTV at 1545hrs employee one (1) walking from the front to the back of the store in the direction of the store room that holds the CCTV viewing systems. The CCTV footage captures employee one (1) approx. 5 minutes later reappear from the rear store room that holds the CCTV viewing system, returning back into the main shop floor. BLIGHT was asked to fast forward the CCTV and it is observed on CCTV an IC3 male arrive at the front of the JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. The IC3 male is wearing a BLACK top with WHITE LOGO stretching across the front. The IC3 male matched the descriptions of the drug dealers provided by informants. This alarmed me. Employee one (1) is observed exiting JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE

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Continuation of Statement of: PC [REDACTED] WINE, and fist pumping the IC3 male. Both are observed on CCTV to engage in friendly conversation for a number of minutes before the IC3 male walks away down STATION PARADE in the direction of LENNON RD. The actions of 'fist pumping' and engaging in conversation indicates that both know each other and have a friendly relationship. This concerns and alarms me, from a policing perspective. BLIGHT had become noticeable nervous and flustered during the CCTV viewing and continued to make mistakes when typing in the dates and recalling the CCTV. BLIGHT did not appear to understand the seriousness of the situation, the seriousness of deleting CCTV footage. I explained to BLIGHT that a knife had been found hidden on his, as he titled himself the manager, property and how the CCTV had been deleted. I also informed BLIGHT that several knife fights had taken place outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and how drug users had increased their presence outside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. When asked to download the CCTV footage (1545hrs to 1800hrs on 08 JULY 2021) BLIGHT stated that he did not have any CD's to burn the footage onto. BLIGHT directly asked myself to supply him with the empty CD's and appeared to take no responsibility despite being the manager of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, and being the only employee to know how to use the CCTV viewing systems. When informed how serious this was, BLIGHT agreed to provide the required CCTV footage. After consulting PS [REDACTED] I warned Employee One (1) that if he deleted CCTV footage again, he would be arrested for perverting the course of justice and destroying evidence, however as I was issuing this formal warning, it appeared that Employee One (1) did not appear to understand the seriousness of what I was saying. Employee One (1) however did state to me as I was leaving JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, that the males who are seen loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE have attempted to hide drugs within JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE.

On 19th JULY 2021 I have visited JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE to collect the CCTV footage, as requested on the 15th JULY 2021. When I asked for the footage to Employee three (3) of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, I was provided a CD dated 14 JULY 2021. However I had asked BLIGHT to provide footage from the 08th JULY 2021 between 1545 and 1800hrs. I went back to Employee three (3) and explained that this was the wrong footage, however the employee appeared to have no knowledge of the footage from the 08th JULY 2021. I observed employee three (3) contacting BLIGHT on the telephone and both spoke in a language I did not understand. The telephone was handed to me and BLIGHT confirmed if I wanted the footage taken from the 08th JULY 2021. I confirmed this and Employee three (3) handed me a memory stick which allegedly had CCTV taken from the 08th JULY 2021 between 1545hrs and 1800hrs. BLIGHT informed me that I had to hand the memory stick back. When I got back to KILBURN POLICE STATION, I viewed the footage from the memory stick using a CCTV viewing laptop. However, the memory stick only contained footage taken from 08th JULY 2021 between 1545hrs and 1645hrs. This was concerning as the footage between 1645hrs and 1800hrs showed Employee One (1) 'fist pumping' an IC3 male suspected to be involved in drug supply. This concerned me. I was even more alarmed because the IC3 male who 'fist pumped' Employee One (1) had the same appearance and clothing to an IC3 male who was arrested on 14th JULY 2021, CAD 4837/14JUL21. I wanted to view the footage to ascertain whether or not the two males were in fact the same male, however due to BLIGHT purposefully not providing this footage I was unable to do so. BLIGHTS actions of not providing police with the full footage as requested has led me to suspect BLIGHT was aware that the IC3 male is concerned with drug supply and weapons, and thus did not want police to have footage of his father, Employee One (1) engaging in friendly conversation and 'fist pumping'. As I have stated before, the actions of 'fist pumping' and engaging in conversation reflects a friendly relationship, and this I believe is why BLIGHT purposefully not provided police with the full CCTV footage. By BLIGHT not providing police with the full footage has disallowed me to confirm whether or not the two (2) Witness Signature: [REDACTED]

males are the same male. Given that the IC3 male had been involved in an incident on the 14<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 involving knives, I wanted to determine whether or not the IC3 male was at JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE on 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021, and who potentially may have had involvement in concealing the 9cm lock knife found concealed in the storage space of the fruit and vegetable stall belonging to JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE.

As a police officer, I am very concerned with this new information, combined with all the information I have provided in this statement. Employee One (1) who later was identified as BLIGHTS father provided police officers contrasting information on several occasions and was captured on CCTV acting suspiciously with identified drug dealers and drug users. I am concerned that JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE are working with these individuals and allowing and facilitating drug deals to take place in and around JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, and also to allow for weapons to be concealed within JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE property. It is of my belief that that Employee one (1) has, when alerted by PC [REDACTED] that a knife had been found underneath the fruit and vegetable stall, gone to the back of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and deleted all CCTV footage prior to 1545hrs on 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021. This is why I warned Employee One (1) that he could have been arrested. I too am concerned with the relationship Employee One (1) has with the known drug users and dealers who have been seen on numerous times to outside and inside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. My concerns are elevated due to the reluctance of the employees to assist police officers when asking to view CCTV and I am alarmed by the behaviour of all of the JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE employees, including Employee One (1) and BLIGHT.

My concerns are increased following reports of a knife fight taking place directly outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE only hours after myself and PC [REDACTED] left JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE on 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 and even more so after I conducted checks on the police system which showed how JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE had no involvement in reporting the incident to police. I am alarmed that on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2021 at approx. 1540hrs four (4) males were observed fighting with a nine (9) inch knife outside WILLESDEN GREEN TRAIN STATION. After checking police systems, despite taking place opposite JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, there was no evidence of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE reporting this incident to police. The CAD for this incident is 4837/14JUL21. I am further alarmed that after reviewing the crime report, the individuals who were involved in the knife fight that started on STATION PARADE are known for various drug offences including possession of Class B with intent to supply.

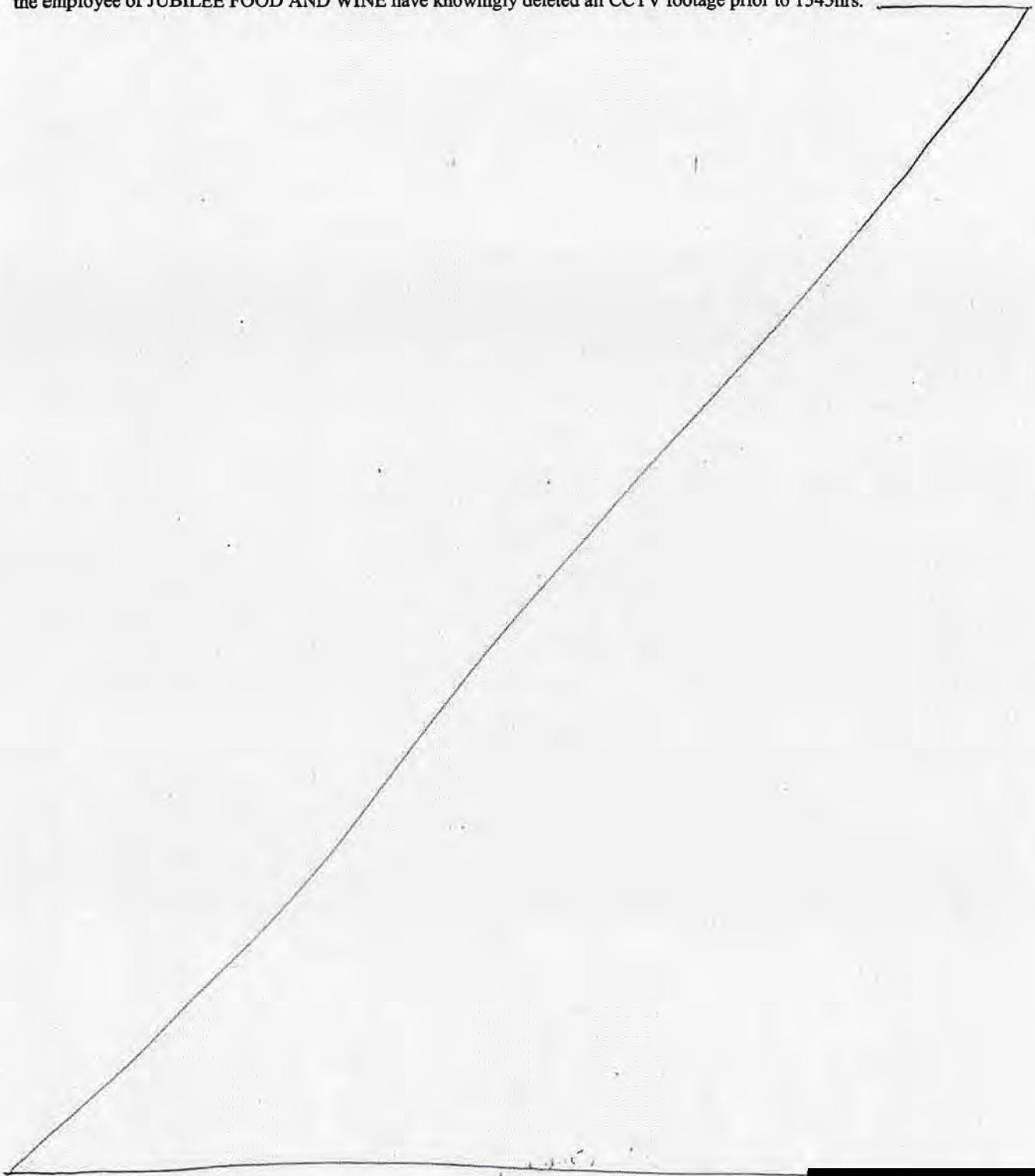
To conclude my statement I would like to state my beliefs. I believe that the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE are knowingly allowing drug dealing to take place both in and around JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I believe that the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE are actively assisting individuals with extensive criminal histories to conceal and store both weapons and drugs in and around JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I believe that the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE are actively refusing to assist police officers in criminal investigations, this shown through not only the reluctance to provide vital CCTV footage but also actively deleting CCTV footage that could aid criminal investigations. I believe the increase in drug users and weapon related offences are connected with the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE as a result of the collaborative relationship between the employees and with the known drug dealers seen loitering outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I also believe that specifically on the 08<sup>th</sup> JULY 2021 the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE have observed the knife seized by PC [REDACTED] being concealed underneath the fruit and vegetable stall. This is because the window located on the shop front allows one to have a direct view of the fruit and vegetable stall from inside of JUBILEE STALL, when standing behind the counter (and tills). And this is where the employee of JUBILEE

FOOD AND WINE stand when serving customers. I believe that the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE have had an involvement with the concealing with the knife and knowingly allowed the knife to be concealed. This is why I believe the employee of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE have knowingly deleted all CCTV footage prior to 1545hrs.

This statement relates to JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE at 20 Station Parade NW2 4NH.

I am the local designated ward officer for Willesden SNT. I have been a police officer since 2013, and I have been posted at Willesden SNT since 2017.

JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE is located on the MAPESBURY WARD. I'd describe JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE as a Grocery shop. There is a single entry point for customers from STATION PARADE. There is a fruit and veg stand situated at the front of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. There is multiple CCTV that cover inside and its surrounding. The CCTV office is located at the rear of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. Also located at the rear of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE is the shops stock room.

I was approached in April 2021 by an untested source, who informed me that drug dealers were operating outside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, and that the owners of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE were knowingly allowing the drug dealers to hide drugs underneath the fruit and veg stand, at the front of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. In June 2021 a second untested source has contacted police making identical claims. It does not appear that either source knows one another.

On 8th July 2021 at approx 1542hrs I was on duty in full uniform, on foot patrol with PC [redacted] and PCSO [redacted] I was walking in the direction of STATION PARADE from WALM LANE. As I have merged onto STATION

PARADE I have seen a white male, who I later learned to be [redacted] and a black male, who I later learned to be [redacted] loitering on the pavement beside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. Upon noticing my presence [redacted] has immediately darted into JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. This caused me to lose sight of [redacted]. [redacted] remained where he was. Based on [redacted] behaviour upon seeing me, and the previous intelligence received, I suspected he had entered JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE to hide drugs. I entered JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE approx ten seconds after [redacted] had entered. Inside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE was another unknown customer, [redacted] and two employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I detained [redacted] (or a Section 23 MDA stop and search.) [redacted] was escorted out of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, so that the search could be executed. No drugs were found on person. After the search was completed I conducted a search of the fruit and veg stall directly in front of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I discovered a LOCK KNIFE hidden under the fruit and veg stall. I could see the CCTV from JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE was pointing directly at the fruit and veg stall. I entered the JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and informed the male employee, who I will refer to as employee one, that I needed to view the CCTV. Upon making the request I could hear [redacted] becoming vocally resistant to my colleagues standing outside. I waked back outside to [redacted] to speak with him. I was with [redacted] outside for approx 3 minutes before I walked back into JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. Upon re-entering into JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE employee one was not on the shop floor. Behind the counter was another male employee, who I will refer to as employee two. I enquired with employee two about CCTV once again. I waited on the shop floor for approx 2 minutes until employee one reappeared from the back room. Employee one was coming from the direction where the JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE CCTV office was located. I asked employee one if CCTV was available, who replied "YES". Employee one then instructed employee two to escort myself to the CCTV office. Employee two then escorted me to the CCTV office, located at the rear of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE. I have entered the CCTV office with employee two. Employee two has shown me that CCTV wasn't working, and hadn't captured any footage. I was immediately dubious that CCTV hadn't been working, as employee one had disappeared for approx 5 minutes into the back room where the CCTV office was located for seemingly no apparent reason. I suspected that the CCTV had been deleted by employee one whilst I was on Station Parade conversing with [redacted]. The Lock Knife was seized by myself, and my Body worn footage captured the incident. Both [redacted] and [redacted] left Station Parade prior to myself and PC [redacted] leaving.

On 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021 I was in full uniform, with PC [redacted] conducting a joint patrol with Susana FIGUEIREDO

from the Brent Council Licensing team. At approx 1330hrs I attended JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE and spoke with employee one. I asked employee one if I could view CCTV once again. Employee one has refused to allow me to view CCTV. At this point FIGUEIREDO has stepped in and identified herself and informed employee one that he was required to show CCTV, as directed by their License agreement. Employee one has then claimed he cannot access CCTV, and he will have to contact his son (the owner of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE) who has access to CCTV. I waited for approx 20 minutes for Nathan BLIGHT (owner) to arrive. Upon arriving at JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE I asked BLIGHT if we could view the CCTV. I informed BLIGHT that allegations had been made that drug dealers were operating in front of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE, and that I wanted to view CCTV from 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 once again. BLIGHT navigated through the CCTV hard drive which showed no CCTV existed before 1545hrs on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021. Coincidentally, my body worn footage shows that I discovered the LOCK KNIFE hidden under the fruit and veg stand at approx 1545hrs on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021. I believe that Employee one deleted the footage of everything prior to 1545hrs, as this would have shown who hid the LOCK KNIFE. I also suspect that ..... discarded drugs inside of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE when he rushed into JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE when he originally saw me approaching on the 8<sup>th</sup> July, as his reaction upon seeing me suggested he was desperate to get out of my line of sight. BLIGHT could not provide a reasonable explanation as to why the footage did not exist prior to 1545hrs. BLIGHT attempted to make a series of claims that the CCTV just happened to start recording at 1545hrs as that time would have marked the end of the 14 days recording life cycle. This was quickly disproved by FIGUEIREDO who correctly pointed out that is not how the hard drive works, it erases footage the furthest back periodically. It does not store footage for 14 days; and then erase everything once that 14 days has expired, and then record 14 days afresh again. BLIGHT was very clearly flustered. BLIGHT became increasingly petulant towards FIGUEIREDO as she pointed out various Licence breaches JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE had committed, to the degree where BLIGHT accused FIGUEIREDO of picking on him, and was also dismissive of any evidence tampering. BLIGHT reaction was not one of horror/disappoint I would expect from an owner when presented with evidence that his employee had been tampering with evidence which jeopardised a criminal investigation. I requested with BLIGHT that he record and provide CCTV footage from 1545hrs on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021 to 1800hrs on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

Based on what I have witnessed, and the information I have received from source intelligence I believe that the employees of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE are actively assisting drug dealers to operate around Station Parade. I believe they are allowing JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE to be used to hide both weapons and drugs. There is a monitor directly in front of

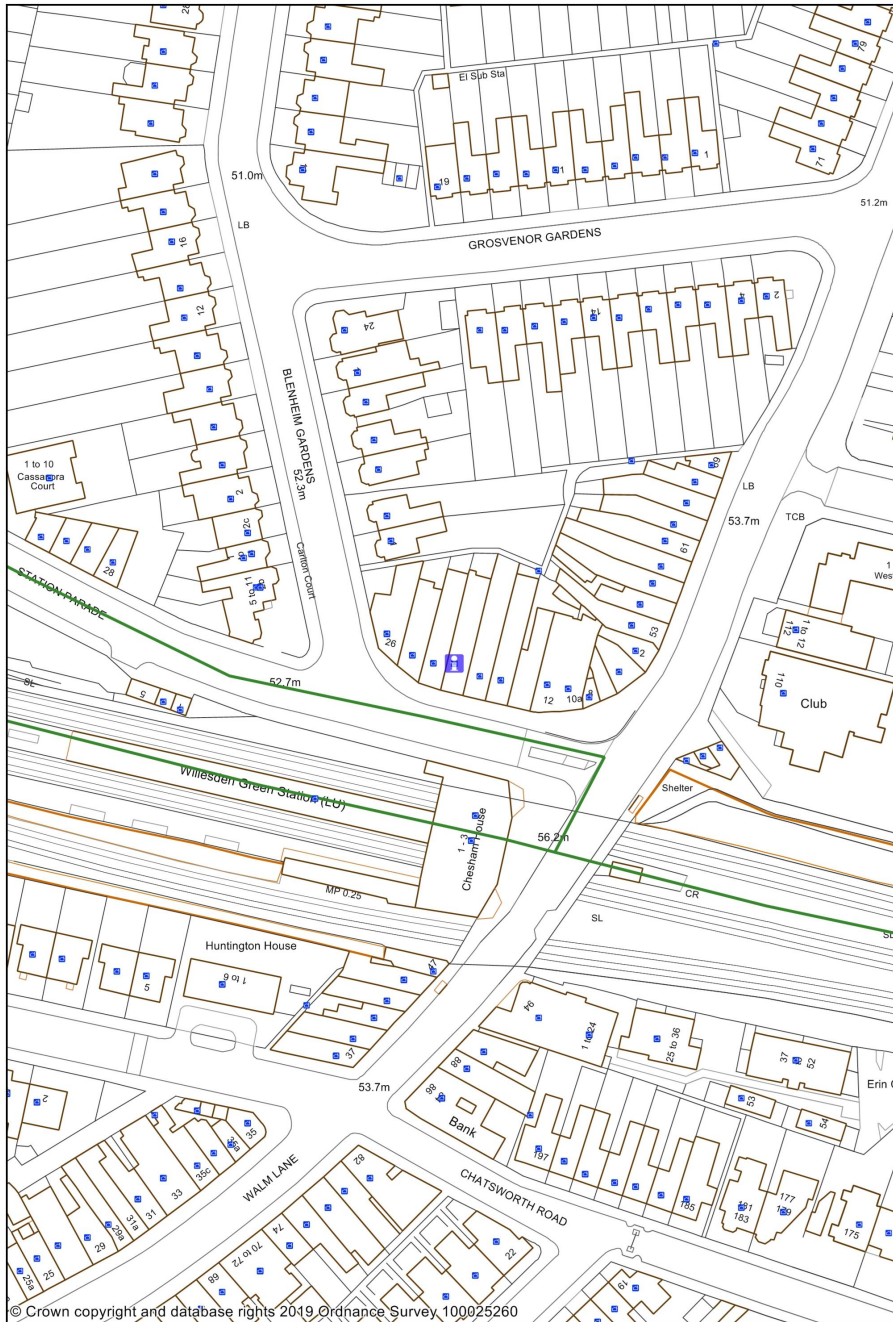

counter, which is maned by JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE employees. This monitor shows CCTV footage of the fruit and veg stall. I struggle to believe that the employees have not witnessed drug dealers hiding items under the fruit and veg stall as they have a view of the fruit and veg stall from both the window and the CCTV monitor. Source intelligence has stated that drug dealing occurs outside JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE regularly, however, upon checking Police CAD system not a single call has come from JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE within the past several months that has reported drug dealing occurring at the front of JUBILEE FOOD AND WINE
