To "6. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked with exception of Lion Stout, Dragon Stout & Guinness".

Remove Condition 8: "No single cans of beers, lagers and ciders shall be sold at the premises."

2. Background

The review of the Statement of Licensing Policy has introduced Cumulative Impact Zones for all new or variation applications for 'Off' licences in the borough.

This application falls within a Cumulative Impact Zone.

The presumption is that any new licence or variation to an existing licence that increases the scope for the sale of alcohol will not be granted unless the applicant can evidence that the licence will not negatively impact on the licensing objectives.

The premises are currently licensed for:

Late Night Refreshment, the Sale of Alcohol and to remain open 24 hours a day Monday to Sunday.

Police representations to Vary a Premises Licence application for 'Malar Cash & Carry, 541-543, High Road, HAO 2DJ.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Council's Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated belo

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to Vary a premises licence under section 34 of the act.

The Police representations are concerned with the Prevention of crime and disorder, Public safety and the prevention of public nuisance of the licensing objectives.

The Application

The application was received by police on the 25/03/2025.

The application is to amend condition 6 from:

"No high strength beers, Lagers and ciders above 6% ABV shall stocked with the exception of Lion Stout (7.5%)"

То

"No high strength Beers, Lagers and Ciders above 6% ABV shall be stocked except for Lion Stout, Dragon Stout & Guinness."

And to remove condition 8: The sale of single cans.

The venue is situated on Harrow Road, Wembley which falls in the CIZ (Cumulative Impact Zone) "Where an application for a new off-licence or for variations to off-licences is received (which would increase the sale of alcohol, including through longer hours), the presumption is that the application will be refused unless the applicant can satisfactorily evidence that their application or variation will not negatively impact on the licensing objectives."

Public Space Protection Order (PSPO)

The entire borough of Brent is covered by a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO). This piece of legislation was introduced to combat the rising level in street crime and ASB, a vast quantity of which is alcohol fuelled. Any new venue asking for the sale of alcohol to be added to its license could inadvertently add to this ongoing issue. Therefore all applications and their conditions need to be closely scrutinized to avoid adding to the crime and ASB on the Brent Borough


The venue in question already have an issue with street drinking and show no regard for the CIZ or the PSPO polices.

During the consultation period I have visited the venue on a number of occasions in the early hours of the morning and have taken the below pictures. The pictures are of the neighbouring premises where a ledge is available for drinkers to place their alcohol as if were in a bar. This particular neighbouring premises also provide shelter from the rain which makes this an ideal place to meet up and drink.








Empty Lager Cans and empty bottle of Vodka.



On the 17/04/2025. I approached the manager of Marla Cash & Carry and pointed out the above to him and reminded him of his obligations under the PSPO to reduce street drinking. His response to me was that they feel intimidated by customers should they be confronted regarding the street drinking.

Should the amendment of condition 6 and the removal of condition 8 be approved this will undermine the licensing objectives and go against Brent Councils policies.

Police strongly appose the variation application. If anything Police feel that the licence should have more stringent conditions to promote the licensing objectives. Such as reducing the hours the venue is permitted to sell alcohol.

Minimum number of cans or bottles to be sold should be no less than four (4) at any one time as this will deter the customers that want to buy a single can or two that will more likely be drank out on the street.

As the applicant wishes to remove the condition of no single cans to be sold and adding extra high strength lagers beers and ciders, this will just add to the street drinking in an area that is already flooded with street drinking. Especially as the weather gets warmer in the coming months.

Crime Ref: 01/982248/24 on the 20/10/2024 at 04:28hrs.

Reports of ASB and Common assault.

Police have spoken to the victim in length about this incident and what has happened. Ranjeet has explained that this is a continuing Anti-Social Behaviour that has taken place outside of the shop where males are consuming NOS Canisters, Khat Tobacco and alcohol outside of the shop whereby they are becoming aggressive

The above report is just one of many ASB incidents that have been reported in and around the area. I just want to highlight that even staff at the venue have acknowledged that the venue is attracting ASB where they congregate outside and consume alcohol. This alcohol is purchased from Marla Cash and Carry as evidenced in the above pictures

Marla Cash & Carry have been previously issued a warning letter for breach of the conditions of their licence and street drinking. This will be sent in supplementary documents.

Again police strongly appose the Variation Application.

Licensing Representation – Application to vary the premises licence Malar Cash & Carry, 541-543 High Road, HA0 2DJ (Premises licence number: 175105)

The above application has been made pursuant to section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

I confirm that I am the delegated officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the abovementioned premises is situated, and authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003.

I have carefully reviewed the above application, and wish to make a representation on the grounds that, if granted in full, it may undermine one of the four licensing objectives below:

- the prevention of crime and disorder.
- public safety.
- the prevention of public nuisance.
- the protection of children from harm.

Licensing History

The premises licence is held by Kandasamy Manimaran in an individual capacity. He has been both the premises licence holder and the designated premises supervisor since the initial grant in March 2006.

Complaints

The Licensing Authority is aware of the following incident:

On 4 October 2022, the premises failed a test purchase operation carried out by the Metropolitan Police, during which alcohol was sold to a person under 18. A Fixed Penalty Notice was issued to the seller on the same day. Prior to this, on 12 September 2022, the Licensing Authority had also conducted an inspection at the premises and a number of compliance issues were found.

Following on from this, a meeting was held on 2 November 2022 at Brent Civic Centre between Mr Manimaran, the Licensing Authority (Esther Chan, Licensing Enforcement Officer), and the Metropolitan Police (Wembley Town Centre Police Team). A warning letter was subsequently issued to Mr Manimaran, outlining the outstanding issues and what steps he would need to take to resolve these concerns.

It was agreed that no further enforcement action would be taken, if Mr Manimaran submitted an application to vary the premises licence. Mr Manimaran consequently submitted an application as requested shortly afterwards.

Operating Schedule

The current premises permits the following licensable activities and opening hours:

Late night refreshment (on and off the premises): Monday to Sunday, 23:00 - 00:00 The supply of alcohol (off the premises): Monday to Sunday, 00:00 - 00:00 (24 hours) The opening hours: Monday to Sunday, 00:00 - 00:00 (24 hours)

Proposed Variation

The application proposes the following changes to the Annex Two Conditions:

Amend Condition 6:

From "6. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked with exception of Lion Stout (7.5%)."

To "6. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked with exception of Lion Stout, Dragon Stout & Guinness".

Remove Condition 8:

"No single cans of beers, lagers and ciders shall be sold at the premises."

Cumulative Impact Zone (CIZ)

In 2022, Brent Council retained its Cumulative Impact Zones (CIZs) in specified areas, as outlined in the current Statement of Licensing Policy (2025 – 2023), following a review of crime data and alcohol-related incidents.

Cumulative impact refers to the pressure placed on local services and public spaces by a high concentration of licenced premises. Evidence shows a strong link between the density of off-licences and alcohol-led anti-social behaviour. The purpose of the CIZs is to address ongoing issues such as crime, disorder, and anti-social behaviour stemming from street drinking.

The CIZ policy establishes a rebuttable presumption that applications which seek to increase the availability of alcohol, including variations to existing premises licences, will be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate that the proposed changes will not add to the cumulative impact in the local area.

Further details on the Council's CIZ policy can be found in 'Appendix 6: Cumulative Impact Zones' (page 50 – 65) within the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.


Wembley Central

The High Road in Wembley falls within the Wembley Central CIZ. Brent Council's Statement of Licensing Policy describes this area as having low to medium levels of deprivation and is considered a hotspot for alcohol related calls to the Police relating to crime and anti-social behaviour.

Between July 2019 and June 2022, there were:

- 204 reports to the Police
- 118 related to anti-social behaviour
- 39 related to public order offences
- 18 related to robbery
- 104 categorised as violent/sexual offences.

The below image, available on pages 59 of Brent Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, provides an overview of crime locations within this area.



Public Space Protection Order (PSPO)

The entire Borough of Brent is subject to a Public Space Protection Order for street drinking, and it is an offence if a person to fails to comply with a request to cease drinking alcohol by an authorised officer.

If a police officer reasonably believes that a person is, or has been, consuming intoxicating liquor within these areas, the officer may require the person concerned:

- a) not to consume in that place anything which is, or which the officer reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor
- b) to surrender anything in his/her possession which is, or which the officer reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor or a container for such liquor (other than a sealed container)
- c) An officer may dispose of anything surrendered to him/her as above.
- d) Issue fixed penalty notices on offenders

e) Prosecute persistent offenders

While the PSPO provides enforcement tools, the availability of the police and council resources limits day-to-day enforcement. As such, there is a greater responsibility on off-licence premises not to contribute to street drinking. Without the sale of alcohol from off-licences, the prevalence of street drinking would likely decline.

Location

The premises is situated on the ground floor of a commercial unit at 541 - 543 High Road, Wembley, HA0 2DJ. It forms part of a busy parade of shops which sit beneath a residential block in a high-footfall area.



Summary

The Licensing Authority has no objection to the proposed amendment to Condition 6 to include Dragon Stout and Guiness alongside Lion Stout. This is a minor adjustment to an otherwise robust condition and is unlikely to negatively affect the licensing objectives.

However, the Licensing Authority objects to the proposed removal of Condition 8, which prohibits the sale of single cans of beer, lager, and cider. The availability of single cans could facilitate further street drinking and contribute to crime and disorder within the local area. As such, removing this condition could risk undermining the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder and may be detrimental to the aims that the CIZ policy was introduced to mitigate.

Beyond commercial considerations, the applicant has not provided sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the removal of this condition will not add to the cumulative impact in the local area. Therefore, the Licensing Authority respectfully requests that the Licensing Sub-Committee refuse the proposed removal of Condition 8.

Should the applicant agree to retain Condition 8, the Licensing Authority would be willing to withdraw this representation and permit the proposed amendment to Condition 6.

Licensing Act 2003 – Breach of Premise Licence Re: Malar Cash & Carry, 543 High Road, Wembley, HA0 2DJ

I am writing to confirm our meeting on Thursday 27th October 2022 at Brent Civic Centre in the presence of Sergeant Michael Sullivan and PC John Inglesant from the Wembley Town Centre Police Team.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss our investigation concerning the sale of a bottle of alcoholic drink (WKD Blue Original) by a member of your staff at Malar Cash & Carry, 543 High Road, Wembley, HA0 2DJ on Tuesday 4th October 2022 to a person under the age of 18 years old.

The sale of alcohol to persons under 18 years old is prohibited under the Licensing Act 2003. The penalty for infringing this legislation is an unlimited fine. Your member of staff was issued with a penalty notice of £90 by the Police.

Following our meeting, I have given this case careful consideration, and decided that on this occasion, we will not institute legal proceedings against you or review the premise licence on the grounds that you submit a <u>full variation application</u> by Thursday 24th November 2022 to propose the following:
