Carlton Lounge (Tiger Bay) 232 - 234 Kingsbury Road, London, NW9 0BH, is a restaurant, night club, and Shisha bar, the premises benefits a Premises Licence for the following licensable activities and hours.

The Premises Licence Holder, (PLH) is a registered company called Carlton Lounge (UK) Ltd, the company director is Mr Thavatheva Thevarajah also known as 'Tavi Thevarajah', who is also the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). Mr Thevarajah has been responsible for the Premises Licence since 29th May 2008.

On Sunday, 18th May 2025, at 03:31 hours Police were contacted by the London Ambulance Service (LAS) to a male that had been taken to hospital with a stab wound, and in a critical condition, it was then established that a fight at the Carlton Lounge (Tiger Bay) 232 - 234 Kingsbury Road, London, NW9 0BH, a fight started inside the venue, SIA door staff ejected both groups of males who continued fighting across the road from the venue, which resulted in people using weapons and a male being stabbed, resulting in the male later losing his life to his injuries.

Police opened a murder investigation, and a crime scene closing Kingsbury High Road, outside the venue, and surrounding roads were cordoned off.

What has so far been established is that no one from the venue called Police, the SIA appear to have removed the fighting groups from inside the premises, and made little to no attempt to take control of the incident that then escalated outside.

The following failings have been noted:

- 1) Police were called at 03:31 hours on Sunday 18th May 2025 by LAS which had in turn received a 999 call from a man reporting a stabbing at Tiger Bay. On police and medic arrival, no casualty was present. At 03:40 police had a call from a nurse at Northwick Park Hospital to report a man had come in with stab wounds.
- 2) CCTV shows a large-scale disorder immediately outside the venue from about 03:25 to 03:30, during which the victim received a stab wound and collapsed at the scene. He was taken to hospital by other people, before emergency services arrived. Estimated 20-25 people involved in the disorder.
- 3) There was no call from the venue staff or management to reports of the disorder, or anything else. Staff were present and witnessing events, and security personnel were involved in the disorder, in apparent attempts to separate people.
- 4) The suspect can be seen entering the venue at 02:00am, with others. There is no search of any of them, frisk, metal detector, wand or otherwise.
- 5) The suspect is later seen outside with a large knife, which was used in the disorder and appears to have been used to stab the victim, ultimately killing him (subject to pathology confirmation on cause of death).
- 6) Appears likely that the knife was in the suspect's possession inside the venue.
- 7) Police body worn video (BWV) shows a manager telling an attending CID officer that the groups involved in the disorder had not been inside Tiger Bay before the disorder. This was untrue, as they had been and indeed most, if not all, of the people had come from inside Tiger Bay, some having been specifically ejected by the staff/security.
- 8) Police BWV shows the manager saying he thinks a bottle/bottles were involved. A customer approaches and says a knife was used and had been pulled out inside the venue. He was promptly ushered away by another manager/member of staff.
- 9) House to house enquiries revealed local residents complain there is frequently noisy anti-social behaviour from the venue.

Summary

This incident on 18 May 2025, constitutes serious crime and disorder, which has triggered this review. The Metropolitan Police have serious concerns that the premises management and staff members demonstrated a lack of control and failing to undertake pro-active searches. The staff initially indicated that the incident did not start in the venue and later retracted their statement, admitting that both groups were in fact inside the venue, where the altercation started.

Due to the ongoing criminal investigation, it is currently difficult to establish the full facts from a licensing perspective. However, from the information we have gathered so far, the Police have that the aforementioned points above demonstrate that the licensing objectives are not being upheld.

Police Recommendation – The Police request an immediate suspension of Carlton Lounge's premises licence pending a full review due the level of seriousness of the incident.

Representation in support of the application to review the premises licence for Carlton Lounge (Tiger Bay), 232-234 Kingsbury Road, NW9 0BH (Premises licence number: 362998).

The above-mentioned application has been made under section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003.

As the delegated officer of the Licensing Authority, acting as a defined 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003, I confirm my representation in support of the application submitted by Metropolitan Police Service.

This representation is made on the grounds that the continued operation of this premises licence, without further intervention, could undermine one out of the four below licensing objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder.
- Public safety.
- The prevention of public nuisance.
- The protection of children from harm.

Licence History

The current premises licence is held by a limited company, namely, Carlton Lounge (UK) Limited. The sole listed director of the company is Thavatheva Thevarajah. Carlton Lounge (UK) Limited has held the premises licence since June 2016. Thavatheva Thevarajah is also the designated premises supervisor and has held that position since July 2013.

The premises licence was subject to a review hearing on 26 June 2014 following an application made by the Metropolitan Police Service. The review was sought on the grounds that all four licensing objectives were being undermined. The Licensing Sub-Committee subsequently agreed to adjourn the meeting on the condition that the premises implemented an effective action plan to improve management, including staff training and building improvements.

The Licensing Authority acknowledges that this review hearing took place over 10 years ago and is therefore of limited relevance to the current review application.

On 8 August 2024, an application to vary the premises licence was submitted to the Licensing Authority. The application sought to extend all licensable activities by one hour and to amend the condition relating to last entry, proposing an extension to 01:30 from Sunday to Thursday and to 02:30 on Fridays and Saturdays. A representation was initially made by the Licensing Authority; however, this was subsequently withdrawn following agreement on amended conditions prior to a Licensing Sub-Committee hearing.

A further minor variation application was submitted on 11 October 2024, seeking to amend the last entry times to 02:30 from Sunday to Thursday, and to 03:30 on Fridays and Saturdays.

Summary

The Licensing Authority supports the Metropolitan Police Service's application for a summary review of the premises licence, following the tragic incident on 18 May 2025 in which a man lost his life. A review under section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 is reserved for only the most serious cases involving crime and disorder, and the events of that night clearly meet this threshold. Both the victim and the suspect are believed to have been inside the premises prior to the incident.

It is accepted that premises cannot be held responsible for the actions of every individual customer. Nonethless, there are significant concerns about how the premises was being managed and the extent to which it failed to uphold the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder on the evening in question.

The Licensing Authority notes the following concerns raised in the Police's review application:

- Approximately 20–25 individuals were involved in the disorder.
- Security and staff were present and witnessed the events, yet no call was made to emergency services.
- CCTV shows the suspect entering the premises at 02:00. There is no evidence of any search or frisk being conducted. It is alleged that a large knife was in the suspect's possession whilst inside the premises.
- The suspect is later seen outside with a large knife, which was reportedly used to fatally wound the victim.
- Initial statements by management to attending Police Officers denied any altercation inside the premises. This was later retracted, with staff acknowledging that the individuals involved had in fact been inside and some were even ejected.
- A customer informed Police Officers that a knife had been pulled inside the premises. He
 was allegedly ushered away by staff.
- Local residents have reported concerns anti-social behaviour linked to the premises.

These issues point to a clear failure in management and alludes to a possible problematic operating culture on the night of the incident in which staff underestimated the seriousness of the incident that had unfolded. While it is acknowledged that the premises were not under a legal obligation to conduct searches of customers, the absence of any proactive measures to mitigate against such a risk, especially given the late hour, demonstrates poor judgement at best, and a clear disregard for the promotion of the licensing objectives at worst.

In addition to this, staff interactions with emergency services on that evening also raise further concern. Failing to notify the police of major disorder, initially misleading officers about the events, and the instance of ushering a member of the public who claimed that a knife had been pulled inside the premises before being ushered away by other staff – all represent a complete failure in how to deal with emergency responders and show a complete inability to act appropriately in a critical situation.

The Licensing Authority refers the Licensing Sub-Committee to paragraph 11.23 of the Section 182 Guidance, which advises where premises are found to be trading irresponsibly, the Licensing Sub-Committee should not hesitate, where appropriate to do so, to take tough action to tackle the problems at the premises and, where other measures might be deemed insufficient, to revoke the premises licence.

While the Police have not explicitly requested revocation, the Licensing Authority recommends that the Sub-Committee give serious consideration to this option. If the Sub-Committee does not consider revocation to be a proportionate or necessary course of action, it is the view of the Licensing Authority that a number of robust conditions should be imposed. These conditions should go beyond the interim steps already taken and be aimed at preventing a recurrence of the failings identified. A list of proposed conditions recommended by the Licensing Authority can be found at the rear of this representation. In addition, the Licensing Authority also invites the Sub-Committee to consider bringing forward the terminal hour for all licensable activities.

- 1. The CCTV system shall be capable of capturing clear images of all patrons entering and exiting the premises. Additional CCTV cameras shall cover all publicly accessible internal and external areas, as outlined on the premises plan. A further CCTV camera shall be installed to monitor the immediate frontage of the premises on Kingsbury Road. [Additional]
- 2. A member of staff who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall always be available at the premises whilst the premises are open to the public. CCTV footage shall be made available for immediate viewing upon request by the Police and any authorised Officers from Brent Council. [Additional]
- 3. CCTV footage shall be provided immediately upon request by Police and any authorised Officers from Brent Council, in a readily accessible format on removable media (I.e., USB, hard drive, CD etc..) or via digital transfer.

[To replace Annex Two, Condition 2]

- 4. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request by an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which shall record the following:
- a. any incidents of crime and disorder.
- b. any ejections from the premises.
- c. any complaints received.
- d. any faults in the CCTV system.
- e. any seizures of drugs or offensive weapon.
- f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

5. Any entries into the log shall be made as soon as reasonably possible after any incident and shall contain the time/date of the incident, the nature of the incident, a description of the people involved, the action taken and details of the person responsible for the management of the premises at the time of the incident.

- 6. There shall be no entry to the premises by patrons after 00:30 on Sunday to Thursday and after 01:30 on Friday and Saturday. Re-entry to the premises shall not be permitted to any patron after these times. [To Replace Annex Two, Condition 11]
- 7. A personal licence holder from senior management shall be always present whilst the premises are undertaking licensable activities. [Additional]
- 8. An ID scanning system shall be in operation from 21:00 each day. All individuals entering the premises via either the Tiger Bay or Carlton Lounge entrance must present verifiable I.D, which shall be scanned and recorded on the system prior to entry. [Additional]
- 9. The premises licence holder shall undertake a written search policy as a preventative measure to negate patrons from bringing in any illicit drugs, weapons, or any other unlawful item onto the premises. Such measures shall include the use of a detection wand after 21:00.

10. Notices shall be conspicuously displayed at the entrance notifying patrons that the premises reserves the right to undertake searches upon entry to the premises and that the premises has a "no weapons policy". [Additional]

11. A log shall be kept of the SIA door supervisors working on any night to include their full name, date of birth, Security Industry Authority licence number, company and booking on-off times. A copy of SIA door supervisor log shall be available upon request by Police and authorised officers from Brent Council.

12. All staff involved in licensable activities shall receive training relevant to their role. Refresher training shall be provided at least every 12 months. Training shall include, but not be limited to, the following topics:

- a. Age verification policy
- b. CCTV operation (If deemed appropriate by management)
- c. Conflict management
- d. Operating procedures
- e. Permitted hours and relevant conditions
- f. Responding to emergency situations


I am employed as the Principal Nuisance Control Officer for the Nuisance Control Team (NCT) at the London Borough of Brent. NCT are a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003. We are supporting the Metropolitan Police' Premises License Review application because evidence held on our records demonstrates the premises is failing in its duty to uphold relevant noise-controlling conditions in place to prevent public nuisance. NCT have two Music Noise cases on our premises reporting database: NC/08126/19 and NC/08440/21. We also have four Brent Noise App cases from separate households which include noise recordings and comments from the residents. The venue holds a Premises Licence (PL No.362998), wherein *Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule*, include:

- 15. No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.
- 16. The relevant areas where regulated entertainment or making music takes place shall be adequately sound proofed to prevent noise breakout.

A copy of the Premises Licence Part A is **exhibited at MW/01.** There is presently no Statutory Noise Nuisance Abatement Notice in force against the premises. Such a Notice was served July 2019, prohibiting statutory nuisance from loud amplified music

and speech. A copy of that Notice along with covering letter is Exhibit MW/02. The Notice was not subject to appeal. In August 2022, following a noise complaint investigation where at 22.40hrs an annoying level of loud music was noted in the complainant's bedroom, compromising reasonable enjoyment and making sleep impossible. The NCT officer visited the premises and spoke to the manager in an advisory capacity. In Sept 2022, we wrote to the premises per Exhibit MW/03, formally withdrawing the 2019 Notice due to a limitation in its scope. A revised Notice was served (also Exhibit MW/03). In the accompanying covering letter, we reminded the manager and the business of Condition 15 to Annex 2 of the Premises Licence. A formal appeal was lodged against that Notice. Exhibit MW/04 is a letter dated October 2022 formally withdrawing the Notice following a volume setting exercise with the business and commitment from the same to prevent public nuisance from regulated entertainment by adhering to relevant conditions on the Premises Licence. Case record NC/08126/19 contains a Nuisance Investigatory Visit 18 September 2021 where NCT officer noted: Visit made to premises. Montitired from lay-by adjacent to premises. Witnessed people entering (after permitted entry/ re-entry time) - both restaurant & shisha lounge. Music clearly heard. Exhibit MW/05 is a letter dated 29 September 2021 to the premises referring to Nuisance Investigatory Visits and drawing reference to condition 15 of the Premises Licence. A Nuisance Investigatory Visit 05 March 2022 noted: Visit made to rear of the premises. Could hear music coming from the shisha area, considerably loud & likely to be heard within the flats. Exhibit MW/06 is an email thread dated September 2022. The email dated 14 September is authored by a Licensing Compliance Officer for the attention of the manager Prash Theva, wherein is referenced a meeting and discussion at the premises. During that meeting the Licensing Compliance Officer and NCT Officer identified two conditions (the conditions 15 and 16) that the premises would have difficulty complying with in its current style of operation and making clear those need to be addressed as a matter of urgency to avoid the risk of enforcement intervention or formal review of Premises Licence. Below is a table summarising the four Noise App cases from separate households, which are also exhibited. NCT contend that these demonstrate the premises has historically and continues to fail in its duty to meet those conditions and thereby prevent public nuisance.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a)games or other activities which require or encourage,
- or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

- 1.A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2.For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a)—duty|| is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b)—permitted price|| is the price found by applying the formula—

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

where—

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c)—relevant person|| means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i)the holder of the premises licence,

(ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) —relevant person

 means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any
 member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the
 supply in question; and
- (e)—valued added tax∥ means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3.Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day||) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day||) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax.
- (2)The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a)at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b)at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

TAKE NOTICE that under the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 the Council of the London Borough of Brent being satisfied of the likely occurrence of noise amounting to a statutory nuisance under section 79(1)(g) of that Act at the premises known as neighbouring residential units at Mead Court behind Carlton Lounge, 232-234 Kingsbury Road, London, NW9 0BH within the district of the said Council arising from the playing of amplified music and amplified speech.

HEREBY REQUIRE YOU as the person responsible of the premises from which the noise is or would be emitted forthwith from the service of this notice, to abate the same and also

HEREBY PROHIBIT the occurrence of the said nuisance and for that purpose require you to: Cease or cause to cease the playing of amplified music and amplified speech at such a level as to constitute a nuisance

IN the event of an appeal this notice shall NOT be suspended until the appeal has been abandoned or decided by the Court, as, in the opinion of the Council, the expenditure which would be incurred by any person in carrying out works in compliance with this notice before any appeal has been decided would not be disproportionate to the public benefit to be expected in that period from such compliance.

IF without reasonable excuse you contravene or fail to comply with any requirement of this notice you will be guilty of any offence under section 80(4) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and on summary conviction will be liable to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the Standard Scale (currently £5,000), together with a further fine of an amount equal to one-tenth of that level for each day on which the offence continues after conviction. A person who commits an offence on industrial, trade or business premises will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20,000.

The Council may also take proceedings in the High Court for securing the abatement, prohibition or restriction of the nuisance. Further, if you fail to execute all or any of the works in accordance with this notice, the Council may execute the works and recover from you the necessary expenditure incurred.

Therefore I am obliged to serve the enclosed Notice under Section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. This is intended to deal with this matter by enabling the Council to take formal legal action should there be any occurrence of statutory noise nuisance from loud music.

Should further complaints be received, we will investigate by monitoring the situation. Monitoring will either take the form of periodic visits, to be carried out day or night, by officers who will engage in non-intrusive monitoring (i.e. without alerting you prior to the visit) usually by visiting the person making the complaint, and/or the use of remote monitoring equipment which measures and records the noise being complained about.

Contravention of the notice could lead to the instigation of criminal proceedings against you. The maximum fine for each offence is now unlimited upon conviction. The previous maximum fine was £20,000

Please note that there is a right of appeal to the notice. Application has to be made to the Magistrates Court within 21 days. The details are provided on the notes to the notice.

If there continues to be a persistent noise nuisance, the council will also consider applying to the Courts for a warrant in order to seize all audio equipment from your premises.

Accordingly, I would strongly advise that you cease to cause noise nuisance and refrain from playing loud music at such a level as to disturb your neighbours.

It was good to meet with you, your father, and (Head of Security) on Saturday 27 Aug. You will recall my visit was made at approx. 22:40hrs, in response to a noise complaint. My prior assessment indicated a statutory nuisance-level of noise from loud amplified music. During our discussion, you informed me of due diligence measures you are taking by measuring noise levels at the boundary, and unsuccessful attempts you have made to engage with one resident in particular, I acknowledge that Carlton Lounge was celebrating its 10th anniversary.

Following a later review of the noise abatement notice served on you in July 2019 (copy attached), I observed its scope is limited to noise nuisance affecting residential occupiers at Mead Court. As explained during our meeting, the complaint received on Saturday evening was in response to a complaint from a different location.

I am therefore writing to formally withdraw the 2019 notice and serve the enclosed revised notice under Section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. This is intended to deal with the matter by enabling the Council to take formal legal action should there be any occurrence of noise nuisance from loud amplified music.

Contravention of the notice could lead to the instigation of criminal proceedings against you. The maximum fine for each offence, upon conviction, is unlimited. The previous maximum fine was £20,000 (business).

Please note that there is a right of appeal to the notice. Application has to be made to the Magistrates Court within 21 days. The details are provided on the notes to the notice.



Thank you for your time during our telephone cll on 29 September. As discussed, we have several received complaints from local residents alleging noise caused by loud amplified music and voices from your premises is causing a nuisance.

On the 18th September 2021 at 0021 hours and at 2314 hours, I visited the area and monitored noise levels from outside of the premises. I can confirm that on both occasions, the noise from both music and from voices could clearly be heard.

Since our telephone discussion, I was pleased to hear from a local resident that the noise from music had reduced over the past two weeks.

If the terms of that notice are broken and you continue to cause unacceptable noise, the Council may then take Court action. A successful prosecution can result in an unlimited fine and a criminal record being imposed. The option to seek a formal review of your premises licence is also an option available to the council and local residents.

I would like to draw your attention to condition 15 of your premises licence below:

"15 No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises."

You are therefore required to ensure that activities at your premises do not cause a disturbance to your neighbours and, if so, take any measures necessary to reduce the noise.

It was lovely to meet with you and your team earlier. I feel it was a constructive meeting and I hope it gave you some perspective on what you need to do to address the issues discussed.

I was able to carry out an inspection of the conditions attached to your premises licence and this highlighted some areas of concern, relating to the following conditions.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council on demand.

When requested, you were unable to show me CCTV footage from yesterday evening. I appreciate that you have now resolved this and this will not be a problem for any future similar requests.

4. The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority on demand.

Your SIA Manager showed me your incident book where the last recorded incident was on 02/01/2022. During conversation there appeared to be some confusion as to what needed to be recorded. Just to confirm that ANY incident, whether emergency services have been called or not, that involves some form of intervention/assistance by any

member of staff should be recorded. Recording of all incidents is so important in todays "Where's there's blame, there's a claim" culture that we live in.

During the meeting I identified the following two conditions that I feel your premises, in its current style of operation, will have difficulty to comply with.

15. No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.

16. The relevant areas where regulated entertainment or making music takes place shall be adequately sound proofed to prevent noise breakout.

Condition 15 & 16 have always been on the premises licence since it was converted to the new Licensing Act 2003. They were also on the licence when it was transferred to Carlton Lounge (UK) Ltd in 2016. So, it is obvious that these conditions were not taken into consideration when changing the style of operation to its current mode. This needs to be addressed as a matter of urgency as, if not, your premises could be at risk of enforcement action being taken and/or your licence being reviewed.

Please keep and updated with any measures you plan on implementing to make sure that you are in compliance with your licence conditions.

I am writing with deep heartbreak, fury, and disbelief following the horrific fatal stabbing that took place outside Tiger Bay (Carlton Lounge) on May 18th, 2025. A young man's life was stolen in the most brutal and preventable way, and it should never have happened. This wasn't just a tragic incident, it was pure negligence, and it was foreseeable. The blood of that young man is on the hands of those who stood by and did nothing.

After reading the police's summary and urgent request for an expedited licence review, I am appalled, though sadly not surprised, by the sheer level of recklessness and lawlessness that was allowed to continue unchecked at this venue.

How was it possible that a man could walk into a licensed premises with a knife, clearly visible on CCTV at 2am, and nothing was done? Where were the security checks? What were the staff doing? The staff not only failed to act, they lied. Body-worn footage from SID officers shows them deliberately denying that a fight even started inside the premises. This is not just negligence, it's a deliberate cover-up. One that suggests complicity, or at best, a shocking disregard for truth and justice.

There are reports that a customer warned staff that a knife had been pulled out inside, and still, no action. No attempt to intervene. No call for help. Just silence and cowardice.

For months, maybe even years, the community has raised concerns about Tiger Bay — constant noise, disorder, antisocial behaviour. It's not just a public nuisance, it's been a danger to everyone who lives near it or walks past it. And now, after countless warnings and ignored complaints, a young man is dead.

Re: Serious and Ongoing Public Safety Hazards Arising from Carlton Lounge (Tiger Bay), 236 Kingsbury Road, NW9 – Request for Formal Response and Immediate Enforcement Action

I write to express my grave concerns regarding the continuing public safety risks posed by the premises known as Carlton Lounge (also trading as "Tiger Bay") located at 234 Kingsbury Road, NW9. I urge the Council to give urgent and careful consideration to these matters prior to any decision being taken regarding the renewal, variation, or continuation of the venue's premises licence.

I formally request a written response to the following question, which relates directly to foreseeable legal liability:

In the event of another fire or arson incident at Carlton Lounge, particularly one involving the wooden smoking structure constructed adjacent to my property boundary (refer to attached Photos 15, 16, 17, and 21), who will bear legal and financial responsibility for any resulting damage to my premises?

This is not a theoretical concern. On 17 June 2020, I wrote to the Council warning explicitly of the severe fire risks associated with the adjacent tyre yard and surrounding structures and posed the same question concerning liability. I received no reply. On 22 June 2020, a mere five days later, an arson attack occurred, destroying a substantial part of my property (see Photos 18 and 19). This was not only foreseeable—it was preventable had appropriate action been taken.

The risks remain active and unresolved. I draw your attention to the following breaches and ongoing dangers:

1. Unlawful Obstruction of Emergency Access

Prior to the June 2020 fire, Carlton Lounge unlawfully constructed an enclosed venue ("Tiger Bay") over its legal right-of-way to the rear car park (see Photos 1, 2, and 6). This obstruction directly prevented fire service vehicles from accessing the rear of the premises where the fire originated. Fire crews were forced to park on Kingsbury Road, significantly delaying the emergency response and contributing to the extent of the damage to my property.

Shockingly, this unlawful construction remains in place to this day and continues to endanger life and property.

2. Ongoing Fire Hazards and Egress Violations

The shuttered access gates and Tiger Bay structure continue to block both emergency ingress and egress routes to car park (see Photos 4, 6, and 8), thereby placing venue patrons and neighbouring properties in danger. These conditions constitute a direct breach of fire safety regulations, planning controls, and licensing conditions.

3. Repeated Obstruction of Emergency Services and Fatal Consequences

There have been several incidents, where emergency responders have been delayed or obstructed due to persistent unauthorised use and blockage of Parcel M – a private access road misused by the venue. These delays are a direct and continuing threat to life and safety.

This persistent disregard for safety obligations constitutes a breach of statutory duties under:

- The Licensing Act 2003;
- The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005; and
- Established principles of public law and negligence.

In light of the above, I hereby demand that the Council:

- 1. Issue a formal written response addressing liability in the event of a future firerelated incident involving these ongoing hazards;
- 2. Confirm whether the Council is prepared to assume legal and financial responsibility for further damage or loss arising from its failure to enforce compliance with planning, licensing, and fire safety legislation;

- 3. Initiate immediate enforcement action to remove all unlawful and hazardous structures from the premises and surrounding areas;
- 4. Suspend or revoke the premises licence with immediate effect, pending a full independent risk assessment and evidence of full compliance with relevant legislation.

The attached photographic evidence supports the seriousness and immediacy of the risks posed.

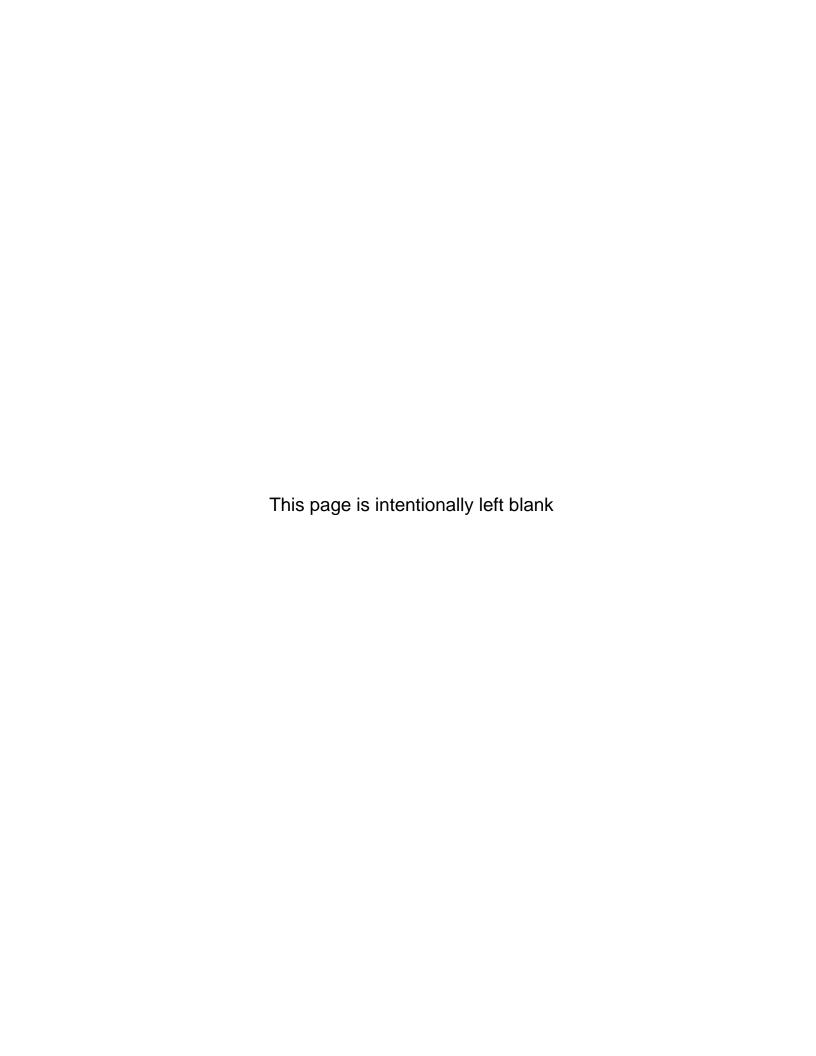

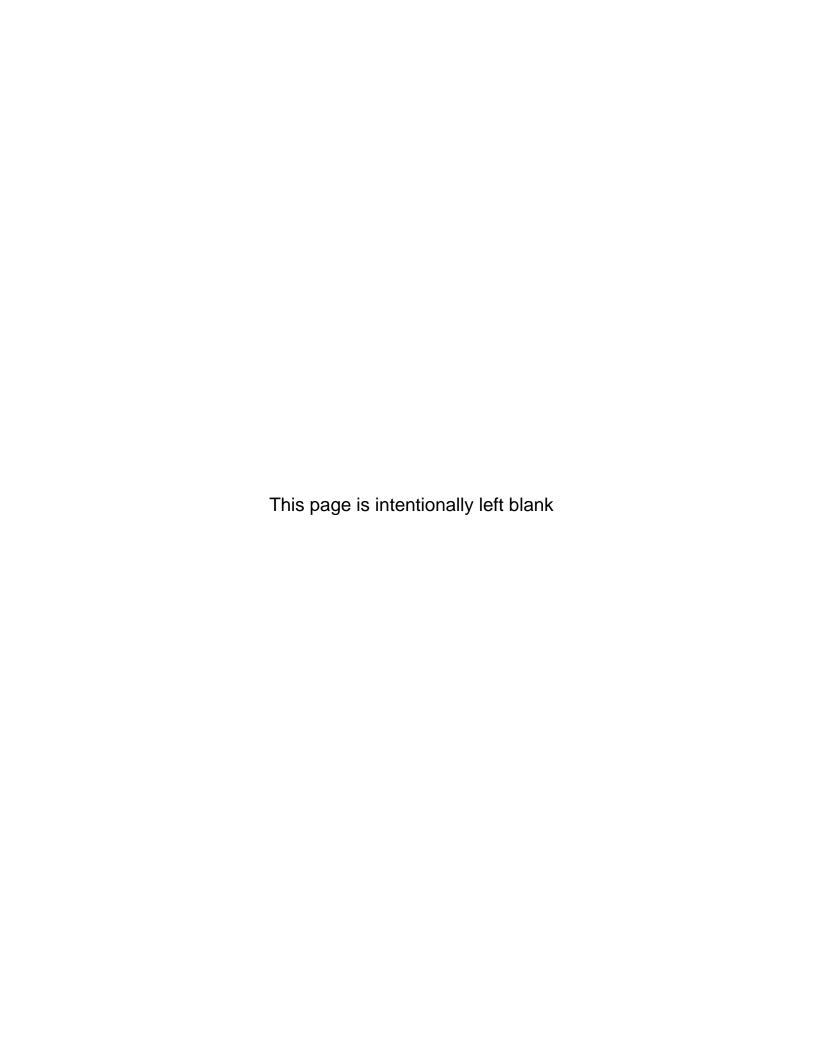

Regarding recent events, I was deeply saddened to hear about the tragic incident involving a fatality. But I want to be clear I do not believe that this reflects the standard, the culture, or the daily operations of Tiger Bay. I've carefully reviewed the licensing objectives set out by Brent Council, and from what I've experienced personally over many years, Tiger Bay adheres to them fully:

I've always seen a consistent security presence, professional in both appearance and behaviour. There is no tolerance for disorderly conduct.

The venue is clean, well-managed, and maintained in a way that makes guests — especially women — feel safe.

Sound levels are controlled, the space is never chaotic, and guests are respectful. There's a calmness about the way the premises are managed, even when busy.

They always check my ID and I have seen staff turn away anyone who couldn't meet entry requirements.

Tiger Bay and Carlton Lounge have been part of the local area for a long time. They're run by people who care — about their business, about the community, and about doing things the right way.

I respectfully ask that you consider voices like mine when reviewing this licence — voices of those who know the venue not through headlines, but through real experience.

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a)games or other activities which require or encourage,
- or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

- 1.A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a)—duty∥ is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b)—permitted price∥ is the price found by applying the formula—

$P = D + (D \times V)$

where—

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c)—relevant person|| means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i)the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) —relevant person || means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e)—valued added tax∥ means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day∥) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day∥) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax.
- (2)The permitted price which would apply on the first day🗗മയ്യ െ 55ales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the

expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a)at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b)at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

Film Classification When required

- (i) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the designated film classification body unless section (ii) applies.
- (ii) Where the licensing authority notifies the holder of the licence that this subsection applies the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.

In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority

lunder section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. The premises shall operate, and maintain a digital colour CCTV system. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises are open for licensable activities and all recordings shall be kept for 31 days.
- 2. CCTV footage shall be made available to the Police and any authorised Officers from Brent Council upon 72 hours of request.
- 3. The CCTV system shall display on any recordings, the correct date and time of the recording.
- Signage stating that CCTV is in operation shall be clearly and prominently displayed at the premises.
- 5. A minimum of 2 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty after 22:00 if the premises will be open past 01:00.
- 6. All SIA licenced door supervisors shall wear clothing that can be clearly and easily identified.
- 7. The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall aga 258 vailable to the Police and Licensing Authority on

demand.

- 8. There shall be no open glass vessels permitted outside the area defined on the premises plan.
- 9. Notices shall be conspicuously displayed at the entrance notifying patrons that the premises reserves the right to undertake searches upon entry to the premises and that the premises has a "no drugs policy".
- 10. Food and alcohol-free drinks shall be always available for patrons whilst the premises are selling alcohol.
- 11. The last entry on Sundays to Thursdays will be 02:30 and on Fridays and Saturdays to 03:30.
- 12. There shall be at least 4 members of staff on site after 00:00.
- 13. The maximum number of persons permitted on the Ground Floor shall not exceed 300 persons including staff. The maximum number of persons permitted on the First Floor shall not exceed 150 persons including staff.
- 14. The smoking of shisha through "alcoholic drinks" shall not be advertised.
- 15. The outside drinking areas shall close after 23:00, excluding the shisha areas and karoga areas.
- 16. Ingress and egress notwithstanding, all doors and windows shall remain closed during any regulated entertainment and/or after 22:00 in all circumstances. Staff shall undertake regular checks to ensure that all doors and windows are closed.
- 17. The playing of live or recorded music shall not be permitted in any external area after 22:00 hours apart from within the designated shisha areas and karoga areas as defined on the premises plan.
- 18. The internal areas from which any recorded music or live music is undertaken, the premises shall ensure that it is adequately sound proofed to prevent noise breakout.
- 19. A telephone number shall be made available to be used by residents in relation to any complaint of noise resulting from the premises. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all complaints made by residents, and any action taken, are recorded within the incident log.
- 20. Noise monitoring shall be undertaken at least once every two hours when regulated entertainment is provided from 23.00 until the closure of the premises.
- 21. Clear and legible notices shall be prominently displayed at the exit requesting patrons to respect the needs of residents when leaving the premises.
- 22. No rubbish or empty bottles shall be placed in the outside bins after 23:00.
- 23. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport, or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 24. A Challenge 25 notice shall be conspicuously displayed at the point of sale.
- 25. A logbook shall be kept recording all refused sales of alcohol. The log shall contain the time/date of the refusal, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, the reason the sale was refused and any other relevant observation. The refusals register shall be made available for inspection upon request of an authorised officer of a Brent Council and the Police.
- 26. No children shall be admitted unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
- 27. All staff training shall be undertaken by all members of staff involved with licensable activities. Training records shall include the time/date of the training, staff members name, training topic and must be signed off by the relevant staff member and the respective premises licence holder/designated premises supervisor/duty manager. A copy of staff training shall be available upon request by Police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.
- 28. During major Wembley Stadium event days, patrons shall not be permitted to congregate outside the premises, save for ingress.
- 29. During major Wembley Stadium event days, all drinks glass bottles shall be decanted into either toughened glass, polycarbonate material or any other type of plastic vessel.
- 30. During major Wembley Stadium event days, the DP\$ are \$59 at the manager shall work in partnership with the Police




