This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display
 of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day,
 provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a
 contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial
 arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting
 event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

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- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).

This proposal raises serious concerns regarding:

- Public Nuisance: Extended operating hours are likely to generate noise, litter, and antisocial behaviour, particularly in a residential area where families and vulnerable residents deserve peace and security during nighttime hours.
- Community Impact: The proposed hours are excessive and unnecessary. They risk undermining the wellbeing of local residents, especially those living adjacent to or near the premises. We already have anti-social behaviour in the earlier hours of the morning in the Alleyway behind Kingsbury Road.
- Precedent Setting: Approval of this license may open the door to further late-night operations, eroding the character and safety of the neighbourhood.

We respectfully submit this response to the objection raised regarding our application for the provision of late-night refreshment between 23:00 hrs and 03:00 hrs.

We wish to clarify an important point: the service during these hours will be delivery only. No customers will attend the premises after 23:00 hrs. This distinction addresses the key concerns raised:

Public Nuisance: As there will be no late-night customer visits, there will be no congregation of people outside the premises, no queues, and no on-site littering. Delivery drivers will collect orders swiftly and depart, minimising any potential noise or disturbance. We use electric bikes so there will be no noise pollution.

Community Impact: With the delivery-only model, residents will not experience the noise or anti-social behaviour typically associated with late-night walk-in trade. Our operations will remain discreet, with drivers instructed to be considerate when collecting orders.

Precedent Setting: Granting this licence does not set a precedent for late-night trading that disrupts the community, as the application is strictly limited to delivery-only service. This ensures that the residential character of the neighbourhood is preserved.

Safeguards: We are committed to operating responsibly. Measures will include:

Clear instructions to drivers to avoid idling engines and unnecessary noise.

Internal order management to minimise waiting times for drivers.

Regular monitoring of the premises to ensure compliance with licensing conditions.

- 1. The premises shall operate and maintain a digital colour CCTV system. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises are open for licensable activities and all recordings shall be kept for 31 days. The CCTV system shall also display the correct date and time on any recordings.
- 2. The CCTV system shall capture clear images of every person entering or leaving the premises with further CCTV cameras covering the publicly accessible areas stipulated on the premises plan, including the frontage of the premises.
- **3**. CCTV footage shall be made available for immediate viewing upon request by the Police and any authorised Officers from Brent Council by a member of staff who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system. CCTV footage shall also be provided to the Police and any authorised Officers from Brent Council, in a readily accessible format on removable media (I.e., USB, hard drive, CD etc..) or via digital transfer within 24 hours of request.
- 4. A notice stating that CCTV is in operation shall be clearly and prominently displayed.
- **5**. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which shall record the following:
- **a**. any incidents of crime and disorder, including any ejections from the premises.
- **b**. any relevant complaints received.
- **c**. any faults in the CCTV system.
- **d**. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- **6**. Any entries into the log shall be made within 24 hours of any incident and shall contain the time/date of the incident, the nature of the incident, a description of the people involved, the action taken and details of the person responsible for the management of the premises at the time of the incident.
- **7**. Clear and legible signage shall be prominently displayed advising patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises quietly.
- **8**. With the exception of ingress and egress, all doors and windows shall remain closed after 23:00.
- **9**. Notices shall be prominently displayed advising patrons to dispose of their waste in litter bins.
- **10**. No open alcoholic drinks shall be permitted on any publicly accessible area defined on the premises plan.
- **11.** There shall be no provision for customers to consume their meal on the premises during the hours permitted for licensable activities (i.e., after 23:00).

Police are of the opinion that the risk to the Council's objectives can be mitigated by removing the requested variations or attaching conditions to the Licence as shown below. If these conditions were accepted in full, police would be in a position to withdraw their representations.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a full variation of a License under section 34 of the Licensing act 2003. The Police representations are concerned with all four of the licensing objectives.

- The prevention of crime and disorder.
 - Public safety.
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm.

The Application

The application is to add Late Night Refreshments (LNR) to the existing business operating from 23.00 to 03.00 hours Monday to Sunday.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is a basic requirement to help deter and detect criminal activity for all reputable license holders. Therefore, a decent quality CCTV system is an essential tool and should be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance. The system should be fully operational during the hours of business, with a member of staff present who can operate and if required download footage upon request of the police or other recognised authority from Brent Council.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below:

- 1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council. The CCTV system shall show the correct date and time.
- 2. A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the internal and external area directly outside the venue.
- 3. The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises.
- 4. A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system shall be available at the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public. This member of staff shall be able to view, download and make copies of any CCTV requests made by the police or authorised officer(s).
- 5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any faults in the CCTV system
- (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

Any inputs into this log shall be made within 24 hours of the event.

- 6. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 7. Training records of all staff shall be kept. This training shall be done at least once a year for each individual staff member. The training records shall detail: -
 - (a) Staff member's name and signature
 - (b) Name of person providing the training
 - (c) Date of training
 - (d) Training on use of the incident log
 - (e) Training on the use and downloading (providing copies) of the CCTV system.
- 8. The licensee shall ensure all public areas within 3 metres of the premises are cleared of litter arising from the premises daily.
- 9. Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.
- 10. All deliveries shall take place during the normal working day (i.e. 09:00 to 18:00 daily).

Deliveries' from Venue

- 11. Delivery drivers should be asked to keep noise to a minimum when collecting takeaways and must not be permitted to loiter unnecessarily
- 12. No idling of delivery vehicles
- 13. Drivers shall not deliver to any person anywhere other than that at the residential / business address given when the order was placed. There shall be $\underline{\bf NO}$ deliveries made to any open/public spaces.
