The application is for the review of a premises licence held by Destiny62 Limited. The premises are known as Venue 295, 295 Neasden Lane, NW10 1QR.

2. Grounds for Review

The grounds for review are the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

3. Relevant Representations

Representation has been received from the Metropolitan Police and an interested party.

4. Background

These premises are currently licensed for regulated entertainment and Late-Night Refreshment from 9.30am to 12.30am Sundays, 1.30am Monday to Thursday and 2.am Friday and Saturday. The sale of alcohol from 11am to 12.30am Sundays, 1.30am Monday to Thursday and 2am Friday & Saturday.

The premises may remain open from 9.30am to 1.30am Sundays, 2.30am Monday to Thursday and 3am Friday and Saturday.

The licence was transferred to Mr Haydar Tunc in September 2021, he later transferred the licence in 2023 to a company name Destiny62 Limited, where he is the Director. However, in October 2025, Mr Tunc applied to remove himself as the DPS.

After receipt of the review application, a Transfer and Vary DPS application was submitted on 29 January 2026 naming Ms Meriem Harchi as the new licence holder and DPS at the premises.

- To exclude the sale of alcohol or other licensable activity
- Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor
- Suspend the licence for up to 3 months.

Grounds for Review

The Metropolitan Police Service applies for a review of this premises licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003, on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder.

The Police seek the revocation of the premises licence due to persistent and serious management failures, repeated breaches of the Licensing Act 2003, and the continued unauthorised operation of licensable activities. These matters demonstrate a sustained lack of

control, oversight, and compliance by those responsible for the premises.

Summary of Police Concerns and Breaches

The review request arises from a series of police visits and associated correspondence, including formal written warning letters issued on 5 January 2026 and 20 January 2026.

1. Unauthorised Sale of Alcohol Sections 136 and 137, Licensing Act 2003

On Wednesday 31 December 2025 at approximately 22:30 hours, police officers attended the premises and identified that alcohol was being sold despite there being no valid Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) in place.

Staff and persons present were unable or unwilling to provide accurate details regarding ownership or management responsibility.

A male later identified as ██████████ attended the premises and stated that he was a partner in the business. He was advised that there was no valid DPS in place and was instructed to remove all alcohol from display immediately.

Despite this advice, on Saturday 17 January 2026 at approximately 22:00 hours, officers again attended the premises. Music was playing and alcohol was being sold to customers. Alcohol was observed behind the bar, with two members of staff actively operating.

At that time, the premises still had no valid DPS, and the sale of alcohol was therefore unlawful.

These incidents constitute offences under:

Section 136(1) – unauthorised sale of alcohol; and
Section 137 – knowingly allowing or authorising the sale of alcohol without a DPS.

Despite clear verbal advice and formal written warnings, the premises licence holder and director failed to engage with police and continued to permit the unlawful supply of alcohol.

2. Failure to Notify Change of Registered Address - Section 33, Licensing Act 2003 It has been identified that the registered office address of the premises licence holder changed on 23 November 2023 from: 295 First Floor, Neasden Lane, London, NW10 1QR to Dairy Cottage, Monkham, Waltham Abbey, Essex, EN9 2EP

The Licensing Authority was not notified of this change as required by Section 33 of the Licensing Act 2003, which constitutes a further offence. This failure further evidences poor management, inadequate governance, and disregard for statutory obligations.

Meeting with the Premises Licence Holder

Following the issuing of a warning letter on Tuesday 20 January 2026, telephone contact was made with ██████████, who advised that he was no longer involved in the business and was in a civil dispute with the current occupiers.

On Thursday 22 January 2026, officers from the Metropolitan Police Service and representatives from the Licensing Authority met with ██████████ at Brent Civic Centre. During this meeting, ██████████ confirmed the following:

- He operated the business himself from 2021 for several years.
- He subsequently decided to sub-lease the premises.
- The premises were sub-leased to two individuals without a formal written agreement.
- Destiny62 Limited remained the premises licence holder, and ██████████ remained the DPS until October 2025.

- The business is now managed by [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] stated that he has no involvement in the day-to-day operation of the premises.

Lack of Management Control and Serious Failings

The above circumstances demonstrate a fundamental breakdown in management and responsibility, in that:

- There is no effective control or oversight by the premises licence holder.
- The premises has been operated by individuals with no formal legal or contractual authority.
- Staff and managers demonstrate a lack of basic understanding of licensing responsibilities.
- Alcohol has been repeatedly supplied unlawfully without a valid DPS.
- Police instructions and formal written warnings have been ignored.
- Statutory notification requirements have not been complied with.

These failings present a significant risk to the licensing objectives, in particular the prevention of crime and disorder. The continued unlawful supply of alcohol undermines the integrity of the licensing regime and demonstrates that the premises is being operated in a manner that is neither responsible nor lawful.

Conclusion

The Metropolitan Police Service submits that the current operation of Venue 295 is wholly incompatible with the licensing objectives. The repeated breaches of the Licensing Act 2003, absence of effective management, lack of accountability, and disregard for statutory requirements justify robust regulatory action.

This application is therefore made under the crime and disorder licensing objective, and the Police respectfully invite the Licensing Sub-Committee to give serious consideration to the revocation of the premises licence.

Dear Licensing Authority, RE: Representation in Respect of Venue 295 Restaurant & Lounge 295 Neasden Lane, London NW10 1QR We submit this representation under the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the ongoing Review and recent transfer application concerning the above premises. Our concerns relate primarily to the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder. We have been informed that the consent relied upon for the current transfer application may have been obtained under threat or improper pressure. We understand that evidence has been provided to the Police in this regard. If substantiated, this raises serious concerns about the integrity of the licensing process and the suitability of individuals seeking control of the premises. We are further concerned about attempts by individuals without lawful authority to assume operational control of the premises licence. We respectfully request that the Licensing Sub-Committee carefully consider: - Whether the transfer reflects genuine and lawful control; - Whether the licensing objectives are undermined by the current circumstances; - Whether additional conditions or safeguards are necessary. We reserve our position in relation to ongoing civil proceedings but submit this representation solely in the interest of upholding the licensing objectives. Yours faithfully, [REDACTED].

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

1. (a) games or other activities which require or encourage,

or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a)—duty|| is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b)—permitted price|| is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i)P is the permitted price,

(ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c)—relevant person|| means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i)the holder of the premises licence,

(ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) —relevant person|| means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e)—valued added tax|| means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day||) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day||) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

Film Classification When required

(i) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the designated film classification body unless section (ii) applies.

(ii) Where the licensing authority notifies the holder of the licence that this subsection applies the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.

In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority

under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1 Door supervisors of a suitable gender mix (but at least two), shall be employed from 2100 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight.

2 A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

3 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council on request.

4 Customers will not take open drink containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.

5 Customers shall not be permitted to take open containers of alcohol off the premises.

6 The total number of people on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 250 persons

7 Notices clearly explaining the licensee's drugs and weapons policy shall be displayed at the entrance and at suitable places throughout the premises.

8 The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

9 Notices explaining the licensee's policy on admission and searching shall be placed at each entrance.

10 Signs alerting customers to theft shall be displayed.

11 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.

12 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

13 A suitable panic button shall be fitted and maintained.

14 No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after midnight till close.

15 The outside drinking areas shall cease at 2300 hours.

16 The front of the premises shall not be used as a smoking area. After 23:00 hours the designated smoking area shall be limited to twenty persons and shall be suitably supervised.

17 The Licensee shall undertake a risk assessment agreed by the Police and Licensing Authority of any significant promotion or event, using the Metropolitan Police Service Promotion/Event Risk Assessment Form (Form 696) or an equivalent and provide a copy to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit not less than 14 days before the event is due to take place.

18 The level of music shall be arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.

19 Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at each exit.

20 Facilities within the premises shall be made available for customers to await taxis.

21 The socket outlets (or other power supplies used for DJ equipment, band equipment and other portable equipment) that are accessible to performers, staff or the public shall be suitably protected by a residual current device (RCD having a rated

residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps).

22 The locks and flush latches on the exit doors and gates shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars and pads whilst the public are on the premises.

24 Nudity, striptease and other entertainment of an adult nature shall not be permitted on the premises.

25 A "Challenge 21" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.



Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage,

or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of

undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a)—duty¹¹ is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b)—permitted price¹¹ is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c)—relevant person¹¹ means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises the supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e)—valued added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

Film Classification When required

(i) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the designated film classification body unless section (ii) applies.

(ii) Where the licensing authority notifies the holder of the licence that this subsection applies the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.

In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority

under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1 Door supervisors of a suitable gender mix (but at least two), shall be employed from 2100 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight.

2 A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.


- 3 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council on request.
- 4 Customers will not take open drink containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
- 5 Customers shall not be permitted to take open containers of alcohol off the premises.
- 6 The total number of people on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 250 persons
- 7 Notices clearly explaining the licensee's drugs and weapons policy shall be displayed at the entrance and at suitable places throughout the premises.
- 8 The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.
- 9 Notices explaining the licensee's policy on admission and searching shall be placed at each entrance.
- 10 Signs alerting customers to theft shall be displayed.
- 11 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
- 12 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 13 A suitable panic button shall be fitted and maintained.
- 14 No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after midnight till close.
- 15 The outside drinking areas shall cease at 2300 hours.
- 16 The front of the premises shall not be used as a smoking area. After 23:00 hours the designated smoking area shall be limited to twenty persons and shall be suitably supervised.
- 17 The Licensee shall undertake a risk assessment agreed by the Police and Licensing Authority of any significant promotion or event, using the Metropolitan Police Service Promotion/Event Risk Assessment Form (Form 696) or an equivalent and provide a copy to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit not less than 14 days before the event is due to take place.
- 18 The level of music shall be arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- 19 Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at each exit.
- 20 Facilities within the premises shall be made available for customers to await taxis.
- 21 The socket outlets (or other power supplies used for DJ equipment, band equipment and other portable equipment) that are accessible to performers, staff or the public shall be suitably protected by a residual current device (RCD having a rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps).
- 22 The locks and flush latches on the exit doors and gates shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars and pads whilst the public are on the premises.
- 24 Nudity, striptease and other entertainment of an adult nature shall not be permitted on the premises.
- 25 A "Challenge 21" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.
