As I'm sure you're aware, the building currently operates as a warehouse storage facility, operating during the daytime. However, this new application to operate as a takeaway delivery service of alcohol raises serious questions as to whether such use would constitute a change of use and thus require planning permission to operate as a commercial enterprise from 8am - 00.00 am.
