

The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) Regulations 2020 (SI. 2020: No.350)

PROHIBITION NOTICE

This Prohibition Notice is served under Regulation 8(2) of The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) Regulations 2020 (the Regulations) and has immediate effect.

The Regulations impose certain restrictions to protect against the risks to public health arising from coronavirus. Failure to comply with the requirements of the Regulations, without reasonable excuse, is a criminal offence.

SUSANA FIGUEIREDO

designated as a relevant person for the purposes of the Regulations by The London Borough of Brent, have reasonable grounds for believing that you are contravening a requirement in the Regulations as set out in Part B below and that it is necessary and proportionate to issue this Prohibition Notice to prevent continued contravention of the requirement.

Part B. Contravention of the restrictions

The shop is open operating as A PUBLIC HOUSE

business that is subject to closure Regulation 4(1)(4); 5(1)(3)* in that you are responsible a person for providing a service which is listed in Part (1)(2)(3)* of Schedule 2, namely that you are carrying on providing that service during the emergency period. (*delete as appropriate)

Part C. Action required

This Prohibition Notice requires that you immediately cease the activities giving rise to contravention of the Regulations. The activities must not resume before the end of the emergency period. The measures specified below must be taken to prevent continued contravention of the Regulations: Cease activity, trading and close premises immediately

Part D. Consequences of non-compliance

Failure to comply with this Prohibition Notice, without reasonable excuse, is an offence punishable by a fine on summary conviction in a Magistrates Court.

Part E. Challenging this Prohibition Notice

There is no statutory right to appeal against this Prohibition Notice.
