SITUATION:

Our case has been ongoing since March 2022 with regards to noise and public nuisance. The issue has deteriorated despite the weather being colder.

Our first meeting with the Kilburn Arms was on the 17th May 2022 and also where we negotiated the following:

- all doors to the pub should be closed once the music starts at 8pm
- the back terrace must be closed at 10pm
- the duration should be between 8pm and 11pm with the last song played at 10.55pm
- that they seek ways to soundproof the venue

Following visits/communication with The Kilburn Arms, have been:

- 19th July 2022 Letter sent from the residents to The Kilburn Arms
- 7th June 2022 Brent Noise team emailed and visited the Kilburn Arms
- 12th October 2022 residents met with the on-duty manager
- 28th August 2022 residents met with Costas

ISSUES:

We have kept a noise diary (attached) and regular noise recordings via the NoiseApp. As you can see the dates and times are consistent with times of the music playing regularly running over the 11pm cut off. Furthermore, the noise and disturbance from the terraces, often running into the early hours of the morning. The recent planning application for the front and back terrace has now impacted our peace and quiet in our own home.

As residents with two young children, we noticed that they are quite anxious and restless on Wednesday and Saturday nights. The music and sound from the Kilburn Arms premises cause our children to wake from their sleep on these evenings. This has a knock-on effect on our sleep and as a result our whole family suffer on Thursdays and Sundays!

Because some weeks the situation has been so unbearable, we have felt compelled to get out of the comfort of bed to go round the Kilburn Arms in pajamas after 11pm as the music is still going on, with doors wide open and in full swing with no sign of stopping! Once the live music ends, recorded music is played through speakers onto the decking. Evidence can be seen on the noise diary and videos can also be submitted.

The first occasion on going round to the Kilburn Arms past 11pm, we were met with sincere apologies from the manager however on every occasion after this, we have been quickly dismissed, with the on-duty staff showing a reluctance to stop the music and the conversations have been confrontational making us feel intimidated. We had to call the police as one of the punters from the pub was aggressive and followed my husband to the door of our home.

The following mornings (Thursdays and Sundays), we clear up broken glass from our entrance to our house and during the summer months when the weather was hot, hose down the doorway as it smells of urine!

It is also apparent that there is a strong smell of marijuana which we can now smell on


Wednesday and Saturday nights coming from the terraces (front and back).

CONCLUSION:

As a result of the actions of the pub, we are unable to enjoy peace in our own home and feel intimidated on busier nights. Their irresponsible actions are disturbing our young children, creating a state of fear and panic in the early hours of the morning which comes from the pub every Wednesday and Saturday which is negatively impacting our lives and fashioning an unhealthy environment.

What we would like to make clear is that we <u>DO NOT</u> want to end live music for the Kilburn Arms however we would like to see them cooperate with us and police it effectively. We would like to see the following implemented:

- The Kilburn Arms should <u>NOT</u> be required to stage performances of live music, or the playing of recorded music from **Sunday to Friday (AM and PM)**.
- Live music, or the playing of recorded music should be permitted only on Saturday evenings from 8pm to 11pm. (Band warmups should also be conducted within this time frame)
- All outdoor seating/space should be closed at 9pm every day throughout the year. This
 means people who drink at the pub outdoors should not be congregating on the terrace
 past 11pm. From what I have observed, other pubs in the local area stop live music and
 last orders are at 10.30-10.45pm and everyone must disperse by 11.15pm.
- The doors to the Kilburn Arms should always closed when the music is played. Please note the front doors leading onto Willesden Lane should be double closed, not just the internal doors.
- The back doors to the back terrace should always be closed when live music, or recorded music is played. Please see pictures showing the doors being left open and also kept open with wire! (A video can also be provided of doors wide open when music is played).
