This statement outlines the time I visited THE FIELD pub and witnessed alcohol being consumed.

On TUESDAY 14<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY I was in full uniform in NEASDEN LANE at approximately 1920hrs as part of OPERATION NIGHTINGALE with 2269NW, 2895NW, 2841NW. I was outside the back of THE FIELD pub 249 NEASDEN LANE NW10 1QG.

Whilst on OPERATION NIGHTINGALE we received potential Intel by A/PS 3703NW about an unlicensed premises in NEASDEN goes by the name THE FIELD and that they were not allowed to sell any alcohol due to not having a license.


Upon arrival I stood with 2269NW, 2895NW, 2841NW at the back of the property. The back door of THE FIELD pub was not secure we knew this as the back door did not looked closed properly and PC Security pulled the door with his fingers and the back door opened slightly and the lights were on. PC Security 2269NW then knocked on the door and shouted "POLICE!". There was no answer. PC Security knocked again and shouted "POLICE!". There was again no answer.

We entered the premises as we thought someone had broken in. Upon entering there were female then male toilets to the right. Walking further into the premises there was a bar with beer pumps, tables and chairs. There were 3 (three) males sitting around the bar drinking alcohol out of glasses along with some empty ones also where they were sitting. PC P 2841NW and I walked around the back in the room next to the bar to check if anyone else was in the premises, there was no one else there, but there were multiple kegs on the floor with plastic tubing attached that had a liquid inside. There were fridges behind the bar and were filled with bottles of alcohol. PC S 269NW asked the 3 males inside if anyone worked there. One male said he worked. One of the other male said he had come to check what further work needed to be done with the electrics as he stated he was doing electric work for the premises.


