**Licensing Representation to the Initial Application for the Premises Licence at Gorillas Technologies Ltd, 113 Bryan Avenue, London, NW10 2AS**

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make a representation that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

**An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.**

**The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.**

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

*The Licensing Authority require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence:*

1. Challenge 25 – if the driver considers the recipient of alcohol appears under 25, recognised photographic identification to be requested before any alcohol is given to the recipient.
  2. Acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customer's photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo-card driving licence and passport. No ID – No delivery.

3. Staff training must be documented and based on legislation and operating procedures. All training shall be signed and dated and a copy of such records will be available for inspection by Police and local authority enforcement officers.
4. At the time the order is placed, a declaration will be required from the person placing the order that the person is over '18 years of age'.
5. Alcohol shall only be delivered to a residential or business address and not to a public place.
6. Alcohol will only be delivered to the person who placed the order and whose name appears on the credit/debit card.
7. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) any complaints received
  - (b) any incidents
  - (c) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (d) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
8. Members of the general public must not be allowed access to the premises in order to buy, collect, browse or be supplied directly with alcohol at any time.
9. The Minimum age of delivery drivers will be 18.

In order for the Licensing Authority to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you to confirm in writing that your client is willing to accept the above conditions.
