## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

#### No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
  - 1. (a)games or other activities which require or encourage,

or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

#### Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

## Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

#### Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

#### Minimum Price of Alcohol

- **1.**A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a)—duty | is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b)—permitted price∥ is the price found by applying the formula—

#### $P = D + (D \times V)$

where—

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c)—relevant person∥ means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
  - (i)the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d)—relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e)—valued added tax∥ means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1)Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day||) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day||) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a)at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b)at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

### Film Classification When required

- (i) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the designated film classification body unless section (ii) applies.
- (ii) Where the licensing authority notifies the holder of the licence that this subsection applies the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.

In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) shall be installed and maintained in accordance with the Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO) guidance, and all recorded images kept and made available to the Police and the Licensing Authority for 31 days.
- 2. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
- 3. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance.
- All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
- 5. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
- 6. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 7. All doors and windows shall remain closed during any entertainment and where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door shall be lobbied and fitted with a self-closing device.
- 8. Signs shall be placed in the garden and the frontage instructing customers to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management shall reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing the neighbours.
- 9. No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises after 23:00hrs. The level of music at all times shall be arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.
- 11. The Portman Group proof of age scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted.
- 12. Toilets shall be checked regularly for the use of drugs and other illegal activities.
- 13. Adequate and appropriate first aid equipment shall be available on the premises.

- 14. Suitable and sufficient fire fighting equipment shall be provided and maintained in good order.
- 15. Regular surveys (checks) shall be carried out when the premises are used for entertainment to ensure the level of music is arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- 16. Notices advertising the number of a local licensed taxi service shall be displayed in a prominent position.
- 17. Door supervisors of a sufficient number and gender mix, shall be employed from 20:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight.
- 18. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 19. Outside drinking shall only be allowed at the tables provided and no customer shall be allowed to take glasses or bottles away.

## Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

20. Live music shall be restricted to the following times:

Sunday to Tuesday 20:00hrs to 22:30hrs, Wednesday to Friday 20:00hrs to 23:00hrs and Saturday 20:00hrs to 00:00hrs

- 21. There shall be no playing of live or recorded music in outside areas of the premises.
- 23. The rear outside drinking areas shall cease use at 22:30hrs.
- 24. Clear and prominent notices shall be displayed and maintained at all exits in a place where they can be seen and easily read by customers requesting them to leave the premises and the area quietly.
