Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a)games or other activities which require or encourage,
- or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

- 1.A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a)—duty|| is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b)—permitted price|| is the price found by applying the formula—

$P = D + (D \times V)$

where—

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c)—relevant person∥ means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i)the holder of the premises licence,

(ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) —relevant person∥ means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e)—valued added tax∥ means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day||) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day||) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a)at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b)at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

Film Classification When required

- (i) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the designated film classification body unless section (ii) applies.
- (ii) Where the licensing authority notifies the holder of the licence that this subsection applies the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.

In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority

lunder section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule 1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council on demand. 2 A minimum of 2 door supervisors shall be employed from 22:00 hours when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past 01.00hrs and will remain in place until the last customer has left the premises.

- 3 Customers shall not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted
- 4 The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority on demand.
- 5 Notices clearly explaining the licensee"s policy on admission and searching shall be displayed at each entrance.
- 6 Signs alerting customers to theft shall be displayed.

to and approved by the Licensing Authority.

- 7 The outside drinking areas (including rear garden) shall cease at 2300 hours excluding the shisha area.
- 8 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 9 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages (including free drinking water) shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
- 10 On major event days at Wembley Stadium the following shall apply:
- * Customers shall not be allowed to congregate outside the premises.
- * No glass bottles shall be handed over the bar but decanted into toughened glass or plastic vessels.
- * The DPS shall work in partnership with the Police and if necessary comply with any direction given by a senior Police Officer on duty at the event.
- Notices clearly explaining the licensee"s drugs policy shall be displayed at the entrance and at suitable places through out the premises.
- 12 Windows within the bar and restaurant areas shall be kept closed after 22:00 hours.
- Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.

14 The playing of live or recorded music shall not be permitted in any garden or external area after 2200 hours excluding the Shisha area.
No noise or vibration shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.
16 The relevant areas where regulated entertainment or making music takes place shall be adequately sound proofed to prevent noise breakout.
17 Doors and windows shall be kept closed during entertainment to reduce noise breakout (ensuring there is adequate ventilation within the premises). Staff shall check prior to entertainment and periodically during entertainment, that all windows and doors are shut.
18 Lobbied entrances shall have automatic door closures.
19 Nudity, striptease and other entertainment of an adult nature shall not be permitted on the premises.
The advertised smoking of shisha through "alcoholic drinks" shall not take place on the premises
21 The maximum number of persons permitted on the Ground Floor shall not exceed 300 persons including staff.
The maximum number of persons permitted on the First Floor shall not exceed 150 persons including staff.
The locks and flush latches on the exit doors and gates shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars or pads whilst the public are on the premises.
The socket outlets (or other power supplies used for DJ equipment, band equipment and other portable equipment) that are accessible to performers, staff or the public shall be suitably protected by a residual current device (RCD having a rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps).
No children shall be admitted unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
No rubbish or empty bottles shall be placed in the outside bins after 23:00 hours
The Licensee shall undertake a risk assessment of any significant promotion or event, using the Metropolitan Police Service Promotion/Event Risk Assessment Form (Form 696) or an equivalent and provide a copy to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit not less than 14 days before the event is due to take place.
Where an event has taken place the licensee shall complete a Debrief Risk Assessment Form (Form 696A) and submit this to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council"s Licensing Unit within 3 days of the conclusion of the event.

No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 00:00 hours on Sunday to Thursday and 00.30hrs on Friday and Saturday
