**Police Representation to the Application to vary the Premises Licence
for Café / Club Brasseria Timisoreana**

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to **make representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence under section 34 of the Act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

The application is to add dance and music and to extend the licence on a Saturday till 2am. This is very late for the vicinity which although the main Edgware Road is a particularly quiet area of it and backs on to and is opposite residential properties.

Part O of the application states seasonal variation for the summer months but does not explain what or to what time?

It has also been noted that this premise has had parties previous to being licensed and since it was licensed only a few months ago that the premises

has had a number of TENs for parties. I assume that this application is to continue such activity without the need for a TEN. As such this premises turns from a café into a night club. What I witnessed at the most recent TEN on Sat 24th March was that the premises went on past the 1am notice. People were coming outside to smoke and drinking outside the premises, the door was left open and music was loud. Such activity will lead to resident complaints. The applicant needs to address these points more clearly in the operating schedule as to how exactly they will promote the licensing objectives. At this moment in time with the information supplied I believe that the licensing objectives would be undermined. I would invite the applicant to speak with me regarding my concerns.
