**Police Objection to the Application to vary the DPS at “Miranda lounge”
36 Park Parade, NW10 4JE**

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make **representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Crime and Disorder Licensing Objective for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a ‘Responsible Authority’ under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence to specify an individual as designated premises supervisor under section 37 of the Act.

Police are formally objecting to the variation.

The Police objections are concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder.

1) The proposed DPS Ms Afishetu Abiodun-Oniru, has leased the premises since at least October 2012.

This premises has caused problems since that time with Mrs Abiodun -Oniru in charge. There has been public nuisance and various breaches of the Licensing Act, including after hours activity, excessive noise, unregistered door supervisors, among others. There has also been anti social behaviour and crime by the customers. It is my considered opinion that the designation of Ms Abiodun - Oniru as the premises supervisor at this time would undermine the crime prevention objective. I am not convinced that she will be in a position to run the premises properly. I understand that she has recently passed the National certificate for personal licence holders so will now have a better understanding of licensing law but my previous knowledge of her behaviour

and that of her customers leads me to honestly believe that the licensing objectives will not be promoted, indeed will be seriously undermined.

I reserve the right to bring further evidence to the hearing should any arise between now and then.
