Police Objection to the Application to vary the DPS at 'Yours & Mine' 37 Chamberlayne Road, NW10 4JH

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make **representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Crime and Disorder Licensing Objective for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence to specify an individual as designated premises supervisor under section 37 of the Act.

Police are formally objecting to the variation.

The Police objections are concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder.

The proposed DPS Mr Conrad Adrian Riley has a recent conviction for a relevant offence. Mr Riley was convicted at Leicester Crown Court on 1st November 2012. In addition to this conviction Mr Riley has committed the following offences under the licensing Act 2003 that Leicester licensing authority are investigating:

1. Section 132 by failing to notify the issuing licensing authority of his conviction of a relevant offence
2. Section 134 by failing to produce his personal licence to the issuing authority within 14 days of being required to do so for amendment

3. Section 127 by failing to inform the issuing licensing authority of a change of address.

At this time I need to meet with Mr Riley and discuss these issues. There are ongoing enquires as to whether Mr Riley complied with Section 128 Licensing Act 2003 during his first court appearance at Leicester Magistrates court on 8th June 2012. It is evident that at this time, that the exceptional circumstances are such that granting the application would undermine the crime prevention objective.

I reserve the right to bring further evidence to a possible hearing should any arise between now and then.
