The majority of the calls relate to calls made by staff from the venue. I must add that my team who visited the venue on a regular basis have encouraged them to call police if they feel threatened but also as a way of us being able to measure the extent of the problem with people loitering outside their property. This evidence was used by us to obtain a dispersal zone in the area to assist the police in dealing with those individuals who decided to loiter in the area in particular the street drinkers. This dispersal zone ran from 13th August 2012 to 12th February 2013. The dispersal zone had a good impact on the area and when first in place the team patrolled the area enforcing the legislation and those who were dealt with realised that this power was in place and the area saw a reduction in the instances of people loitering and drinking there. This problem was also discussed at the Kilburn Ward panel and as a result was made the teams priority to work on this problem during the existence of the dispersal zone. A sub committee was also formed to work at looking at long term solutions to the problem. Representatives from William Hill formed part of this sub group. William Hill provided funding via the local authority to make environmental changes outside their premises such as having street furniture removed that were being used as seats by those who were loitering. Those who had attended the initial panel meeting to voice their concerns were spoken to on a regular basis after this was made apriority and they conceded that the problem had improved. The problem was to do with persons loitering in the street outside William Hill and could not be directly linked to the premises.

To sum up, police are working with the community and partners to deal with the issue of people drinking in the street outside or near William Hill. The dispersal zone whilst in existence helped with this but has now been closed due to the fact that it had gone quiet. Brent licensing team are looking at premises near by to this venue who sell alcohol to try implement conditions on the licenses restricting sale of strong alcohol and not to sell single cans.
