Review of Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to 17 College Parade, Salisbury Road, London, NW6 6RN

As you are aware a review of the premises licence at the above address is being made by the Licensing Police.

When the Licensing Authority receives an application to review premises, it has to advertise the application on or near the premises concerned, at the Council Offices and on the Council's website in accordance with Regulation 38 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005 ("the regulations") The advertising of the notice has to take place for 28 consecutive days starting the day after the day on which the application was received and contains details of the grounds for review.

The notice was displayed by the Council's licensing officer on **24th December 2013**. A site visit was made on **30th December 2013**, indicating that the initial review notice had been removed. Consequently, the Council displayed another notice in the same location. The Council has carried out a further site visit within the last few days and it appears that the notice has once again been removed by unauthorised persons. Due to the notice being continuously removed, the Licensing Authority have sought legal advice in the matter. The nature of that advice is that the Council as Licensing Authority has carried out all reasonable steps in a diligent manner and has discharged its duty by complying with the requirements of the Regulations. The notice appears on the Council's website and is therefore in compliance with the regulations. For the avoidance of doubt the consultation period shall continue and will end on the date stated in the notice being 15th January 2014.
