I am a Police Constable of 24 years experience, the last 18 years I have worked on the London Borough of Brent, since 2005 I have been attached to the licensing unit for the borough. I have been authorised via a delegated authority to represent the Borough Commander for the London Borough of Brent and for the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Service to act on licensing matters.

One of the premises I supervise is Mace, 17 College Parade, Salusbury Road, NW6.

This statement has been made with use of my original notes made in my pocket book at the time of the incident. Page 54 refers.

On Monday 27th August 2012 I was on duty in plain clothes although wearing my overt marked body armour in company with PS 10QK Adrian Adolphus in an unmarked Police vehicle. At 2330 hours we were driving along Salusbury Road near College Parade when I saw two white males staggering on foot. One of the males was wearing a stripy shirt and jeans and the second was wearing a chequered shirt, jeans, glasses he was tall and slim with ginger hair. At 2332 hours I watched the two males enter Mace, within a couple of minutes the pair left the shop and the male with the stripy shirt was now carrying a blue carrier bag. I could see the DPS's younger brother Nazeem clearing up the forecourt area outside the front of the shop. I could see the DPS's father Mohammed Bahir standing behind the serving counter.

At 2335 hours I stopped the males; I introduced myself and showed them my warrant card. Both males were unsteady on their feet, they smelt strongly of intoxicating liquor, their speech was slurred, they were drunk. I asked the males what they had bought in Mace. The male with the stripy shirt held out the blue carrier bag so that I could see inside. I saw a bottle of Jack Daniels whisky, a large bottle of Coca Cola and a tube of Pringles crisps. I asked how much the Jack Daniels had cost. The male with

the stripy shirt said 'thirteen something, it came to seventeen altogether'. I explained my reason for asking and that I suspected Mace of selling alcohol without authority. I asked the males if they would give me there names. The male with the chequered shirt declined, however the male with the stripy shirt said 'Peter Pan'. They both staggered away towards Willesden laughing.
