**Police representation to Vary the Premises Licence at Manhattan Tasty
Chicken & Pizza, 2 Neeld Parade, Wembley Hill Road, Wembley, HA9 6QU**

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make **representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Council's Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a premises licence under section 34 of the act.

On 6th December 2013 at approx 2330 hours police were called to a fight inside the premise. A group of Polish males had been inside the premise eating and consuming alcohol and a fight broke out between them resulting in one male being assaulted and receiving facial injuries. The victim was taken to Northwick Park Hospital due to his facial injuries and his heavy state of intoxication. The CCTV within the premise was not working and therefore a contributory factor in the suspects not being arrested and potentially prosecuted. CRIS 1928304/13 refers.

On 27th December 2013 at approx 1720 hours police were called to the venue following a fight between a group of youths which resulted in the venue being criminally damaged. At the time of police arrival there was nobody present at the premise that was able to use the CCTV system. Police made several appointments with the venue to collect CCTV and every time they were told that it was not ready and to come back in a couple of days, on 15th January 2014 the premise informed police that there was a fault in their CCTV system and there was no footage recorded. CRIS 1929952/13 refers.

In view of the above it is my opinion that you are finding it difficult to adhere to the Licensing objectives whilst just with a late night refreshment licence. Street drinkers and drunkenness is a major concern in Brent. I am therefore unable to agree your application at this time.
