Dear Mr Ellis,

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance.

On behalf of Regulatory Services (Environmental Health) I would like to Make representations to the T.E.N.

On the following grounds:

That the proposed operating hours are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings. The noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and finding suitable transport home is likely to be detrimental to the residential amenity.

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise
- Noise generated by patrons in external areas of the premises e.g. Smoking Area
- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises

If this T.E.N is to be granted I propose the following conditions.

Conditions

1. The Applicant/Licensee shall ensure that amplified/Live music played in the licensed premises is **Not Audible** at or within the site boundary of any residential property in the surrounding area. No speakers are to be located in any external areas.
2. The Applicant/Licensee shall appoint a member of Staff/Door supervisor to monitor the door(s) leading to external areas, and keep them closed and not propped open. The appointed member shall also encourage/usher patrons that has finished smoking back inside the property.
3. Signs shall be erected in external areas telling patrons to keep voices down, and respect the local residents.
4. Door supervisors shall be employed, and encourage patrons to leave quietly and prevent people from congregating outside the premises once the event has finished.

Supporting Information

A noise abatement notice has been served on the applicant dated 06/12/2013.
The last recorded complaint was received on 15/05/2014.

Other Comments

The Nuisance Control Team will actively investigate any noise complaints received during the event. If the noise is witnessed at a nuisance level, a breach of the noise abatement notice will be sent to the Licensee.

Subsequent breach of the notice will result in prosecution.

The Licensee is reminded that persistent noise complaints may provide grounds for a licence review and may jeopardise approval of future TEN applications.

This TEN application will only be approved if the Licensee agrees to abide by the conditions outlined above. Written confirmation of this agreement will be required and can be emailed to ens.noiseteam@brent.gov.uk and Jason.Nelson@brent.gov.uk
