The operators have failed in their duty under the Licensing Act 2003 to promote the prevention					
of a public nuisance. The Premises License extends to the provision of live music. The					
premises is not adequately soundproofed to contain loud live amplified music without causing a					
nuisance to the occupiers of neighbouring and nearby residential units.					
The Nuisance Control Team (NCT) - as a Responsible Authority - ask Committee to remove					
Live Music from the Premises Licence. We also ask Committee to endorse the Licence with the					
following Condition: "Live Music shall not be permitted at the premises until such time as a					
scheme of acoustic treatment, approved by the Council's Nuisance Control Team, has been					
installed and tested by persons competent and qualified to undertake and test such work."					
On 10 th January 2015 NCT obtained evidence of a statutory noise nuisance from live music					
playing inside the premises. This evidence also represented a breach of a Noise Abatement					
Notice served on the DPS (Designated Premises Supervisor) - Mr Bujar Marku - in December					
2013. It is the policy of the NCT to apply for a licence Review whenever a licensed premises					
commits the offence of failing to adhere to the terms of a Noise Abatement Notice.					

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

In February 2012, the previous operators of 249 High Rd were successfully prosecuted for breaching a Noise Abatement Notice. NCT became aware that new operators were at the premises in April 2013. From April 2013 to December 2013 NCT received three online complaints reporting noise from loud music; three nuisance-on-notifications reporting loud music; and, one e-mail reporting loud music. In April 2013 I telephoned Mr Bujar Marku (the DPS) to advise him about a complaint. I advised him that evidence of a nuisance from loud music would result in a Review of the Premises Licence. An Officer from NCT also visited the premises and advised Mr Marku to monitor the noise levels from live music. An Advisory letter was sent to Mr Marku in November 2013. Following a further complaint a Noise Abatement Notice was served on Mr Bujar Marku prohibiting the occurrence of a statutory noise nuisance from amplified music. A covering letter advised him the Council were of the opinion that a nuisance from loud amplified entertainment was "likely to occur". Since serving that Notice. NCT received two online complaints reporting noise from loud music; eleven nuisance-onnotifications reporting noise from loud music; and, seventeen e-mails complaining of noise from loud music. In July 2014, an Officer from NCT visited the premises and reminded Mr Marku of the Noise Abatement Notice. In that same month I made an assessment of noise emanating from the premises while seated in a stationary works vehicle parked diagonally opposite from the front of the premises, at 01:20hrs. I noted easily audible amplified folk music was heard to significantly increase when the door was opened by patrons accessing and exiting the premises. There did not appear to be any external checks been undertaken. In November 2014 a letter was sent to the premises reminding that the Noise Abatement Notice was still in force. On 03 December 2014, Mr Marku contacted me to apologise for the noise that occurred on Albania (independence) Day, on the 29th November. He stated that he ensures his doormen keep the lobby doors closed and that he undertakes regular external sound checks to ensure there is no excessive loud amplified music coming from the premises. On 10th January 2015. I responded to a complaint of noise and obtained evidence of a statutory noise nuisance from loud music. This was also a breach of the terms of the Noise Abatement Notice. I interviewed Mr Marku under PACE caution on the 12th January at the premises and noted large speakers stored in a hallway. The premises is a traditional brick-built end of terrace property in a mixed retail/commercial and residential area which includes residential units above shop premises. The fabric of the building is in no way designed or suitable for containing loud live amplified music.
