

Neighbourhood Planning Guidance

Neighbourhood planning is a community-led process which enables people to help shape development in their local area. There are three tools communities can use to help shape local development:

- neighbourhood plans that set out local planning policies that form part of the planning framework for their area.
- neighbourhood development orders that grant planning permission for a specified development.
- community right to build orders that identify land for new development.

There has been considerable interest in neighbourhood planning in Brent. There are currently four designated neighbourhood forums (Sudbury, Church End, Harlesden & Kilburn), and there is interest in establishing neighbourhood forums in other parts of the borough. To help guide groups wishing to take forward neighbourhood plans the Council has produced a [neighbourhood planning protocol](#) (or route map). This provides an overview of the process and the roles and responsibilities of the community and the Council.
