I am a Police Constable of nearly 12 years experience, all of which I have worked on the London Borough of Brent, I am currently attached to the licensing unit for the Borough, I have been authorised via a delegated authority to represent the Borough Commander of the London Borough of Brent and for the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Service to act on Licensing matters.

Hi Michael

Here's a written account of what we discussed on the phone earlier this evening.

I was assaulted at the Good Ship on the night of 23rd-24th April 2016. I was punched in the face/eye by a woman who had been quite aggressive towards me and my housemate for the whole time we had been there. I didn't respond to her aggressivity and she eventually punched me - one of the reasons was that she thought I'd stolen her phone, which I hadn't.

The moment she punched me, I went straight to the door of the Good Ship to ask the door staff/bouncers to call the police as I had just been assaulted. They refused and tried to play it down even though my eye was already so swollen by that point that I could barely see. I told them that they had a responsibility to call the police as I had been assaulted in their establishment. Again, they refused. At that point the woman who had punched me was close to the exit. I told the bouncers that if they let her go, I would have sued them. The reason she didn't leave was that she was still looking for her phone, and the door staff were helping her look for it. I, on the other hand, got locked in the cloak room. The lady working in the cloak room was really lovely and asked me if I wanted to call the police, which she did as soon as I said I did and had already asked the bouncers. I asked her to also make sure the woman who'd punched me wouldn't leave.

The door staff were unbelievably unprofessional and I got more support and help from the customers than from them. If the lady from the cloak room hadn't called the police for me, no one from the Good Ship would have and nothing would have been done about it. My phone was out of battery so I couldn't make the call myself.
