I submit the following review as activities I have participated in as a councillor over the Municipal Year 2010/2011.

Local ward work:

I keep my residents informed about many issues (CPZ/ planning/ pot holes/ petitions) throughout the year with street letters. I also visit residents when required and am available daily on the telephone or by email. I become very involved with unpopular planning applications and attend planning committees where necessary.
