

# CAPPED CASES BY MONTH IN BRENT

Homelessness is an increasing problem in London. As the number of people affected by the government's cuts rises, the number of people facing homelessness is likely to increase. This infographic illustrates the increase in the number of people in Brent who have had their benefits cut by the government's Benefit Cap since December 2016.








# CAPPED CASES BY AMOUNT OF CAP IN BRENT

Homelessness could be a reality facing people on benefits who have had their entitlements reduced by the government. This infographic shows how much money Brent residents on benefits are losing per week under the government's cuts and how many households are affected by these cuts.








# CAPPED CASES BY INCOME TYPE IN BRENT

This government cuts to housing benefit will mean that benefit claimants will be have to top up their rent payment from their other income – which means a choice between topping up their rent or meeting other basic living costs. This infographic shows the type of income that capped benefit claimants in Brent receive. Homelessness could be an issue for people in receipt of these benefits in Brent.








# CAPPED CASES BY HOUSEHOLD IN BRENT

All households in Brent that now receive less money from benefits could be facing homelessness following the government's cuts to their housing benefit.

This infographic shows who is being affected by these government cuts in Brent.








## HOUSING BENEFITS IN BRENT

The total amount of money that benefit claimants in Brent now receive is illustrated by the figure highlighted in blue in this infographic. If a person's housing benefit and other benefits (eg job seeker's allowance) combined exceeds this amount, the sum will be cut down to the total highlighted in blue for claimants in London and yellow for the rest of the UK. Some claimants may find that they don't have enough money to pay their rent because of the government's cuts, and may face homelessness.







# BEAT THE BENEFIT CAP IN BRENT

Benefit claimants in Brent may struggle to pay their rent after cuts to their housing benefit by the government and may be worried about homelessness. One of the ways to beat the government's benefit cut is to work more hours during the week. This infographic shows how many hours a person would have to work to beat the government cuts if they are single, or a lone parent or in a couple.


