**Police representations to the Temporary Event Notice for THE Parlour, 5 Regent Street, NW10 5LG**

I certify that I have considered the notice shown above and **I wish to make representations** that the use of the premises for the temporary event would undermine the crime prevention initiative, for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

A Temporary Event Notice has been made under section 100 Licensing Act 2003 by Mr Jesse Dunford Wood for a Notting Hill carnival party with DJ's from 1500hours on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> August to 0300 hours on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The licensable activities applied for are the sale of alcohol by retail, the provision of late night refreshment and regulated entertainment.

Police are formally making representations to the notice under section 104 Licensing Act 2003. The Police representation is primarily concerned with the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives. I visited the premises on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2018 and spoke to the applicant about this event. I was informed that although Mr Dunford Wood has submitted the application he will not be running or organising the event, that will be done by a friend. The applicant was unable to answer some of the questions around the event, therefore I asked him to provide me with an event plan and risk assessment that would also include details of the Security Company and performers. I have not received either of these documents.

The Parlour is in close proximity to Ladbroke Grove and the carnival procession route. This area is very busy during the bank holiday weekend and for the last four years this venue has remained closed. The carnival is a very unpredictable occasion and major drain on Police and local authority resources. Police are unable to make an accurate assessment of this event and its impact on the licensing objectives with more information.
