Please give a general description of the premises (please read guidance note 1)

The premises are a hotel located on the corner of Elm Road and St John's Road, Wembley. It has 61 bedrooms accommodating a maximum number of 144 guests. The hotel comprises a row of five adjacent period houses, internally renovated into a single hotel unit. The front facade on Elm Street is maintained to a good standard, conserving the period character of the exterior and lending a pleasing aspect to the neighbourhood. The buildings are extended at the rear for additional sleeping space and at the side (along St John's Road), to the height of a single storey, to accommodate a spacious reception, bar and restaurant area, where it is intended that alcohol will be sold and principally consumed, though there will also be 24 hour room service which will include the purchase of alcohol by guests. The premises also benefit from an attractive south facing terrace at ground level, furnished with picnic benches and parasols, and partially screened from the carriageway by trees.

The hotel currently has a 2 star rating and standard room rates are £52 per room per night.

M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General -- all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e) (please read guidance note 10)

There will be a strong management and security procedures will be put in place which encompass the four licensing objectives as set out below.

Right of admission will be reserved.

Staff will be trained in respect of licensing law, the implementation of licence conditions, health and safety, first aid, alcohol and drug awareness and conflict management.

A summary of the premises licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

Notices stating premises policy on admission will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

The applicant will ensure that the premises are responsibly managed and supervised at all times to ensure that appropriate steps are taken to promote the four licensing objectives.

The open nature of the seating areas in the bar/restaurant and the positioning of the bar allows a good view of these areas and means good observation and control can be maintained of all activities in these areas.

The premises operate an environment where alcohol is served consumes with food in a seated and non-confrontational environment.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

In line with the Applicant's Alcohol and Social responsibility Policy, there will be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate drinking.

incidents will be recorded in a log book.

Known troublemakers will be barred.

A burglar alarm will be installed.

Toilets will be checked an average of twice per hour daily and a log book kept of these inspections.

The premises will operate the current local authority or similar proof of age scheme and will display the relevant literature.

Closed circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations in accordance with advice from the Police. All cameras will be installed and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and will be operational when the licensable activities commence.

The medium on which images are recorded will be identifiable, stored securely, retained for a period of not less than 31 days and made available to Council and Police authorities upon request.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and staff will be aware of their responsibilities to prevent crime and disorder on the premises and demonstrate a responsible attitude to the marketing and sale of alcohol.

The degree of staff supervision and control as mentioned at (a) above and a winding down period between the end of any regulated entertainment and the premises closing will assist to ensure the promotion of this objective.

c) Public safety

The applicant already takes seriously its obligations under health and safety legislation and has extensive policies in place to meet these obligations.

A fire detection and warning system will be in place along with fire extinguishers.

An emergency lighting system will be in place.

Safety signs and notices will be in place.

Floor staff will conduct physical sweeps inside the premises to remove hazardous objects/waste.

The Designated Premises Supervisor will be aware of his responsibilities to himself, staff and customers in respect of public safety and will ensure the maintenance of fire and safety arrangements (including evacuation procedures) and equipment in accordance with the requirements of current legislation, including means of escape arrangements, fire extinguishing appliances and fire detection installations, as marked on the plan submitted with this application.

The Designated Premises Supervisor will ensure that staff have been made fully aware of and trained in their responsibilities to the public and in the emergency fire plan arrangements.

d) The prevention of public nulsance

Steps will be taken to encourage non-guests to leave the premises quietly for the non-disturbance of local residents.

Managers will be required to llaise with neighbours as part of their duties and to resolve any reasonable concerns.

Deliveries will be conducted in during daytime to control noise.

Notices will be displayed around the premises asking patrons to leave quietly and manager and staff will be pro-active in encouraging patrons to leave quietly.

The protection of children from harm

We recognise the importance of protecting children from harm and this is supported by:

Our commitment to health and safety in the operation of the premises.

Our approach to managing the risk of under-age drinking.

Staff will at all times observe the law and ensure alcohol is not served to persons under 18 (subject to legal exceptions). The manager and staff are briefed in their responsibility for ensuring the customers are over 18.

No adult entertainment (ie. of a nude physical nature) will be permitted at these premises. Any children under 16 will require to be accompanied by an adult and will remain the responsibility of such accompanying adult when using the premises. Staff will not be permitted to undertake sole supervision of such children.

Bar staff will be trained to prevent the sale of alcohol to under 18s.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and staff will at all times remain of their responsibilities under this objective, including that alcohol shall not be sold to anyone under the age of 18, although certain types of alcohol can be consumed by 16/17 year olds with a table meal. Staff on duty have been trained and made aware of these requirements and the need to demand an acceptable form of ID (ie. accredited proof of age card or new style driving licence or passport) where considered appropriate.
